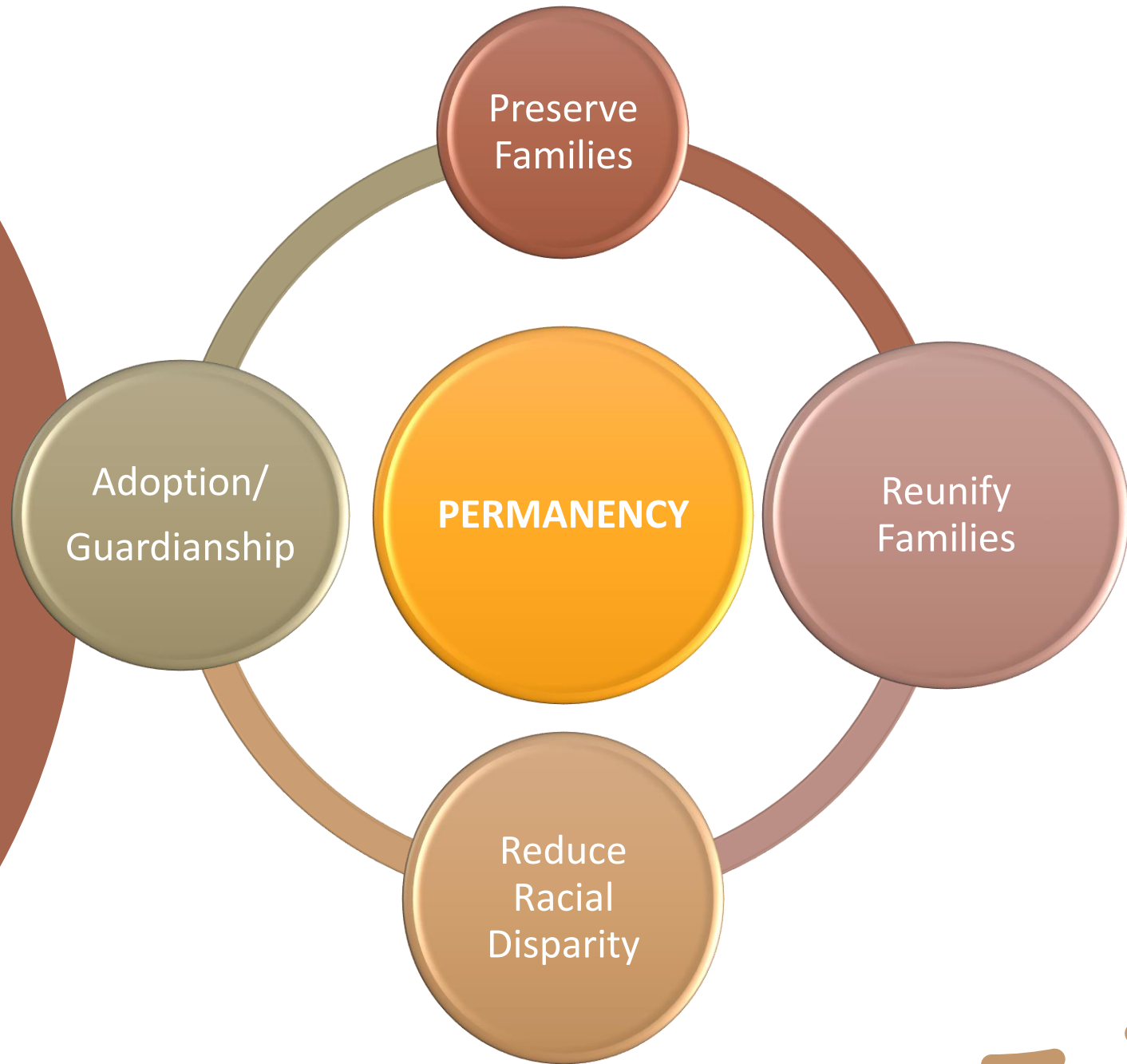

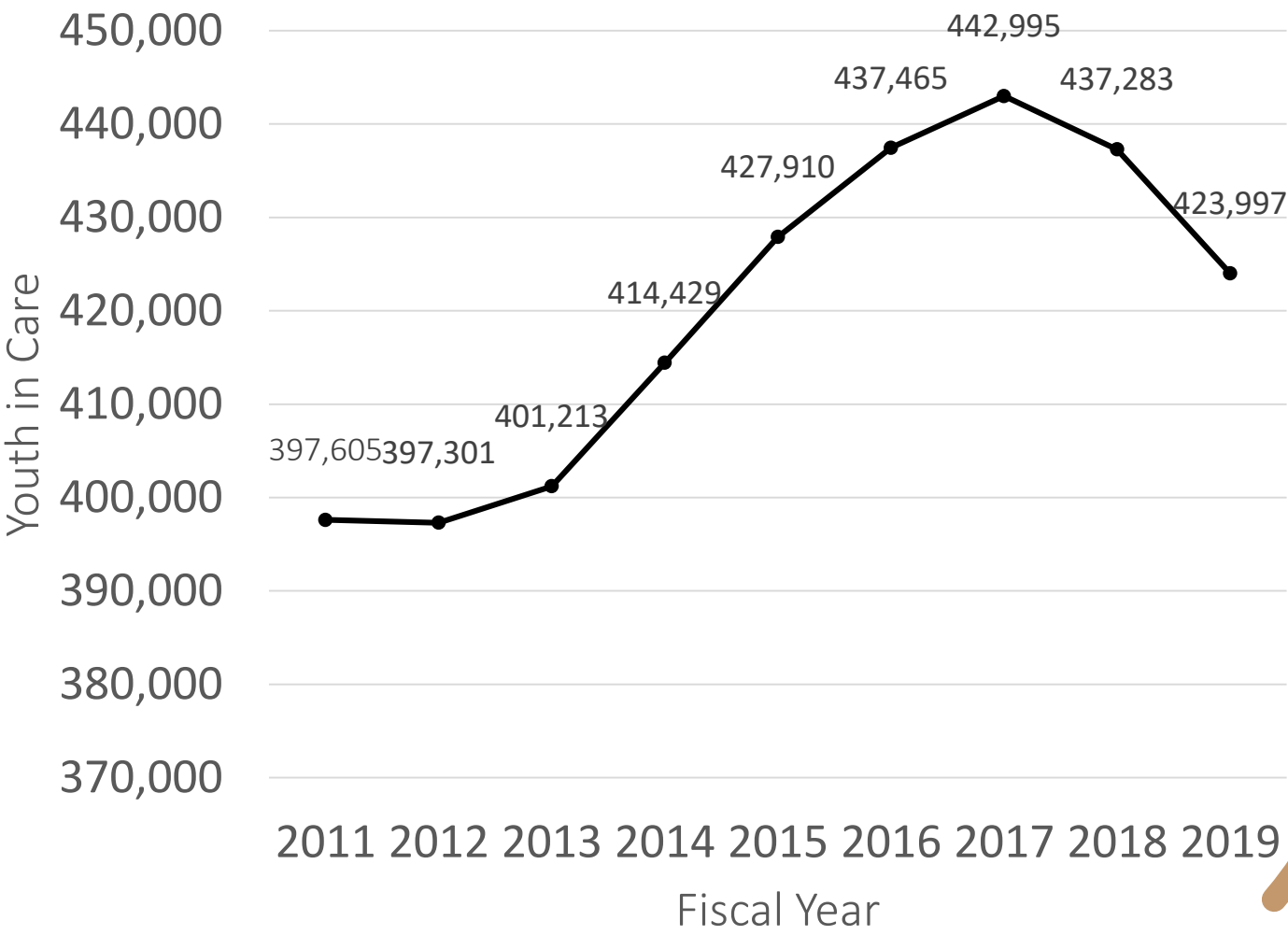

Children in Foster Care Nationwide

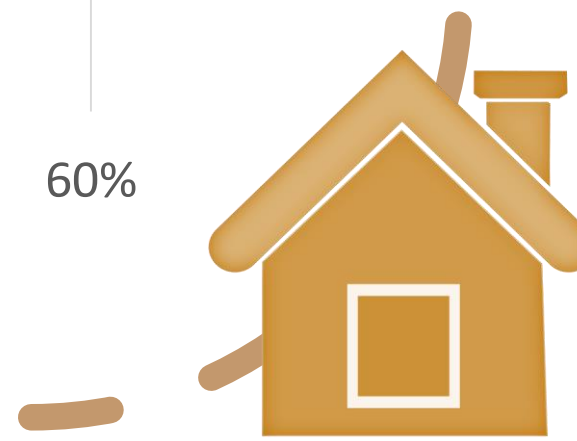
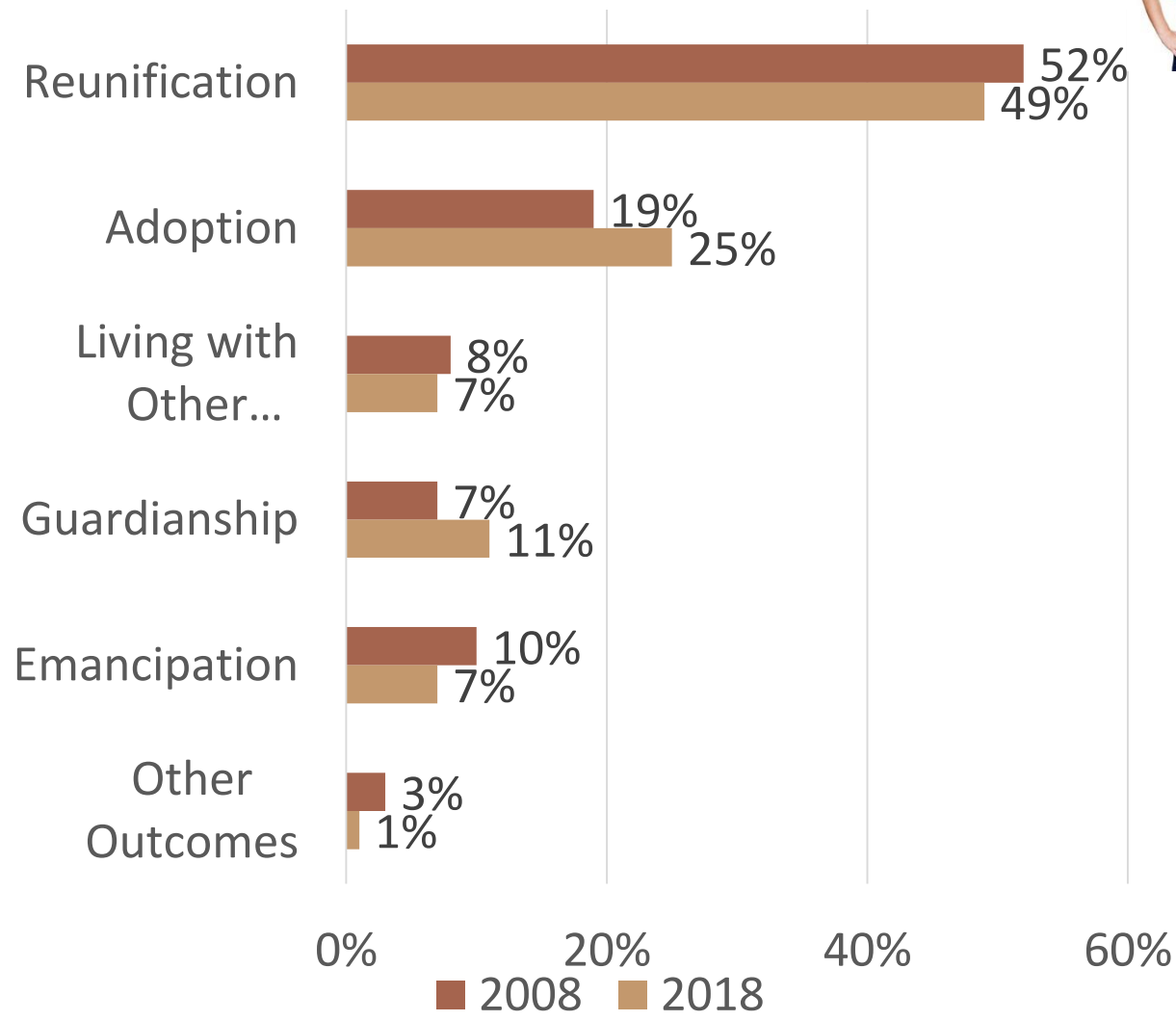

- Gun violence

Foster Care, Child Trauma, and Educational Outcomes

Illinois Data

- 2x more likely to be absent from school
- 50-75% change schools upon FC entry
- 2.5-3.5x more likely to receive special education services
- 34% 17-18 year olds: 5+ school changes

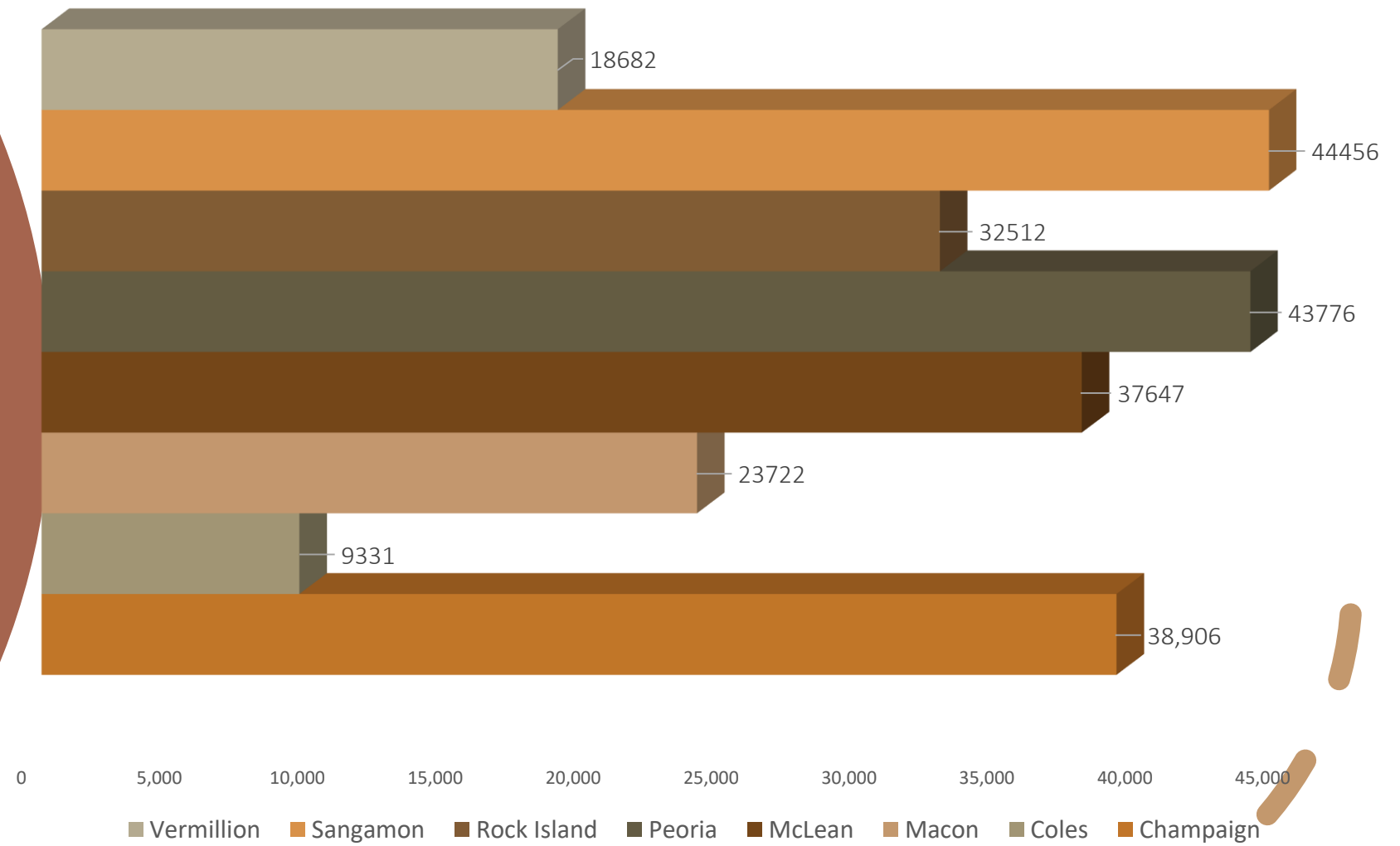

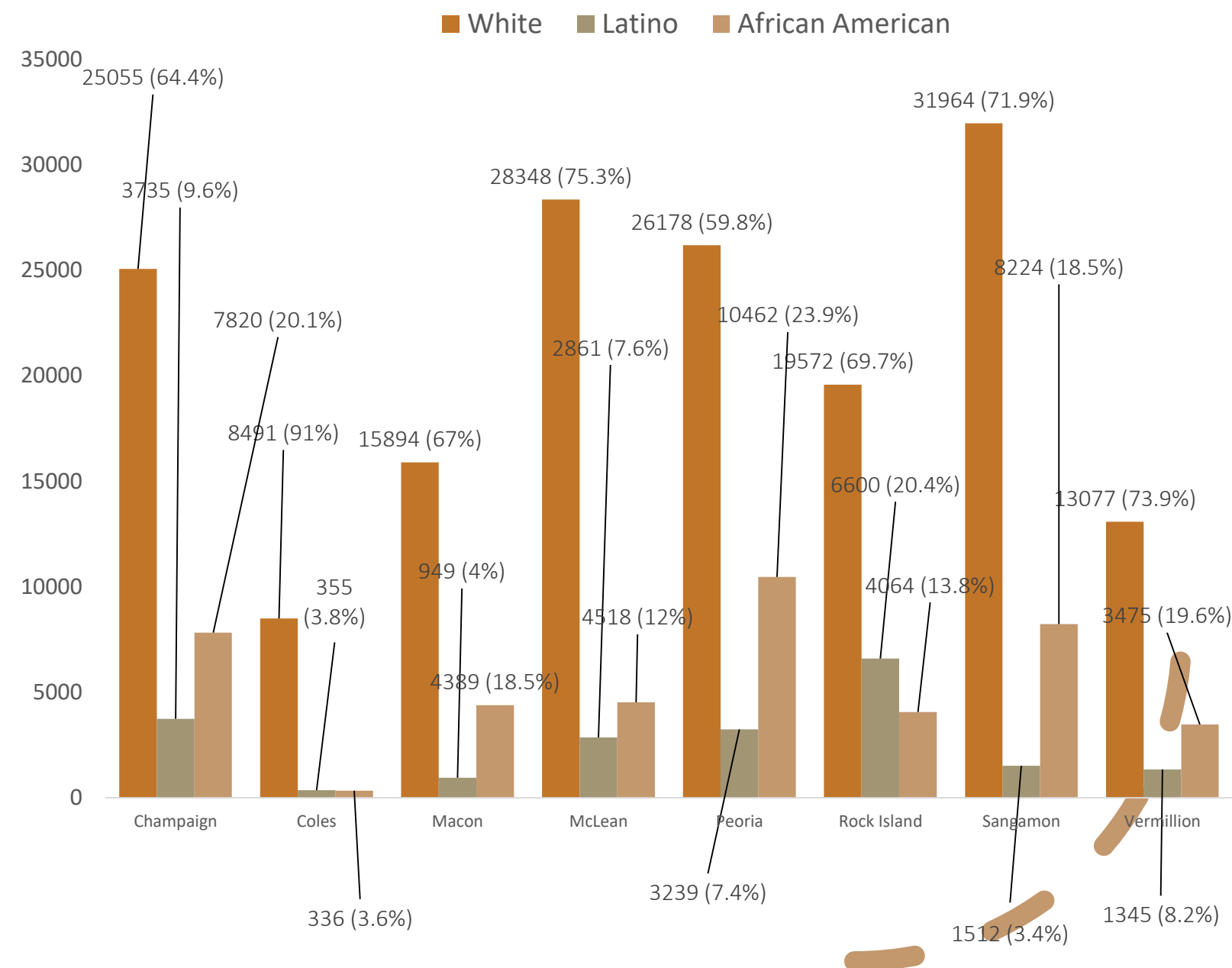

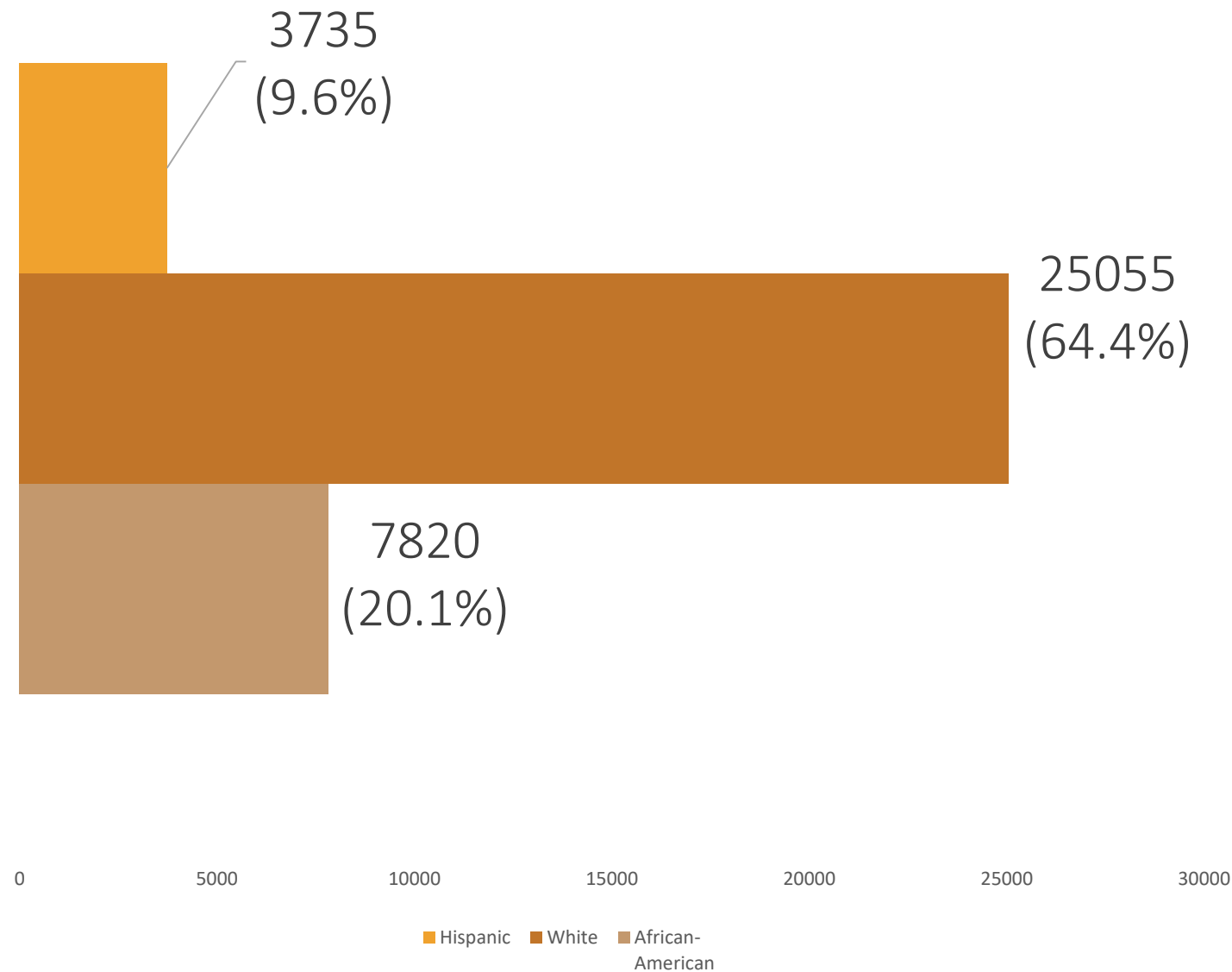

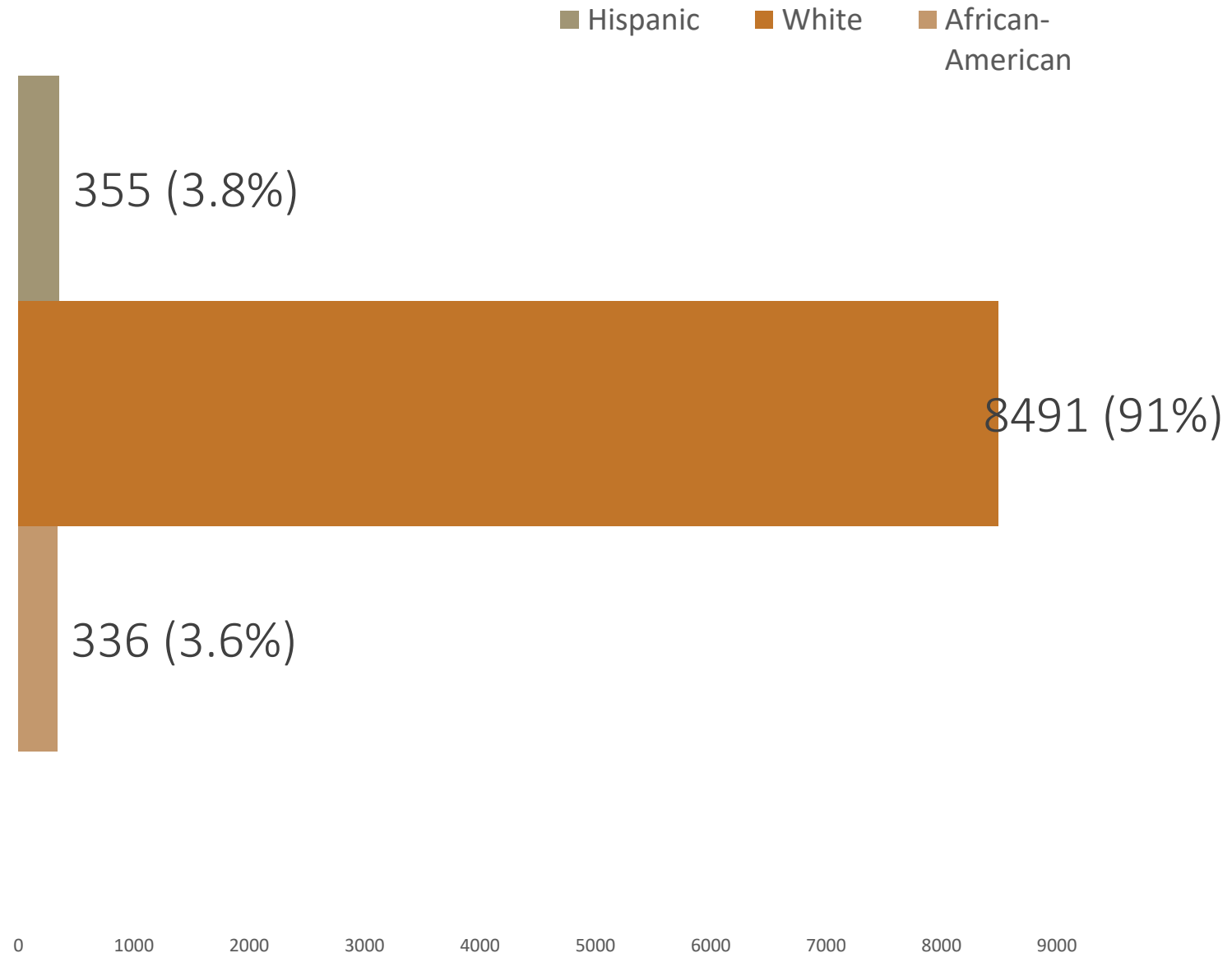

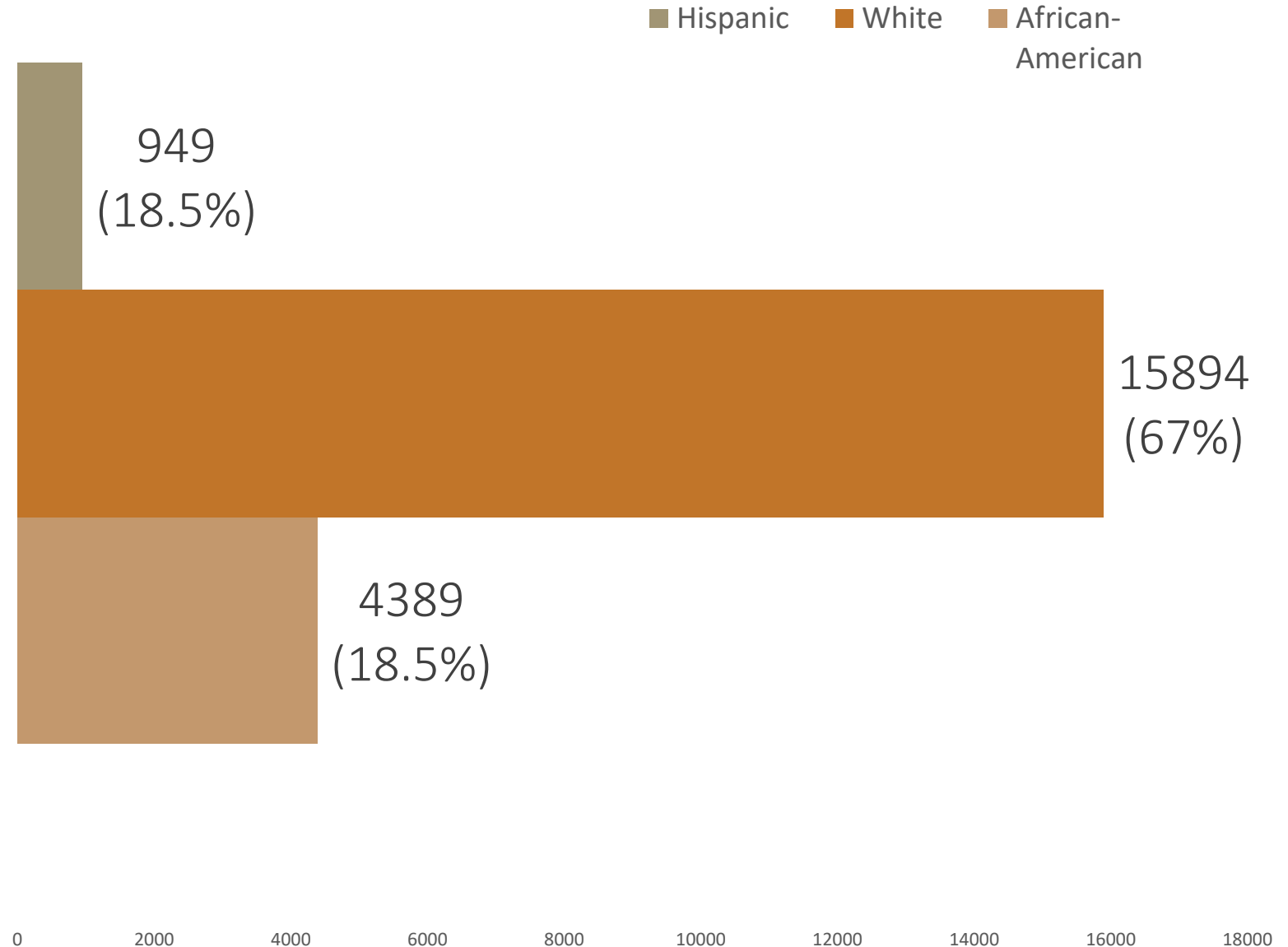

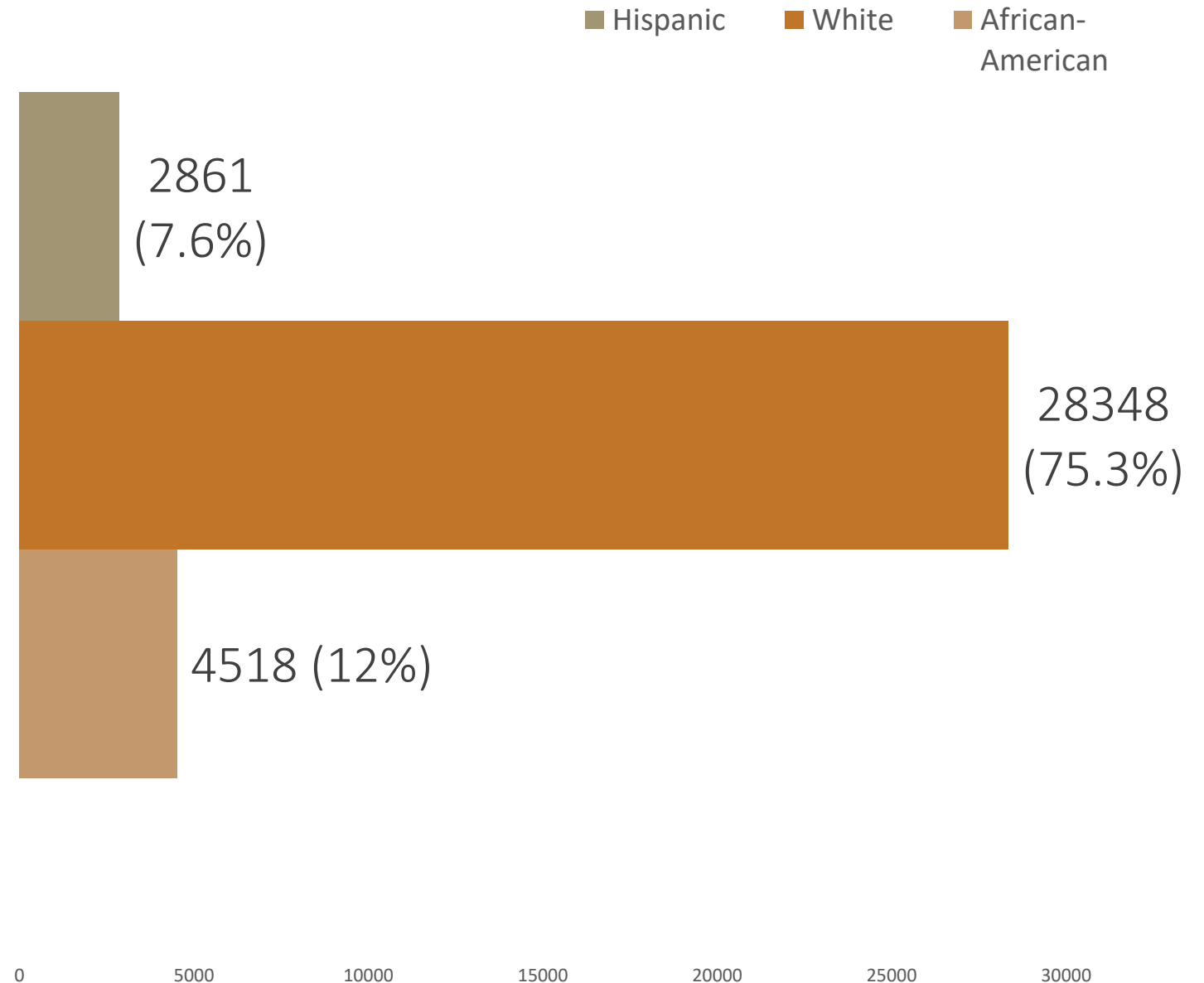


Child Population by Race McLean County

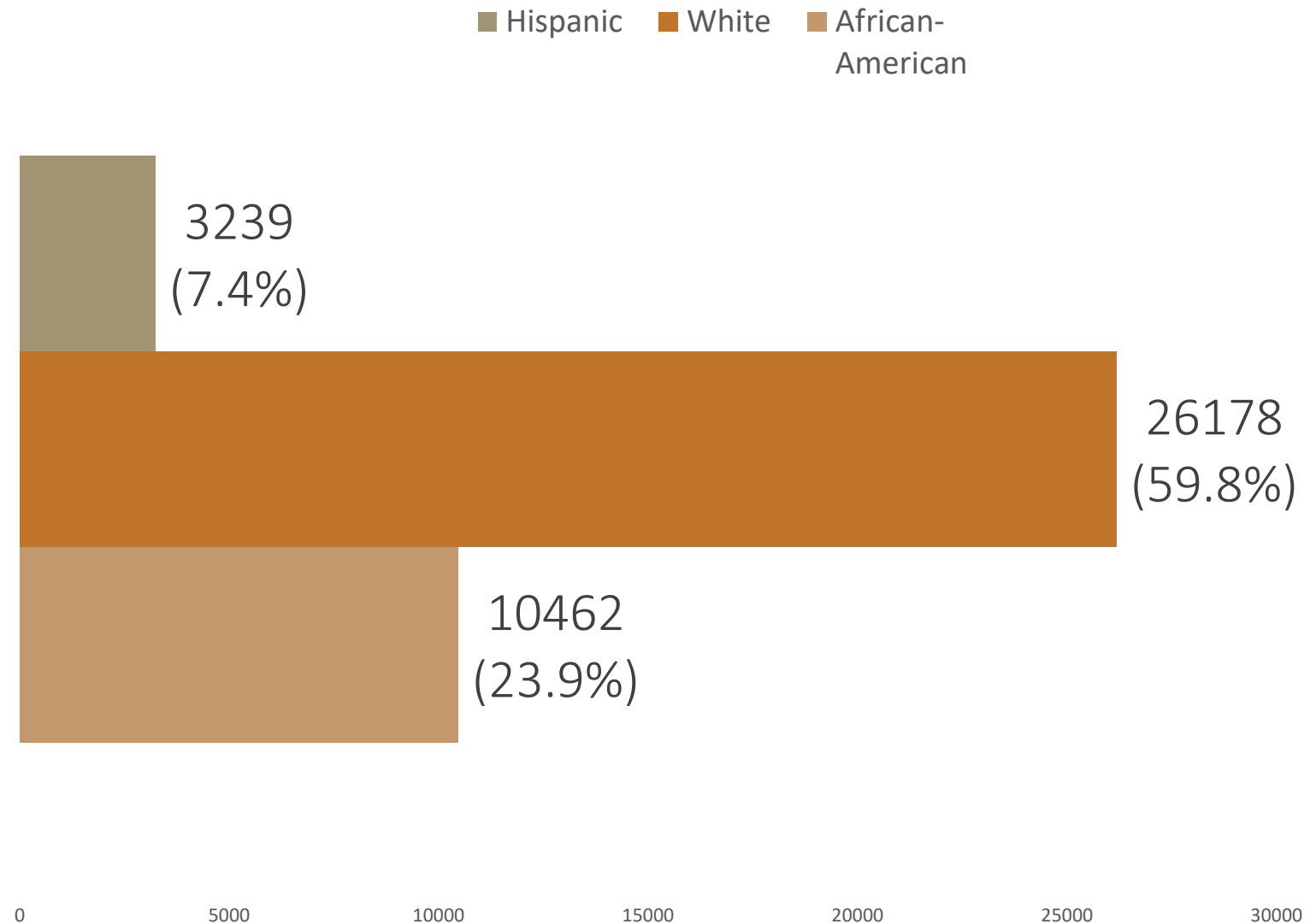

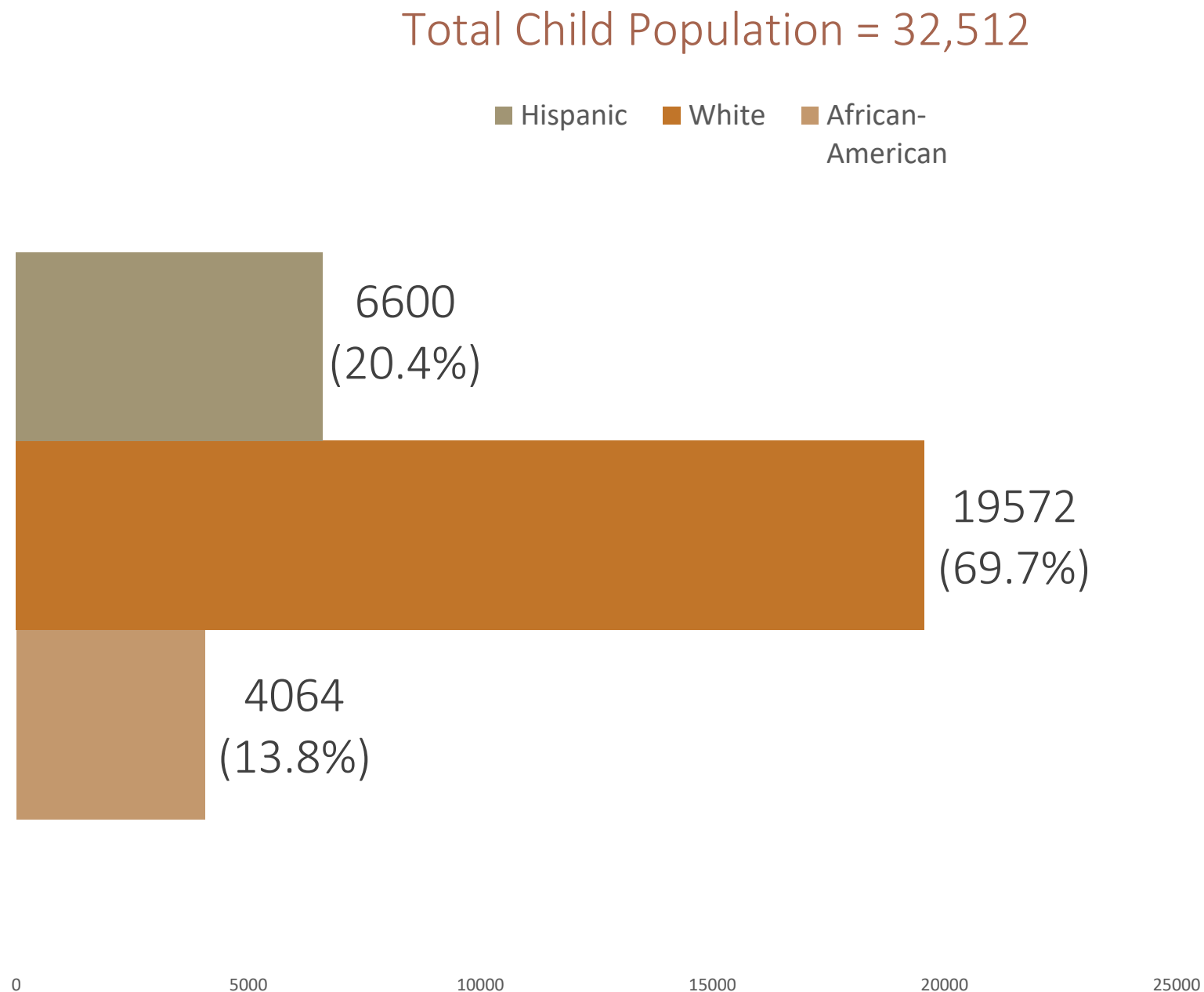

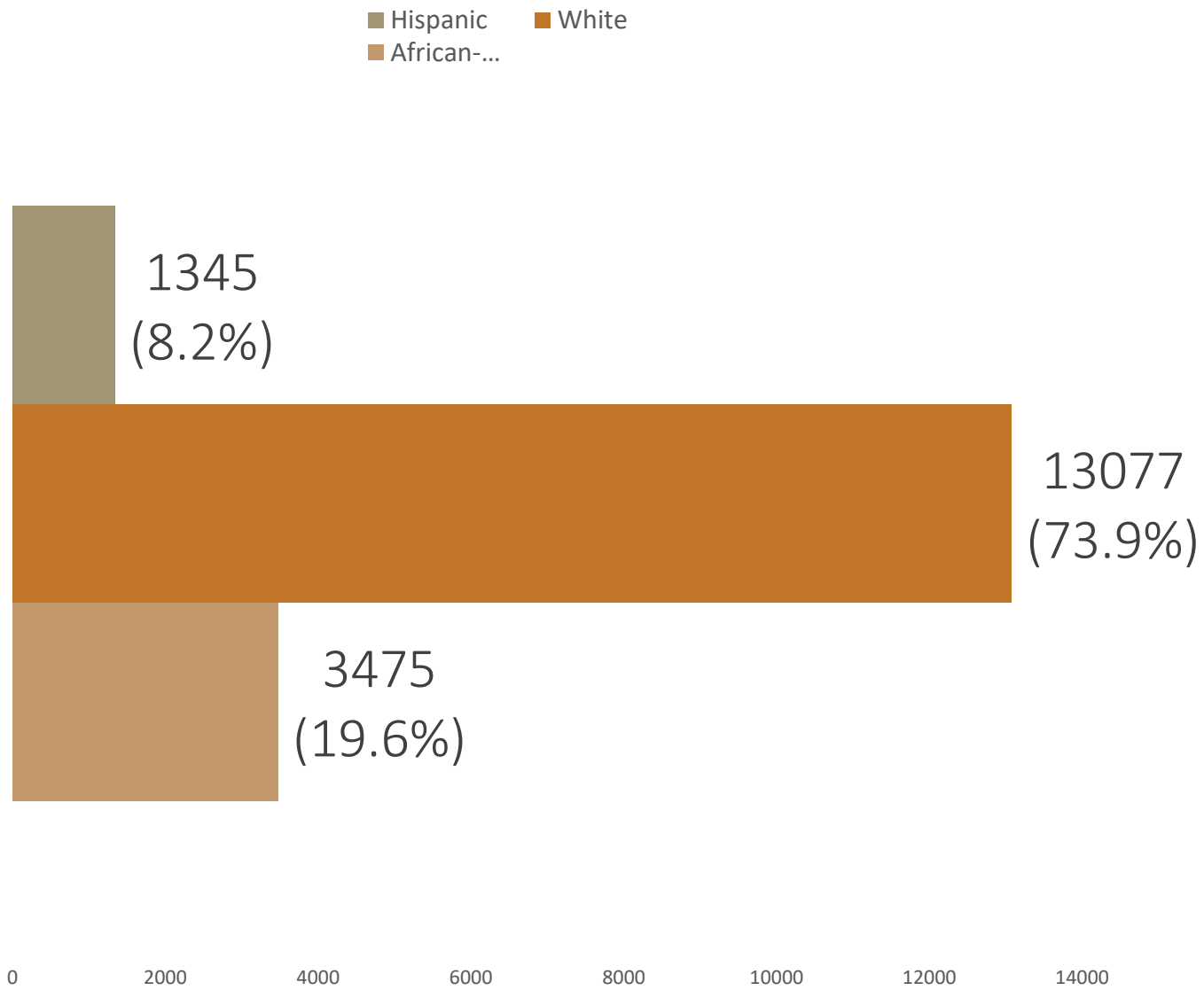

Child Population by Race Vermillion County

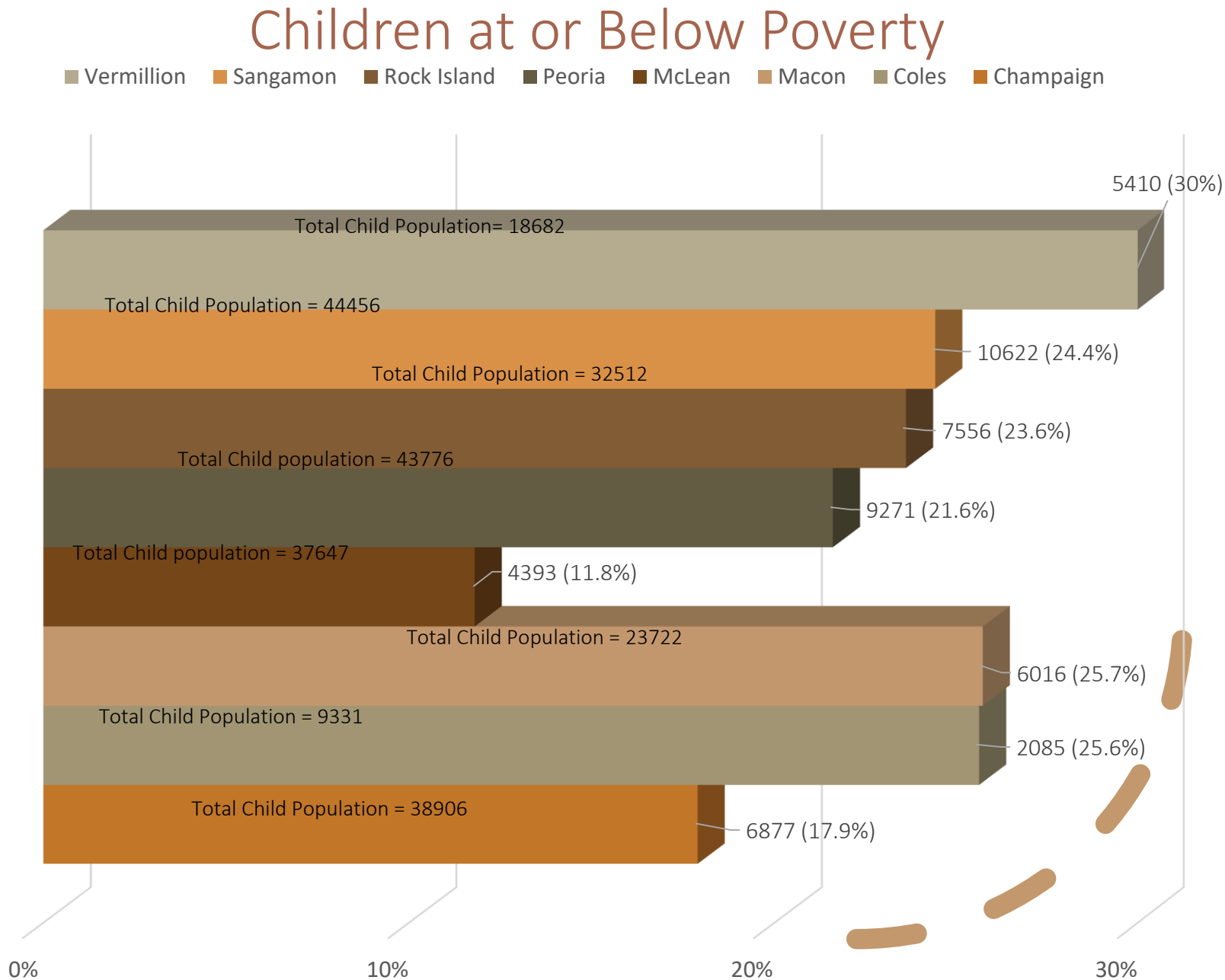

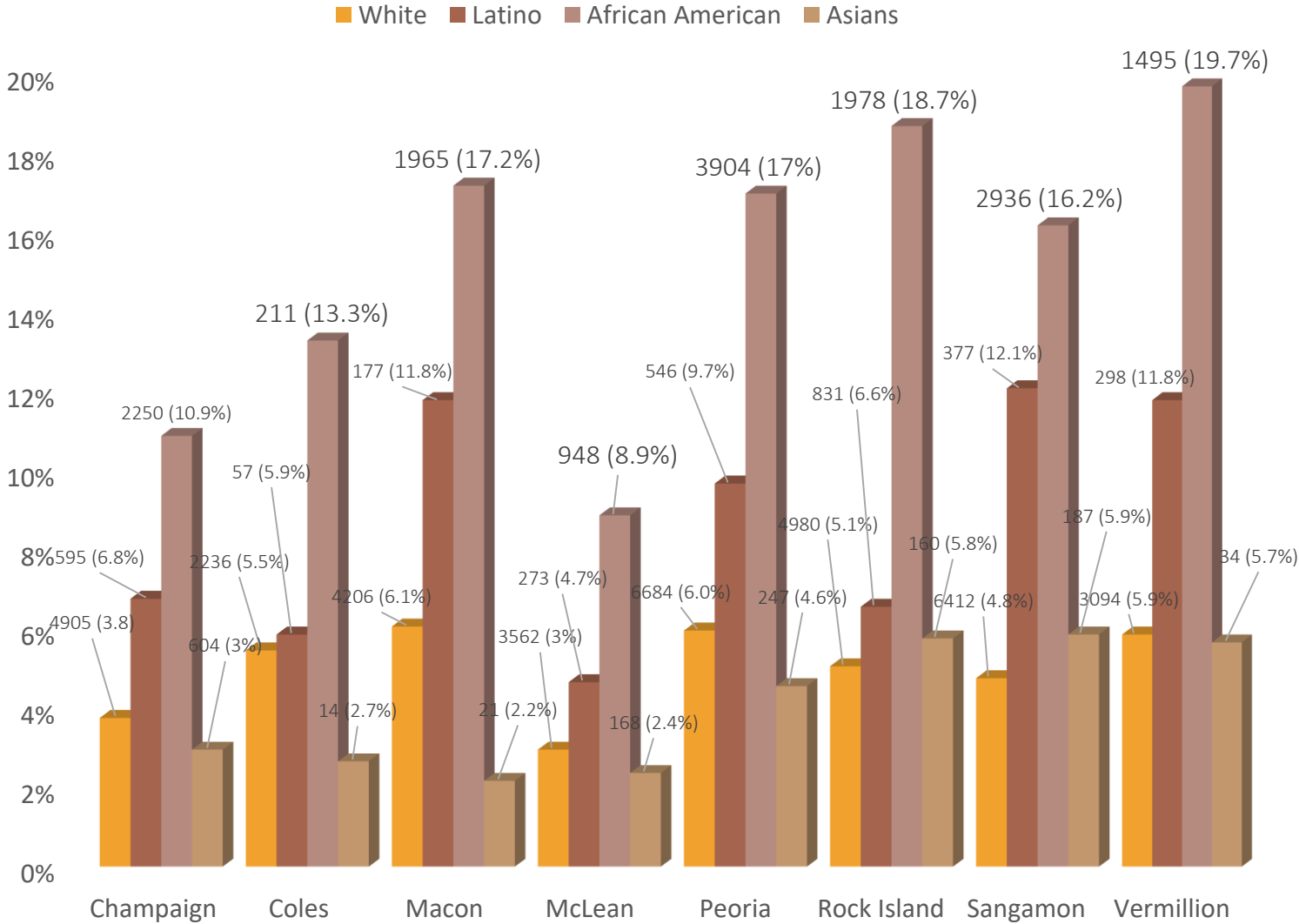

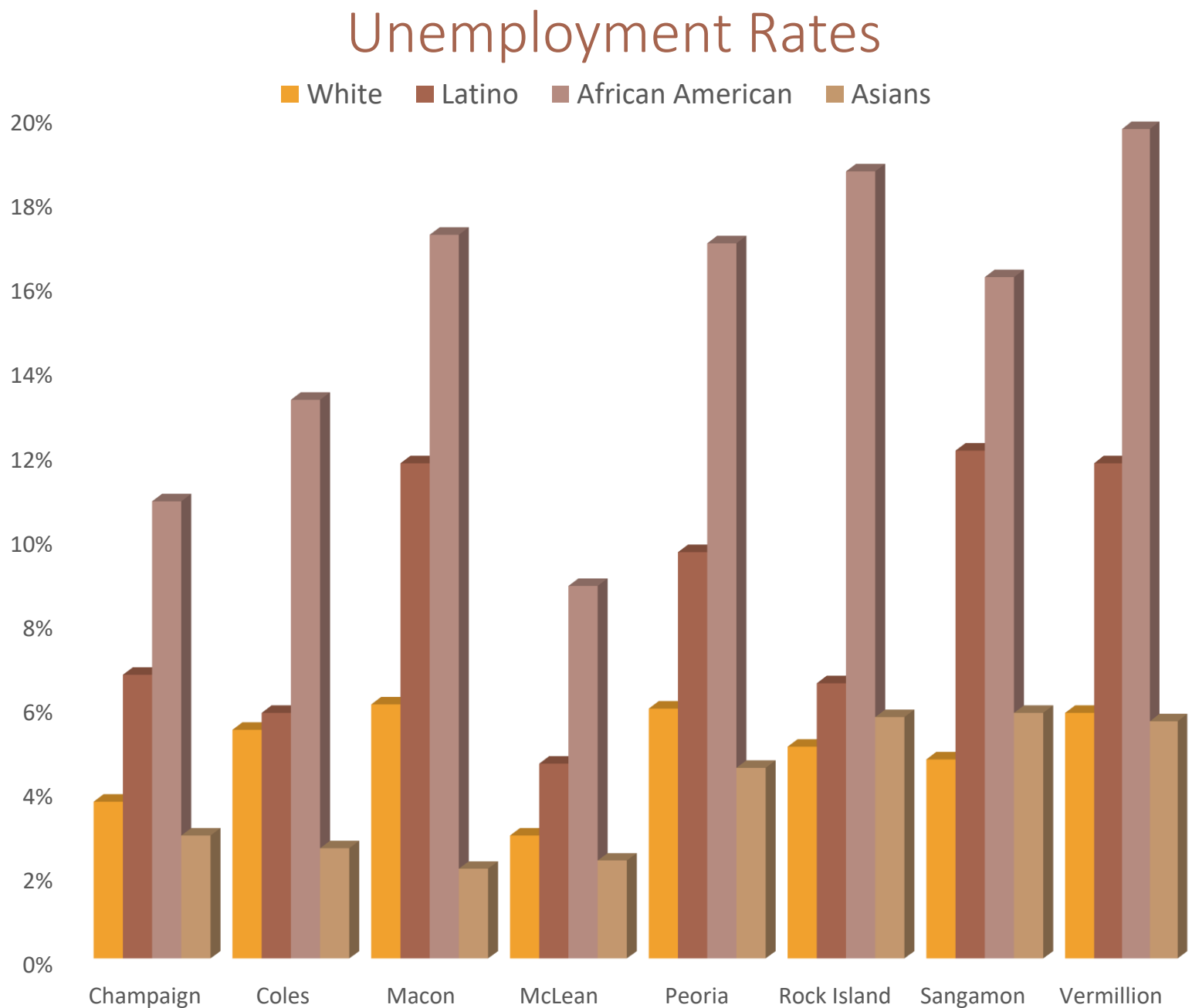

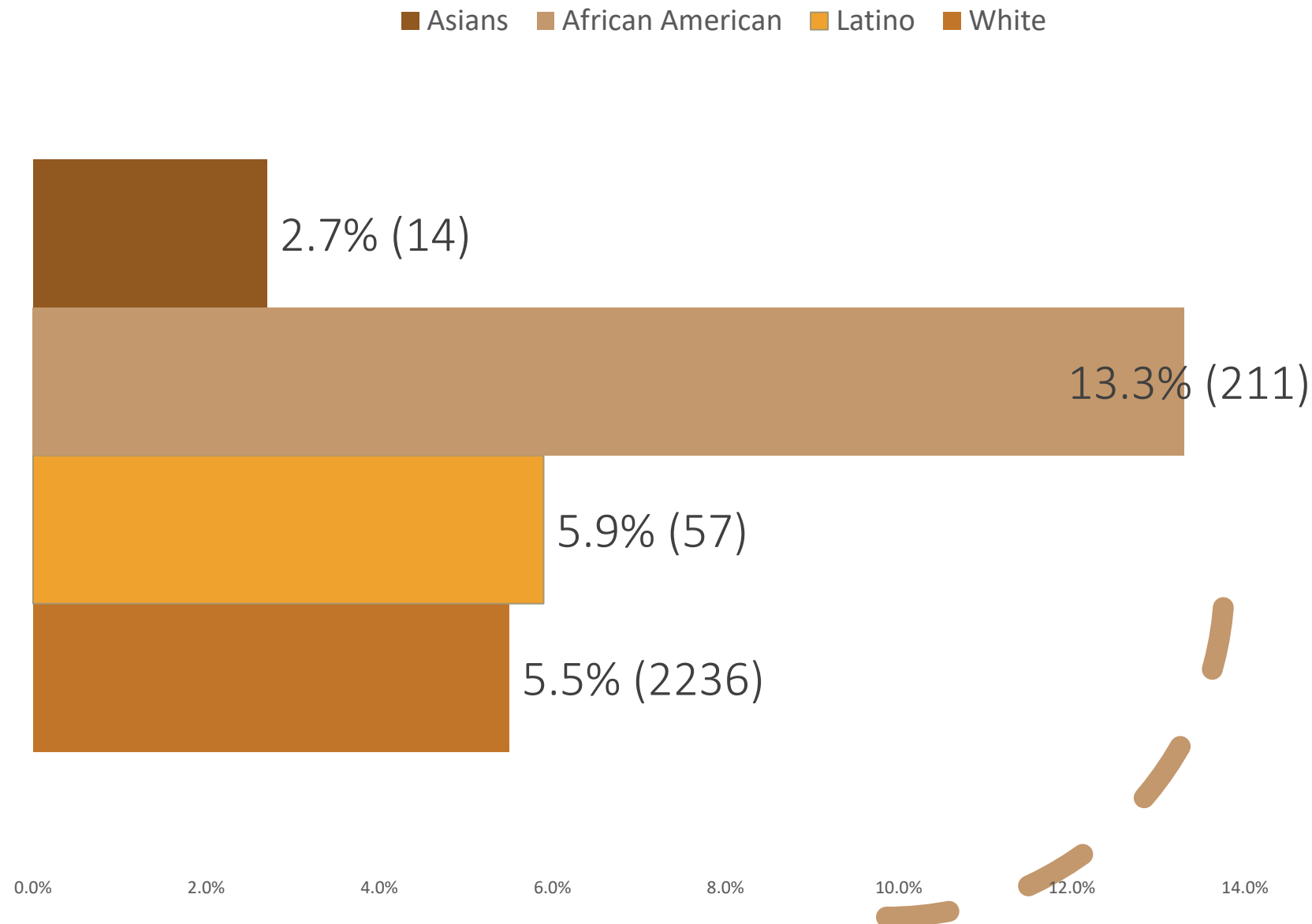

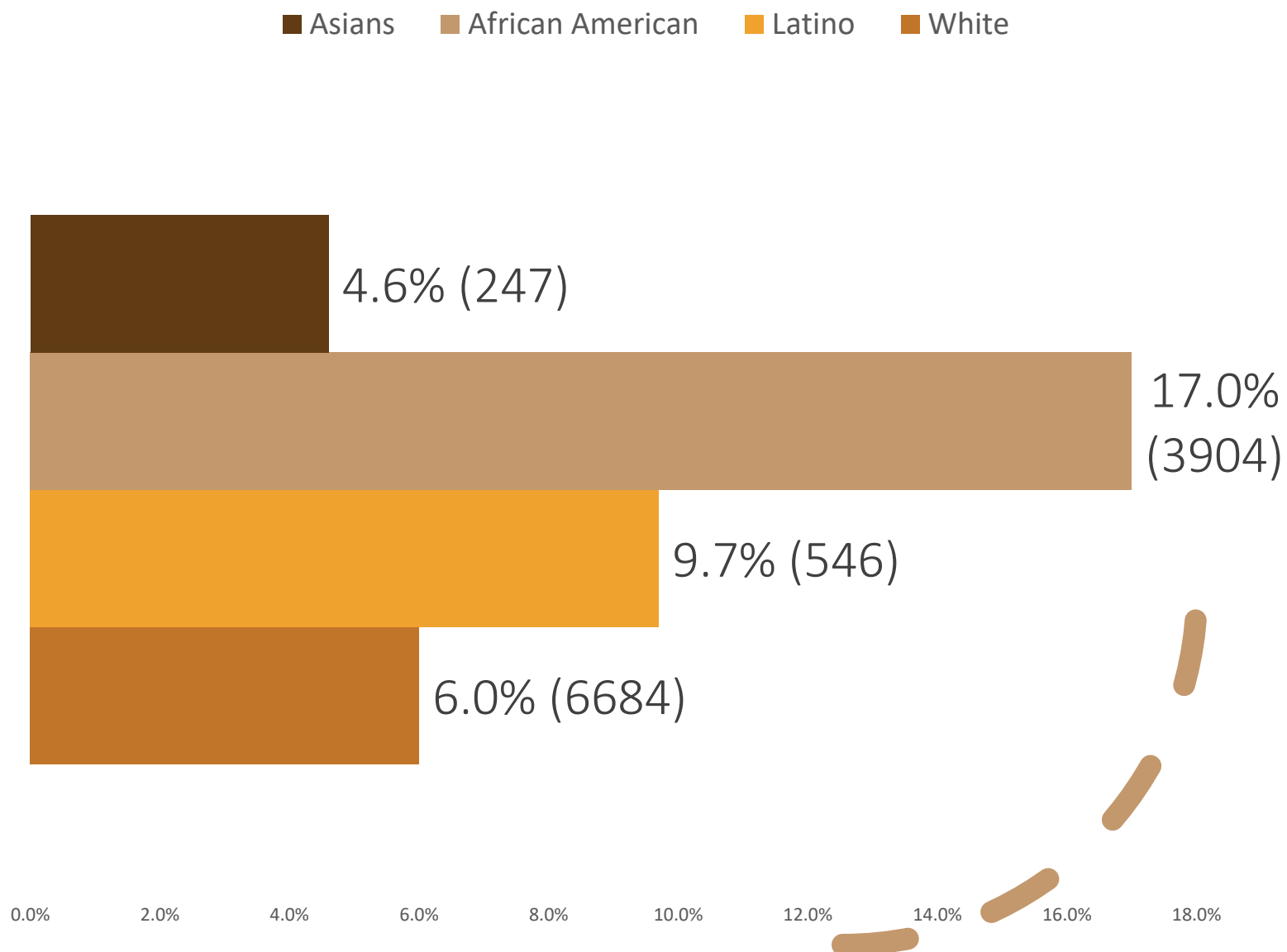

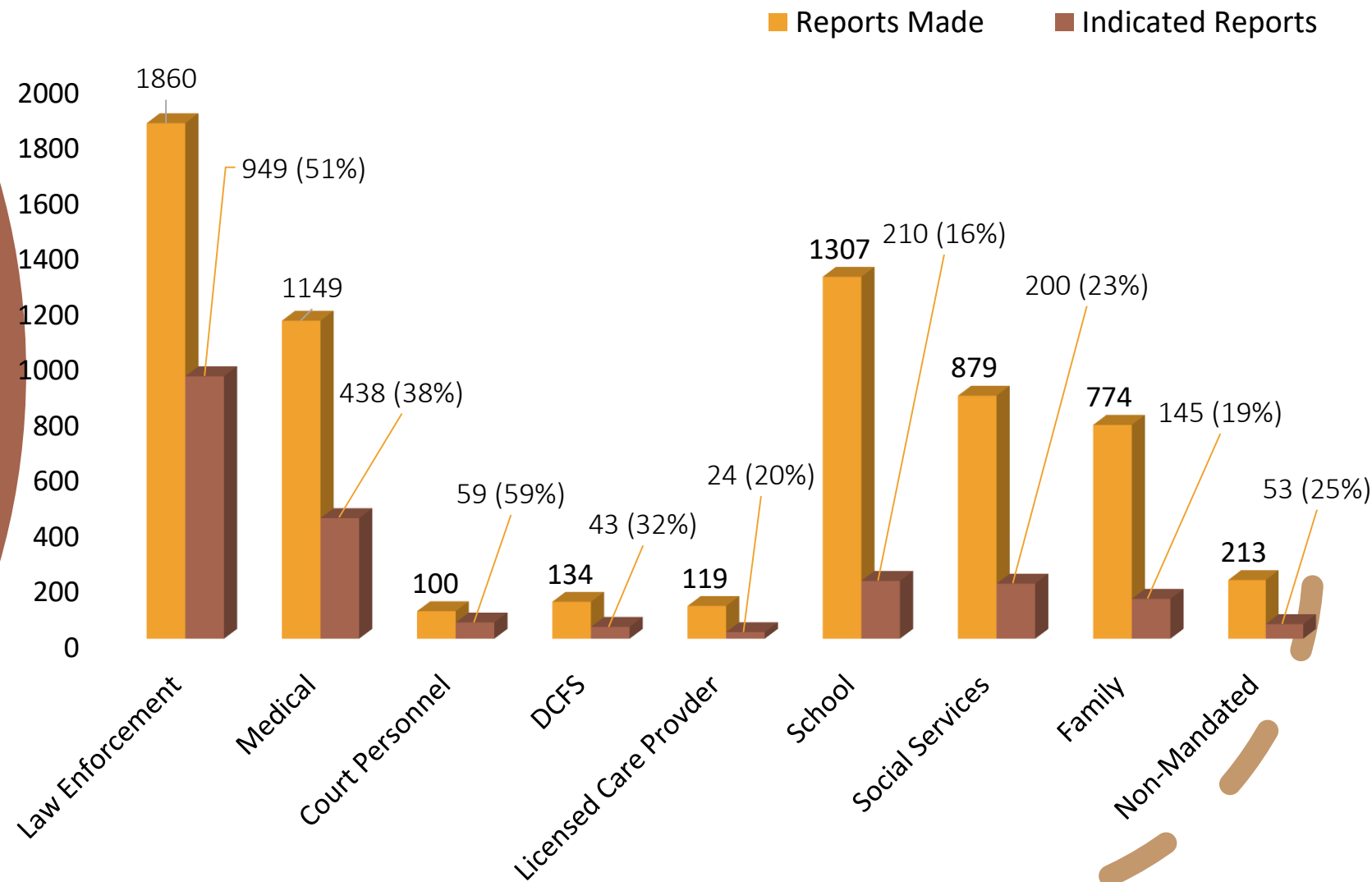

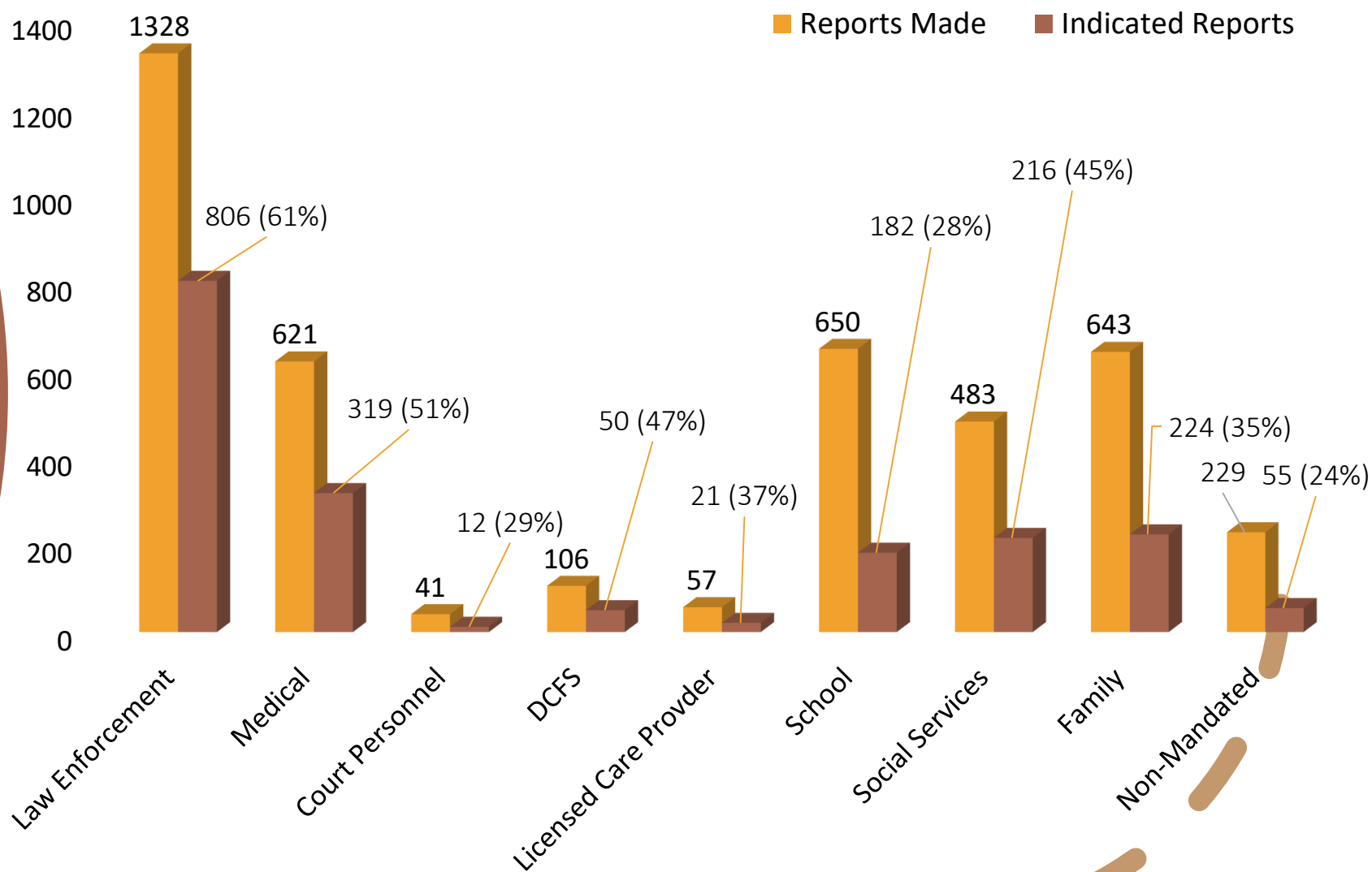

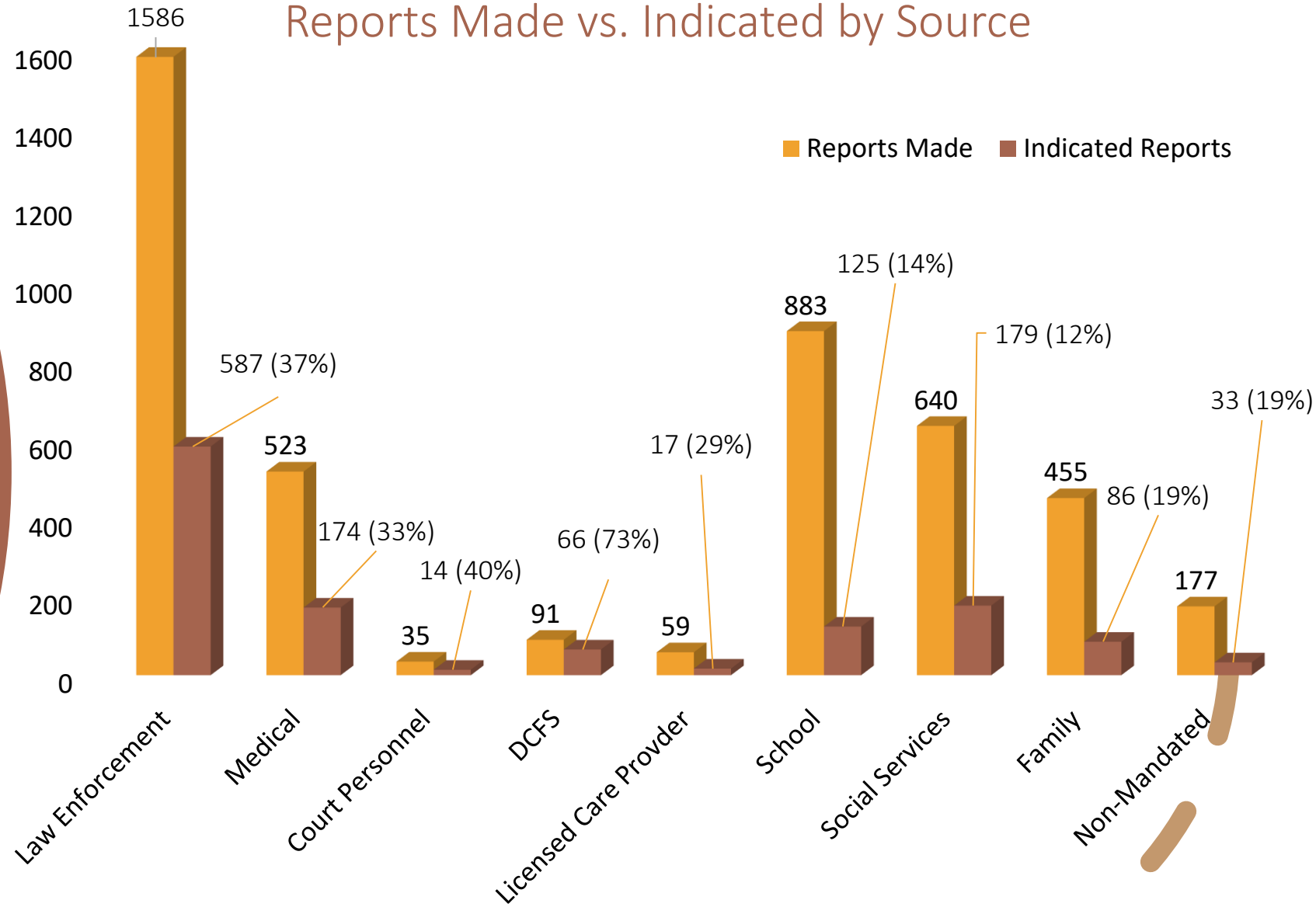

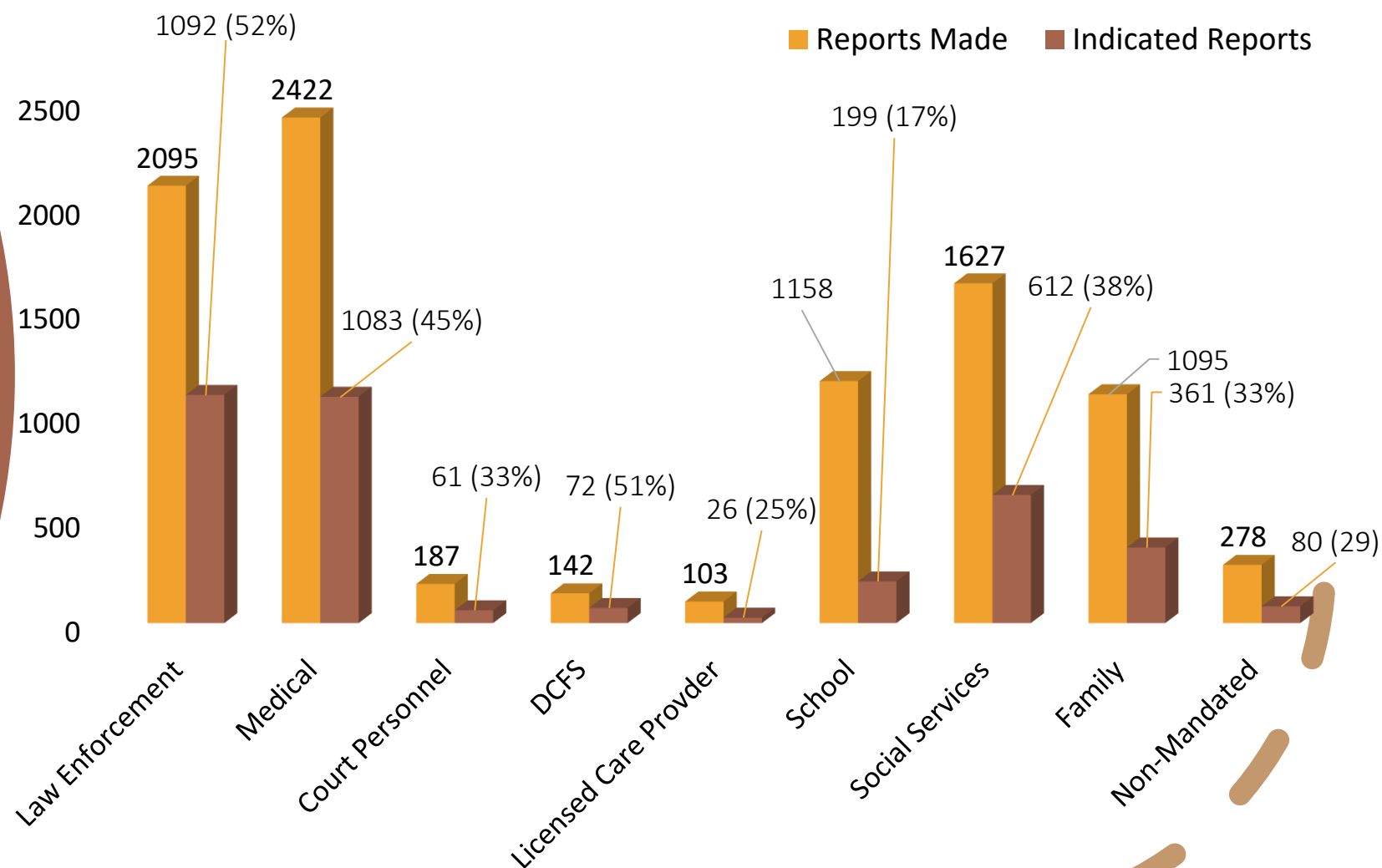

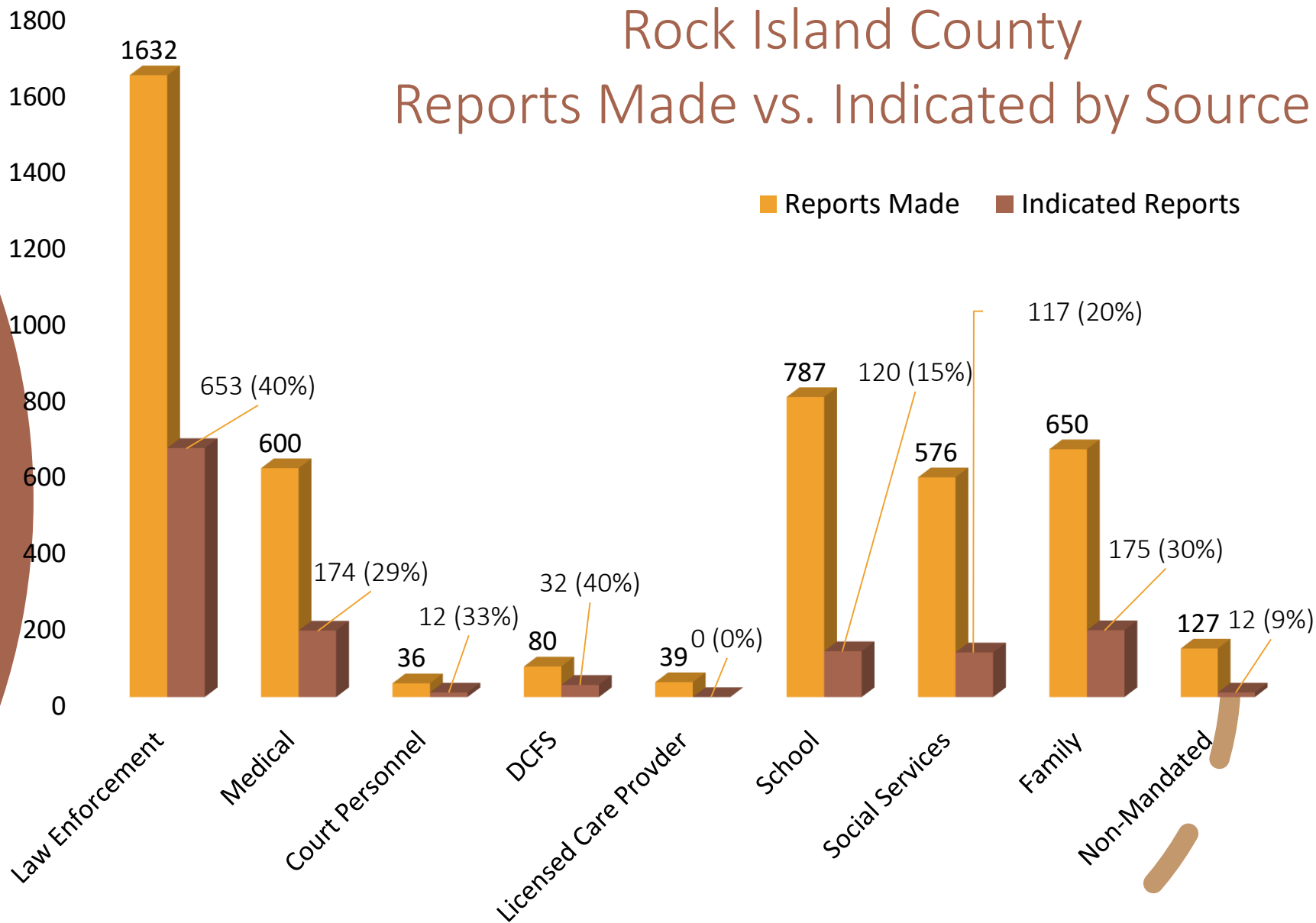

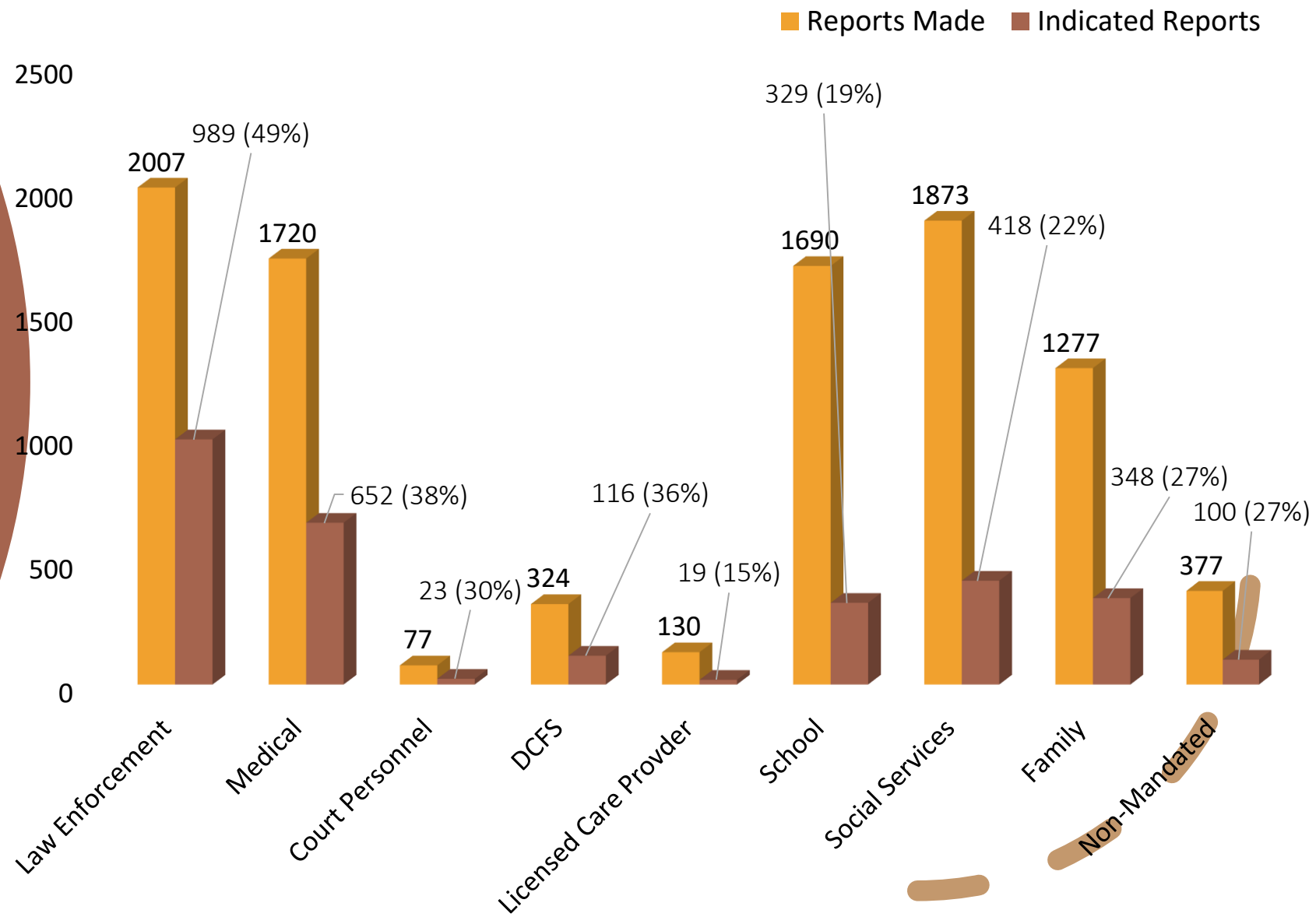

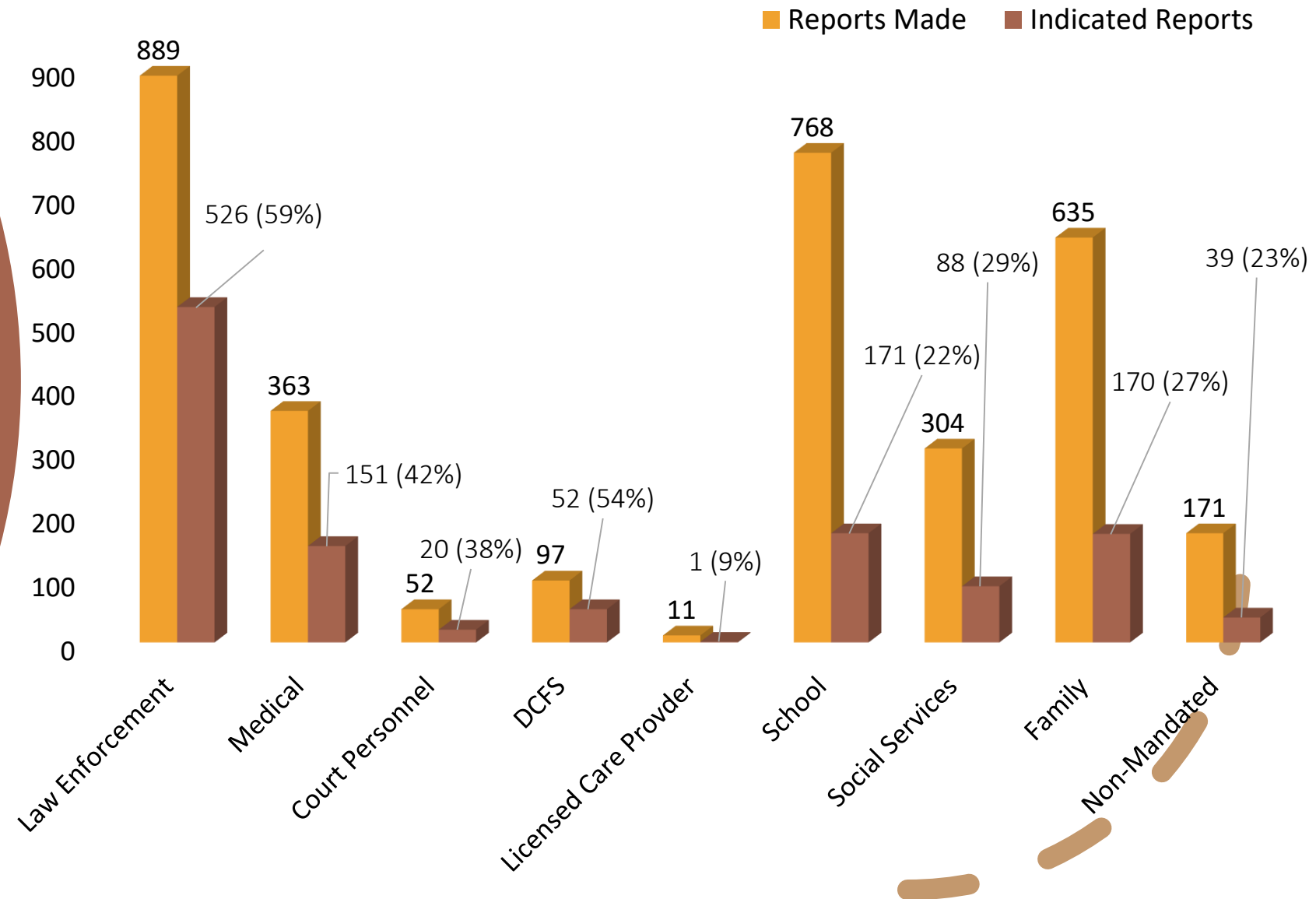

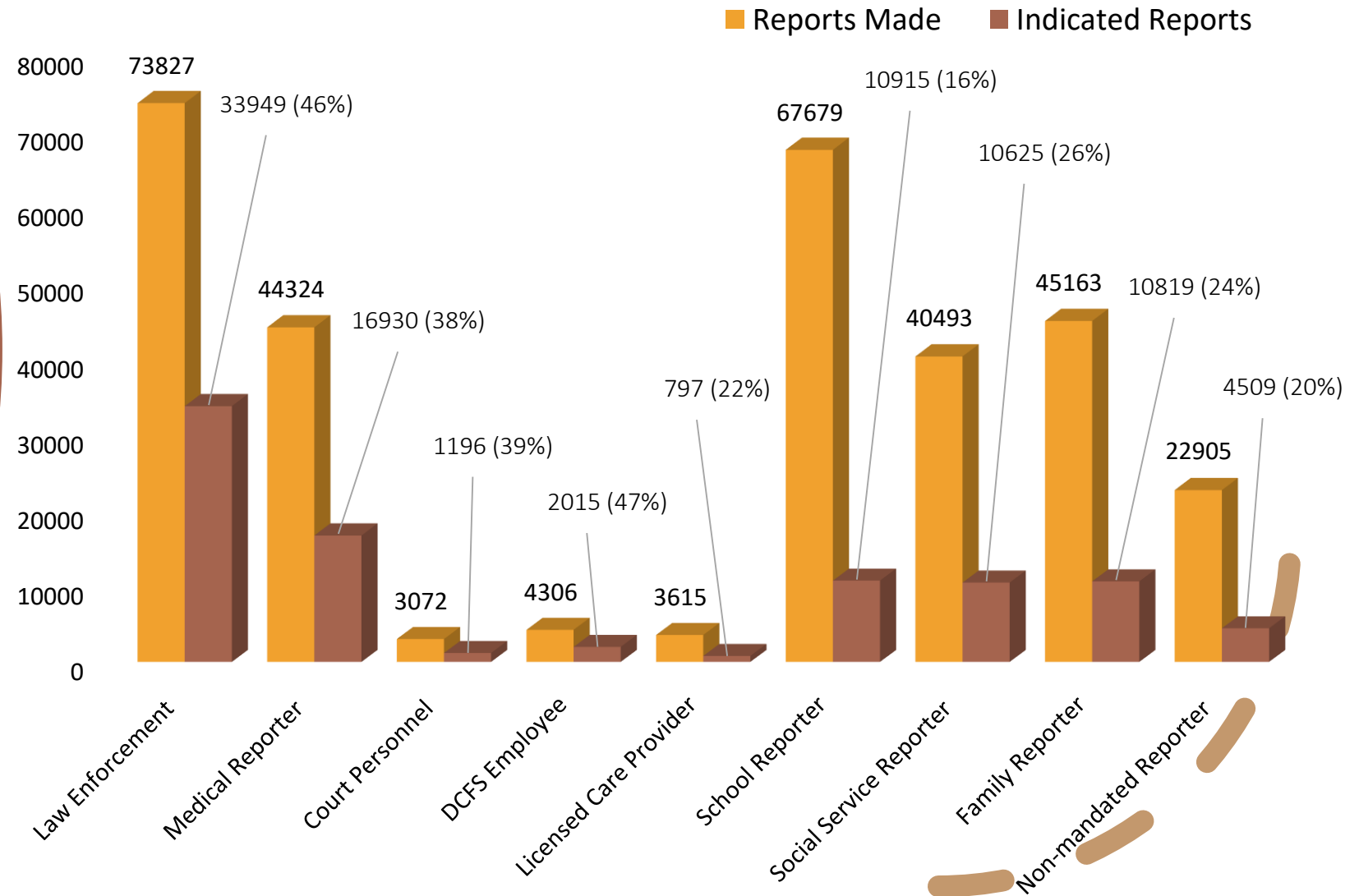

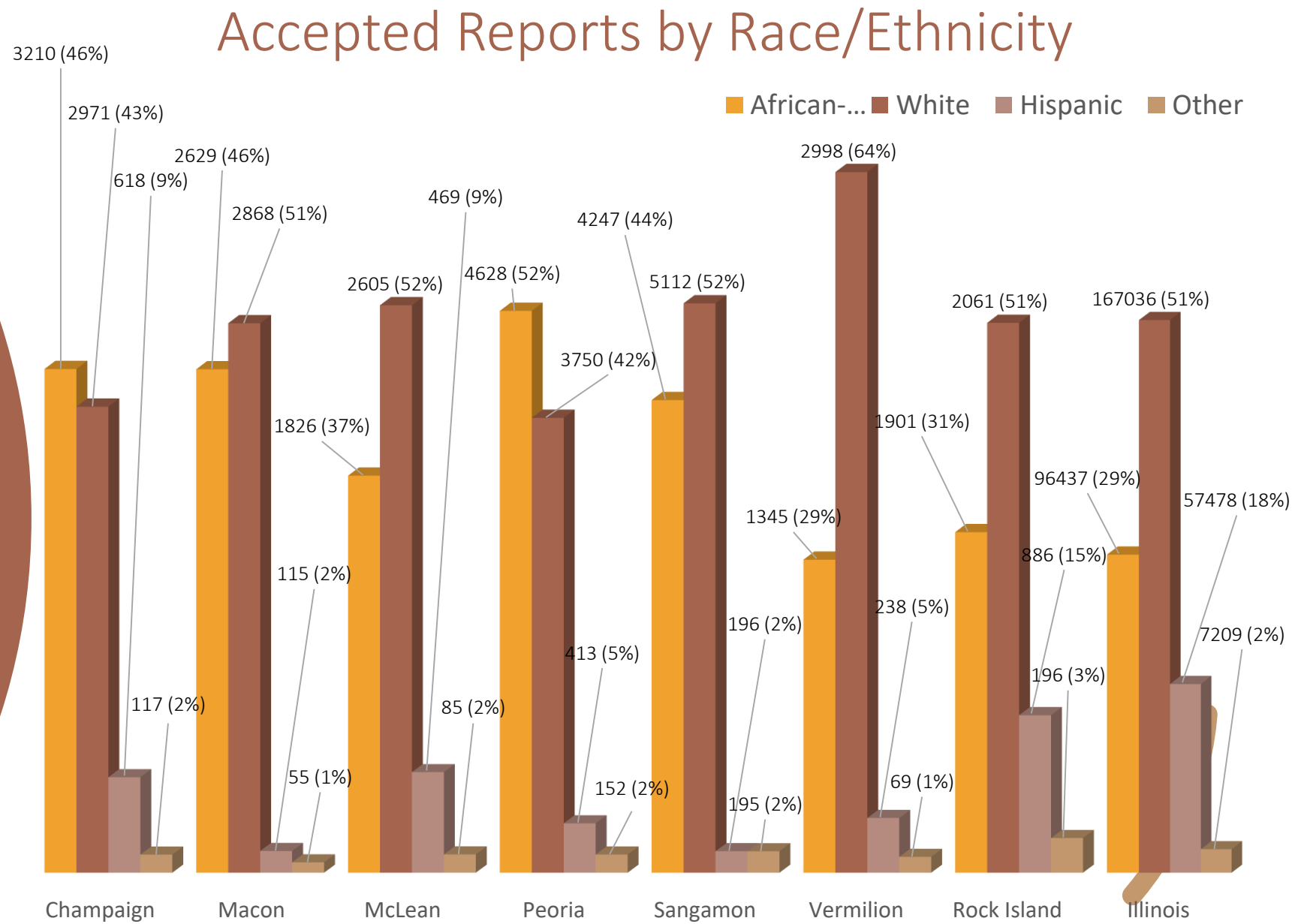

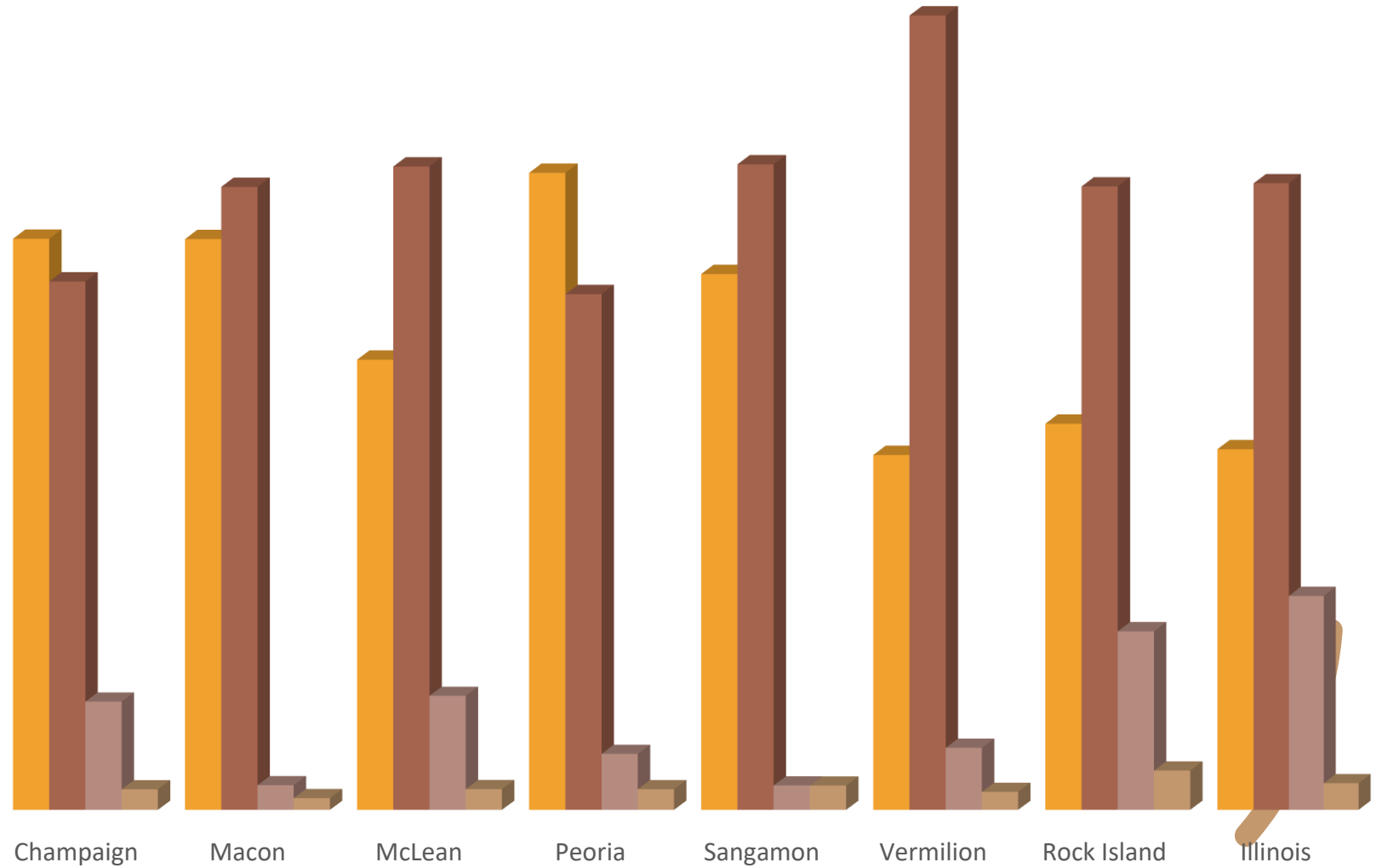

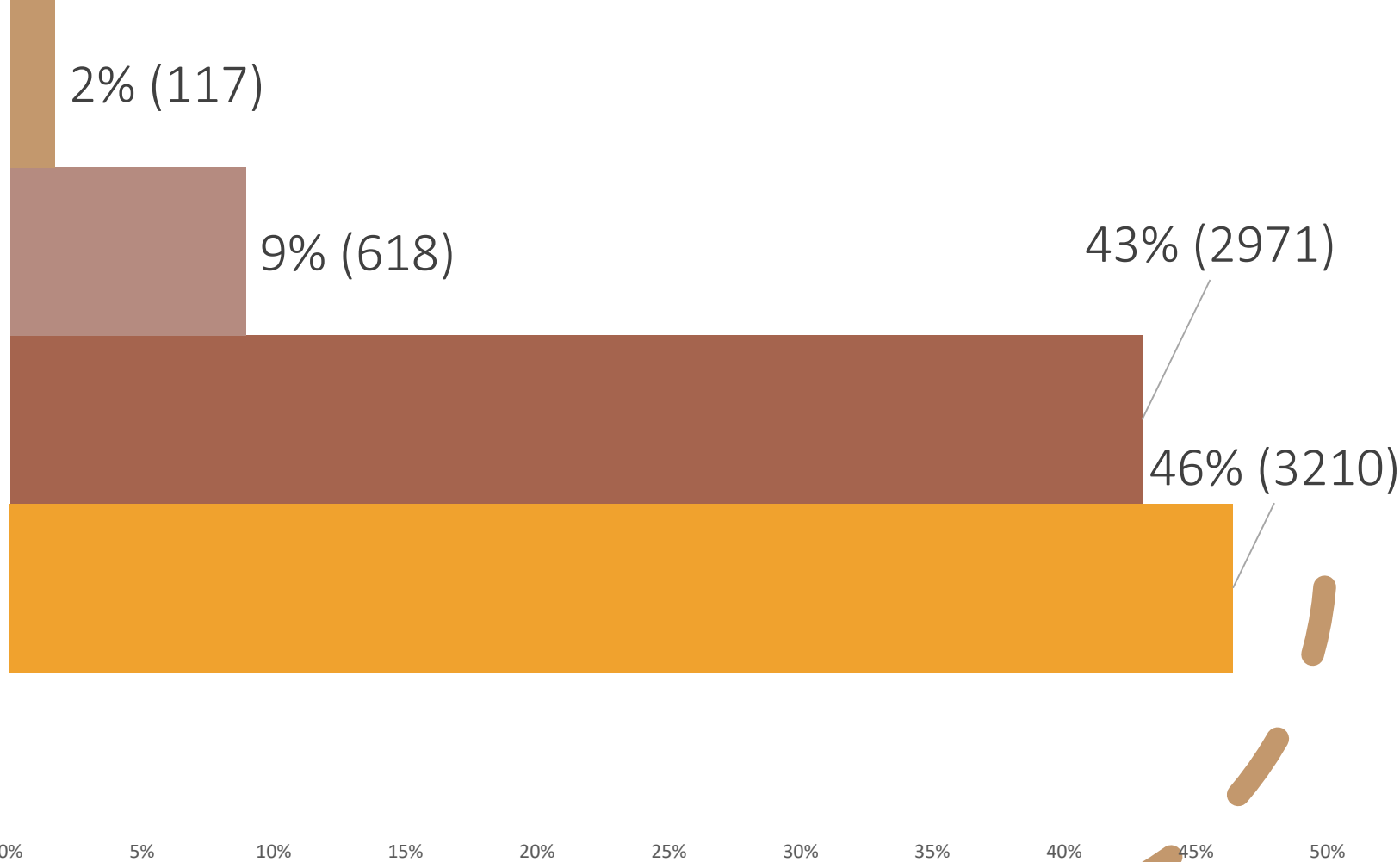

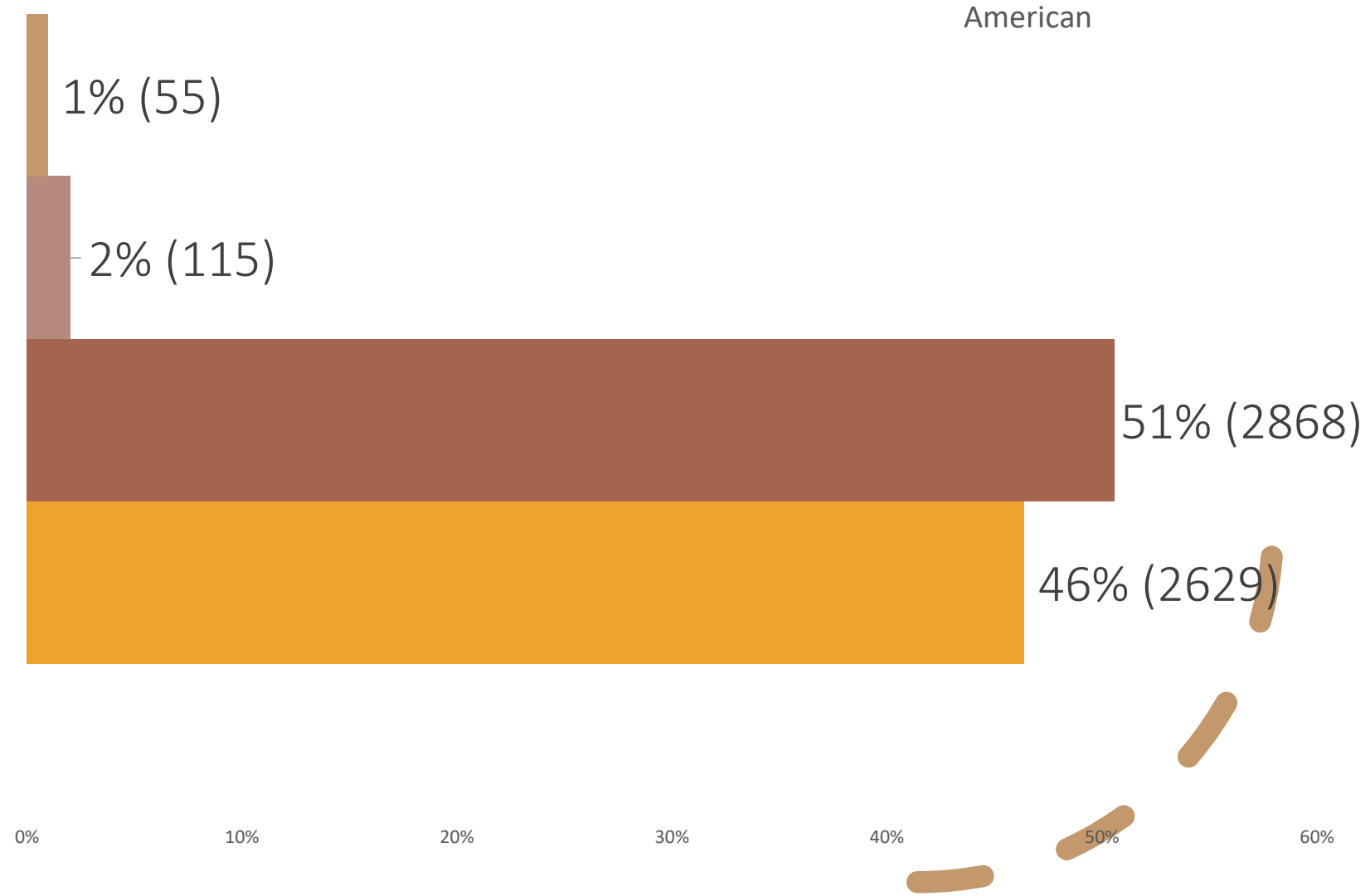

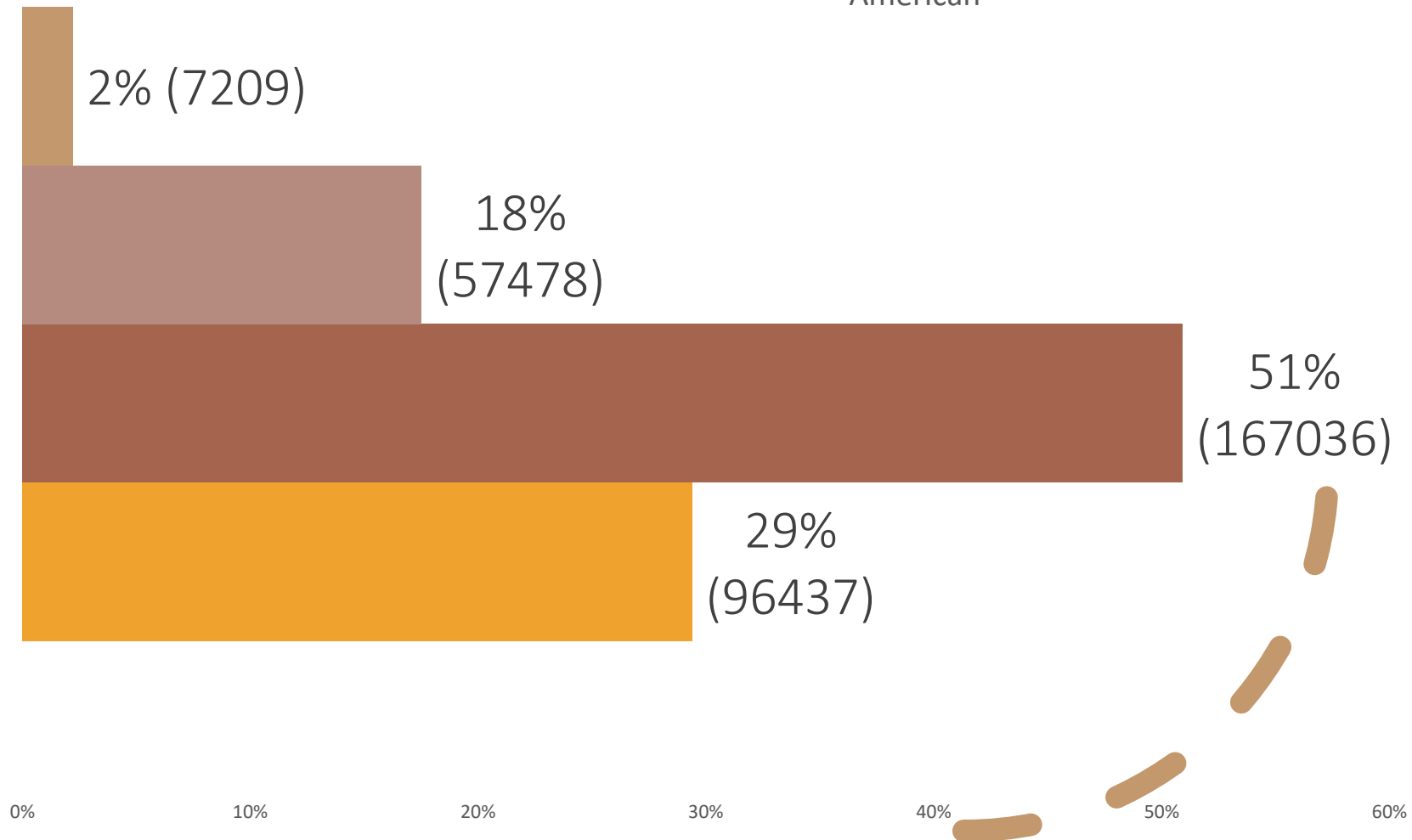

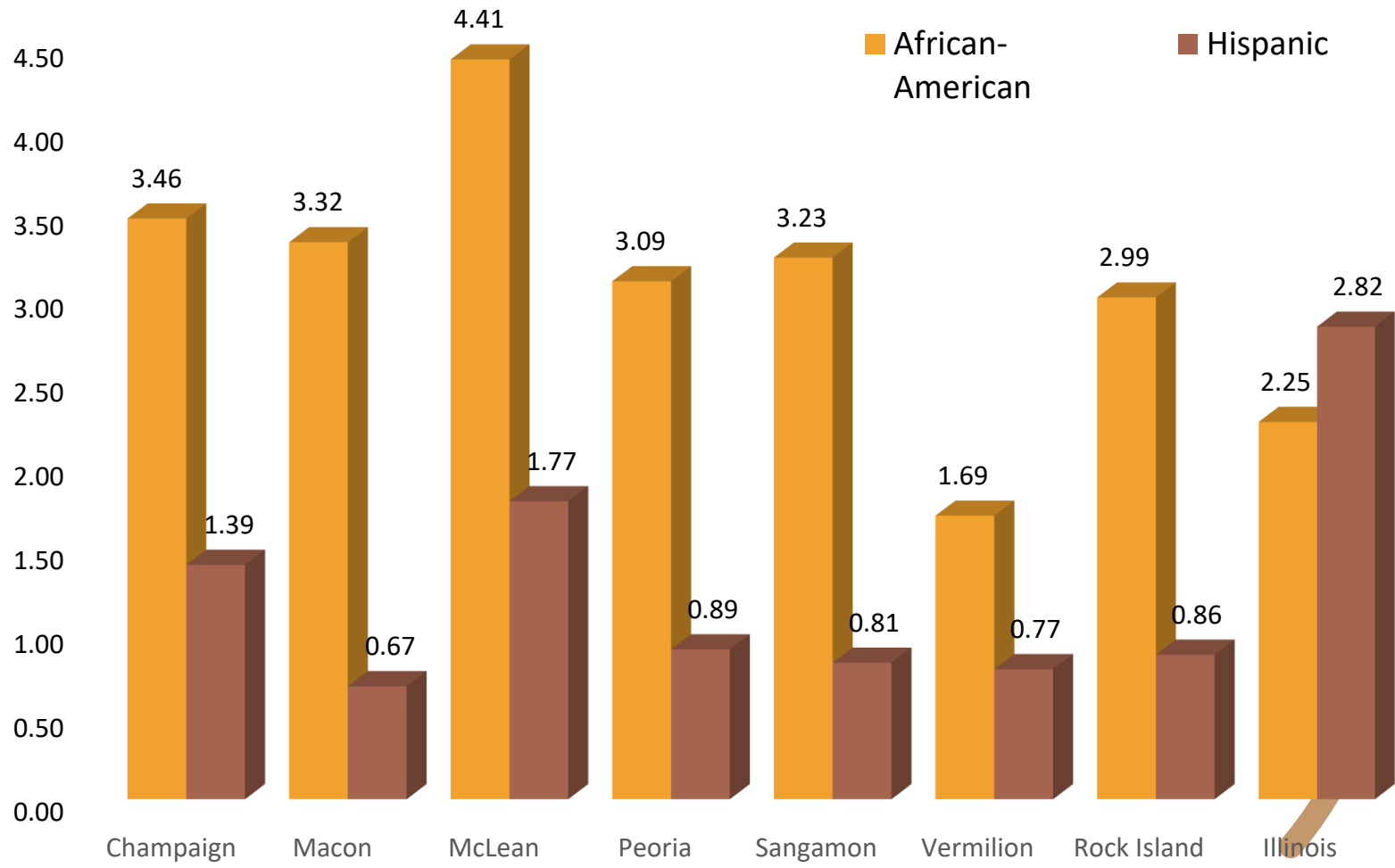

Disparity Ratio for Accepted Reports

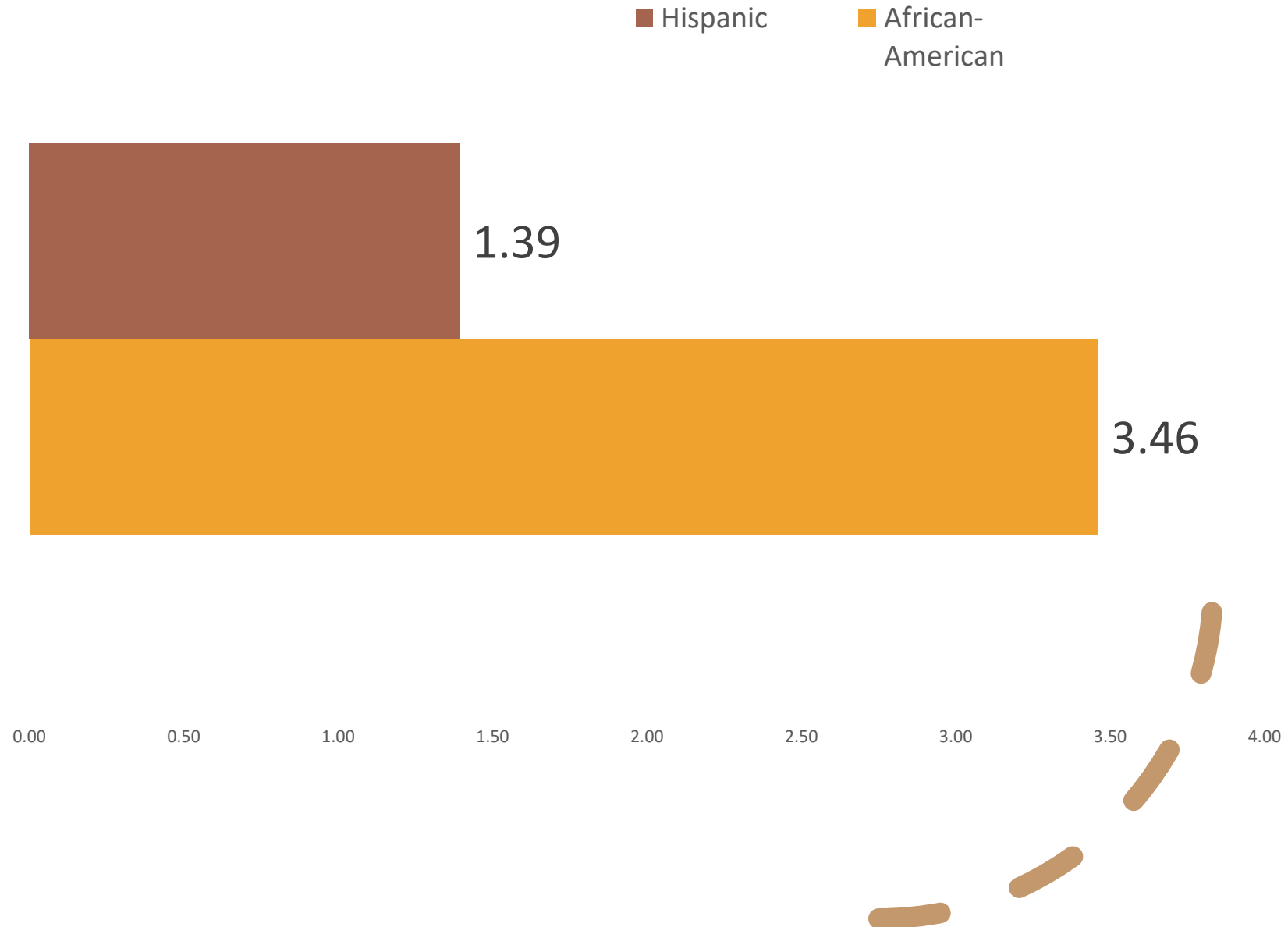

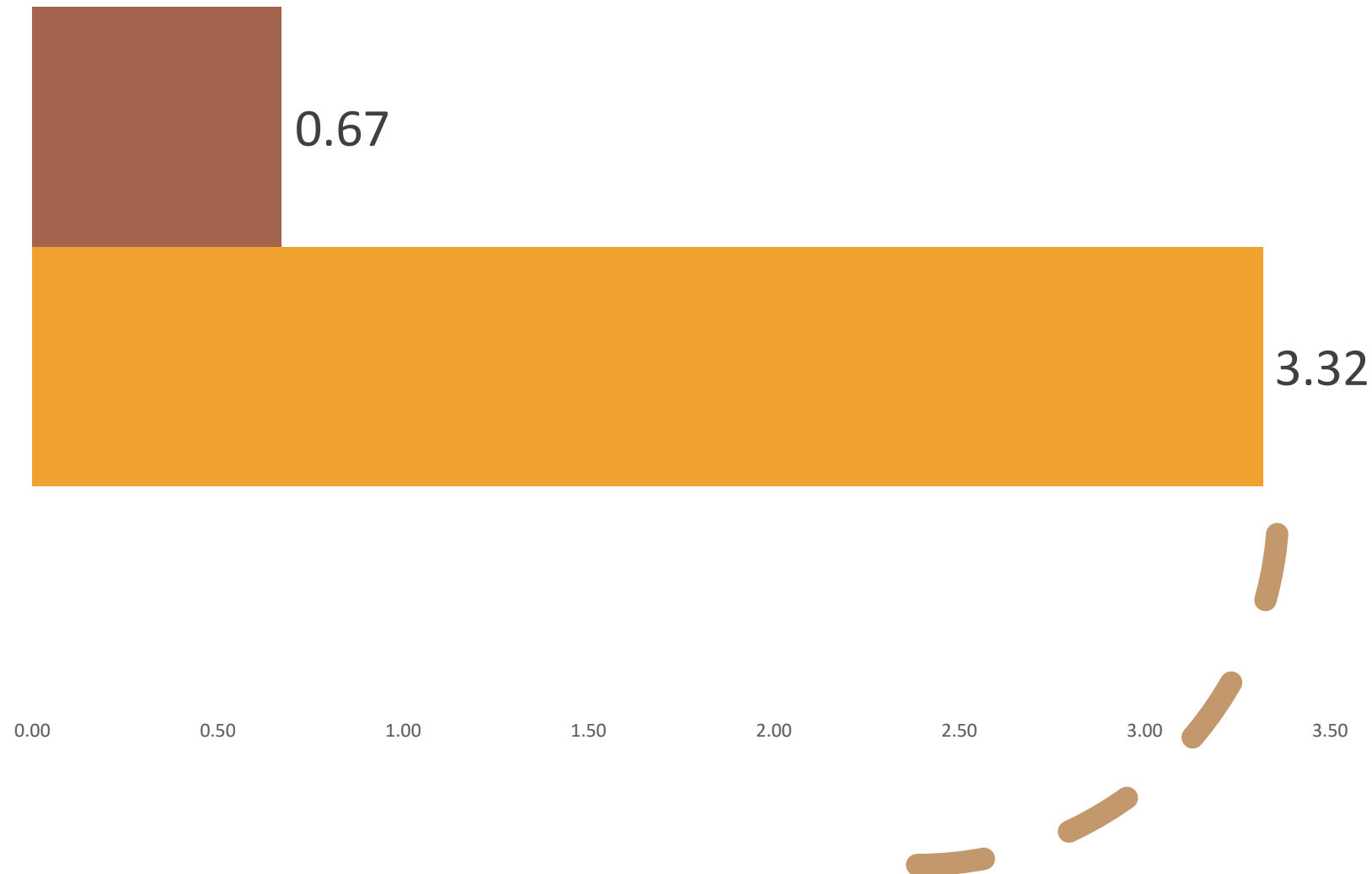

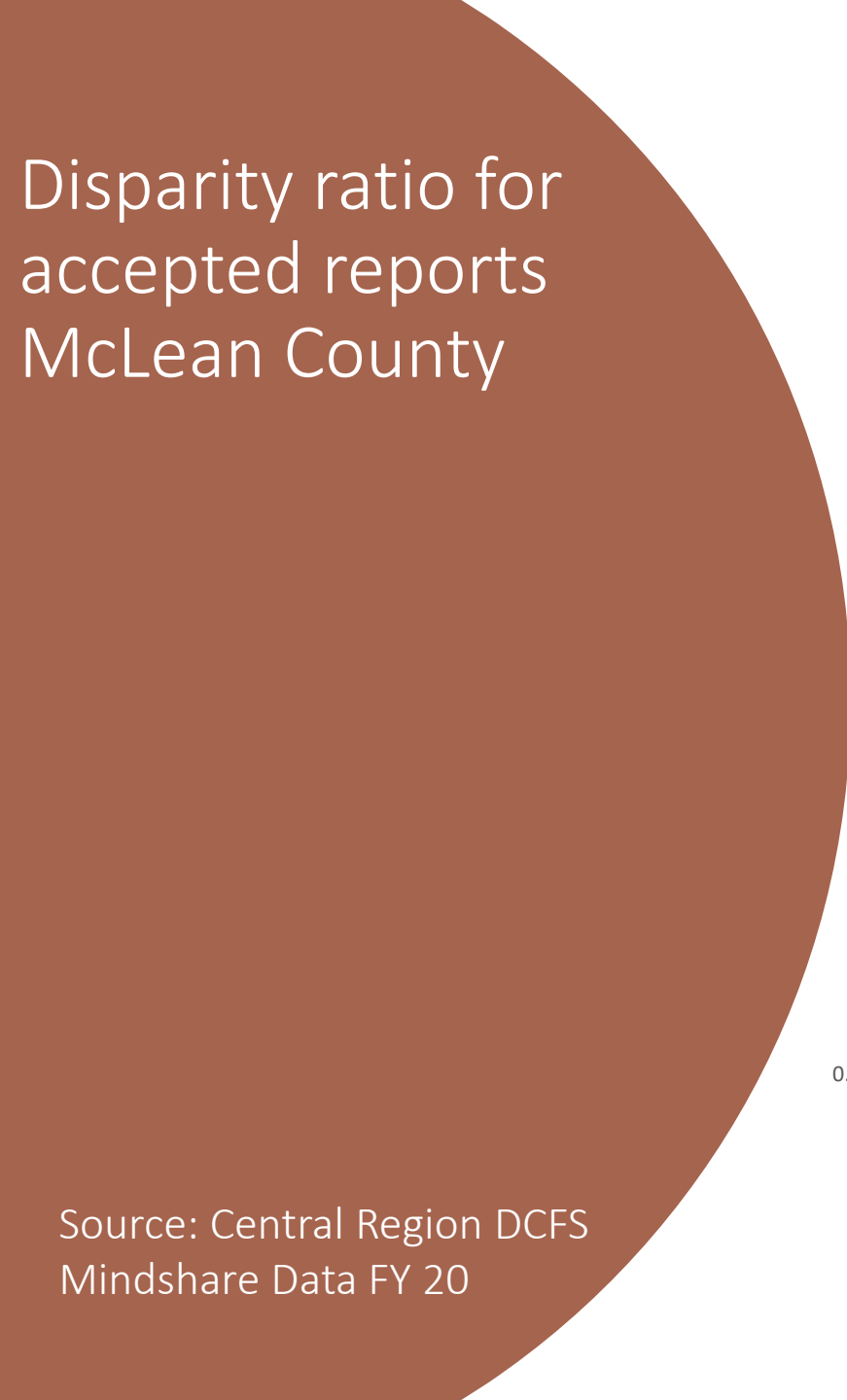
Disparity ratio for accepted reports Macon County

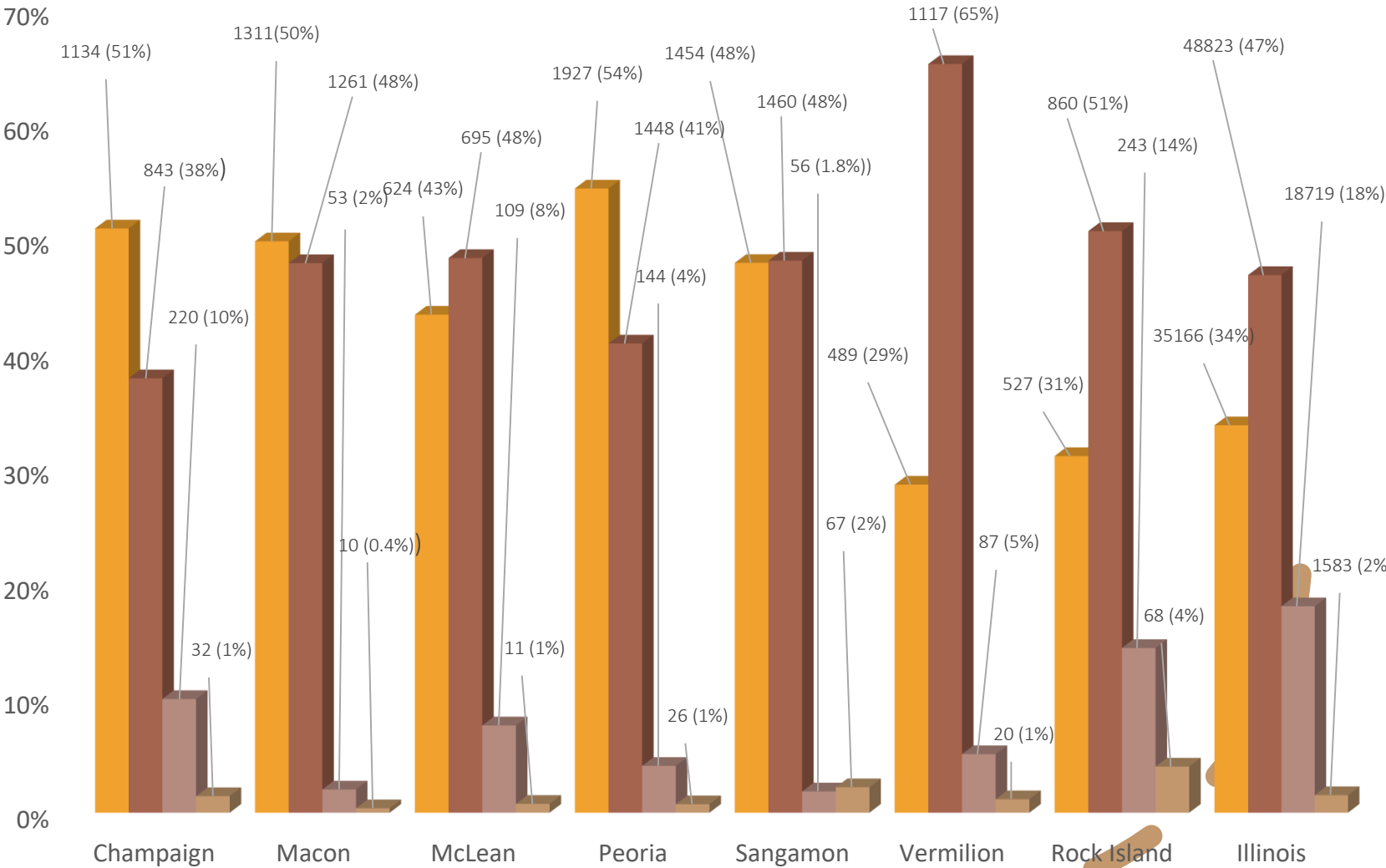

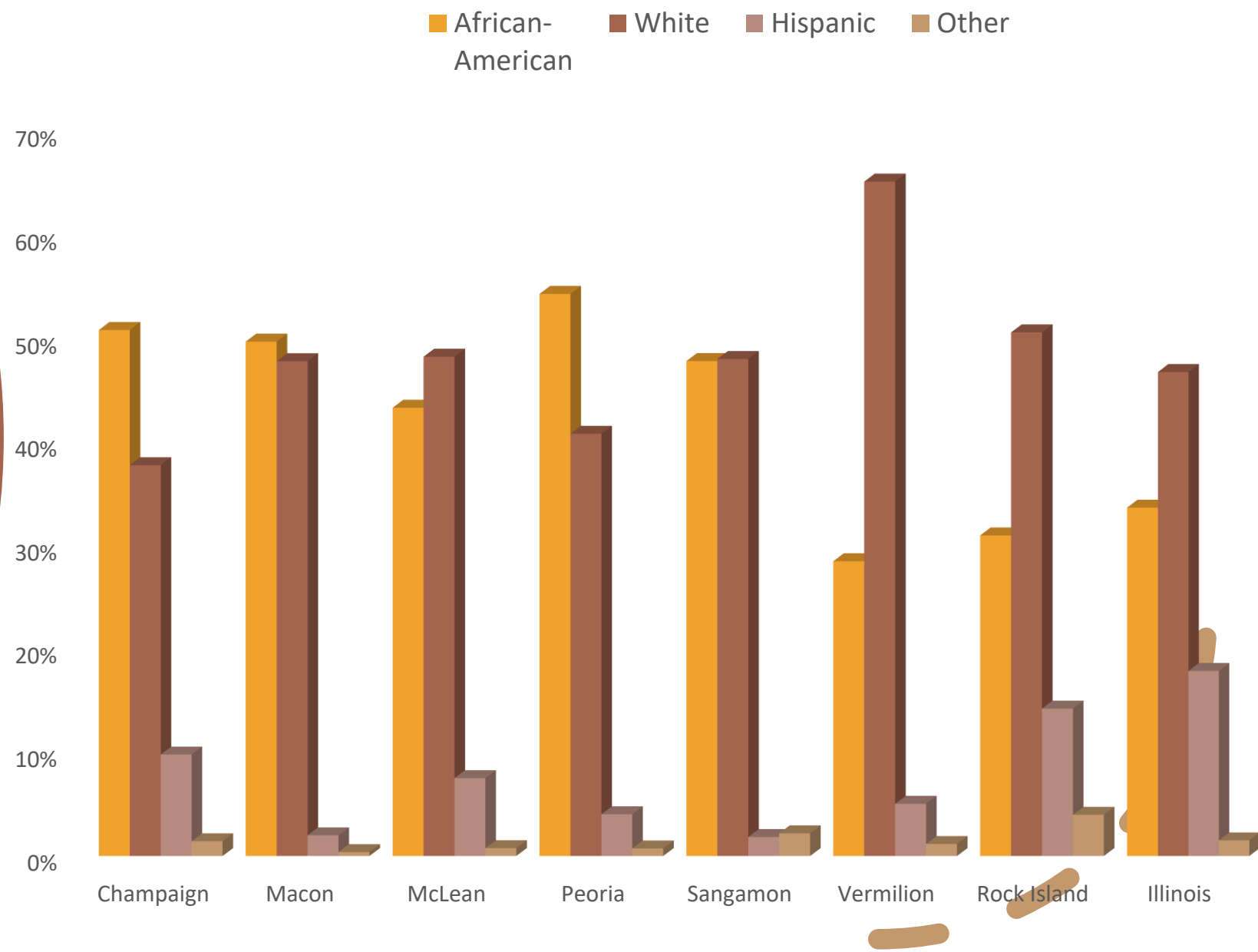

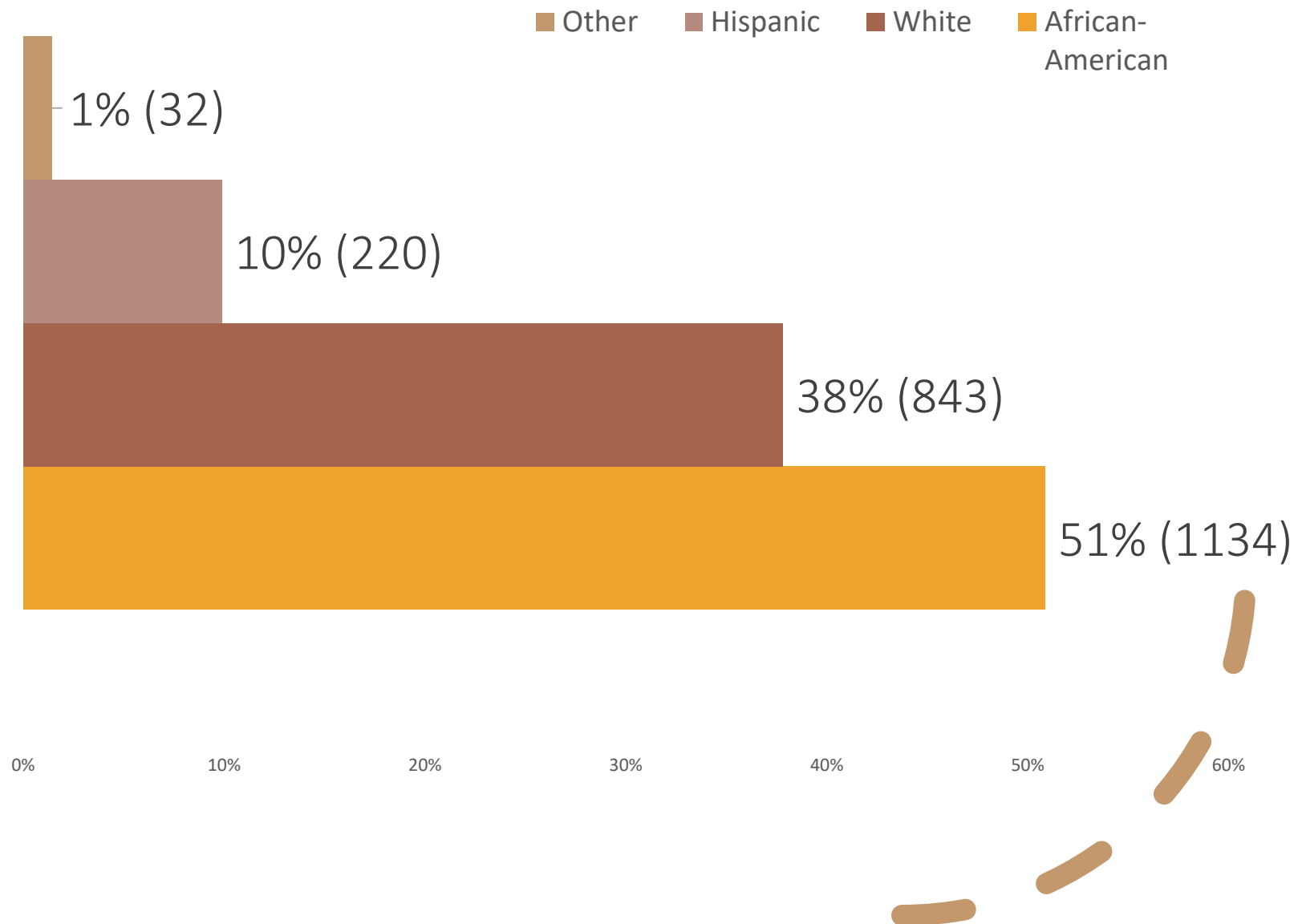

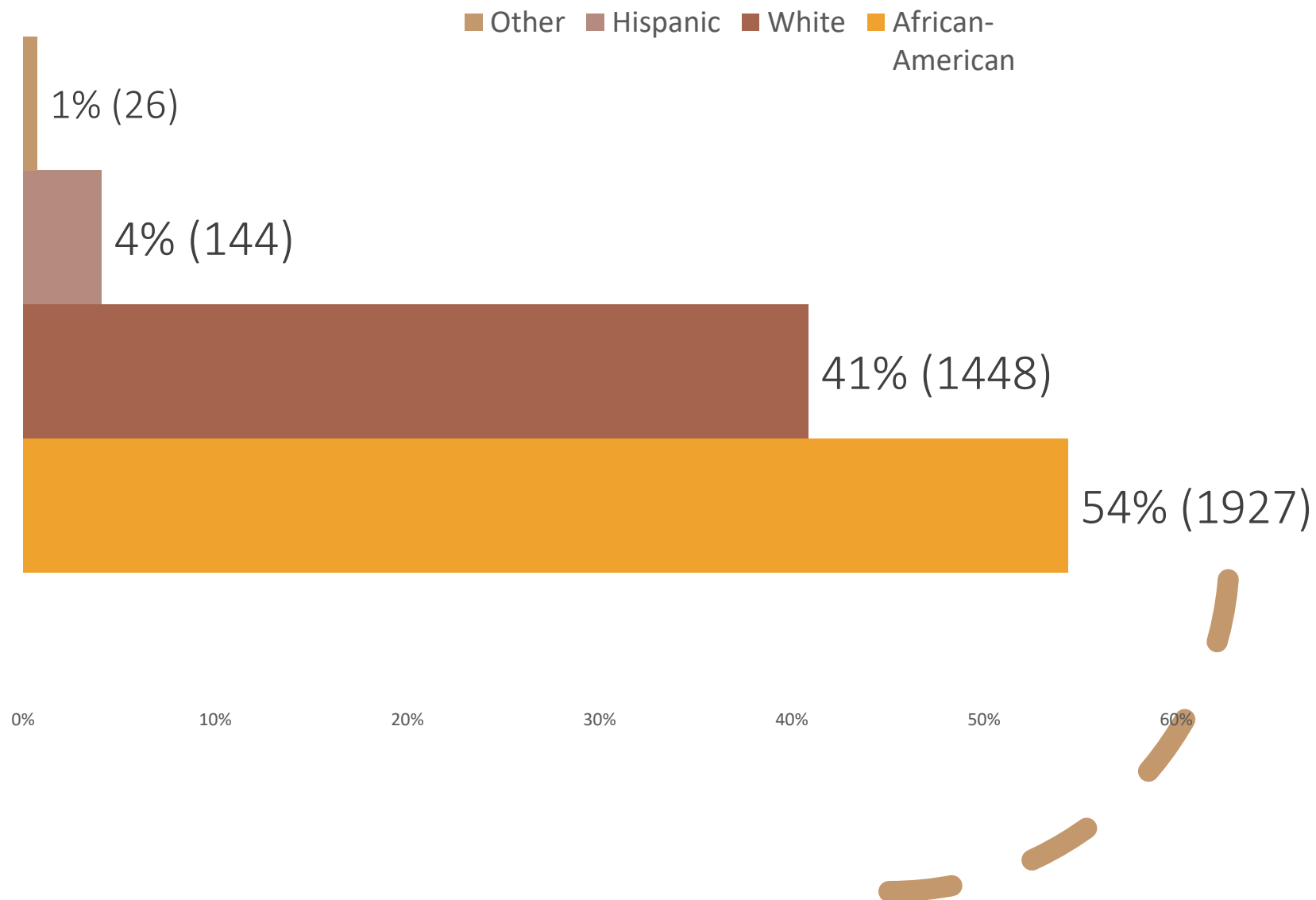

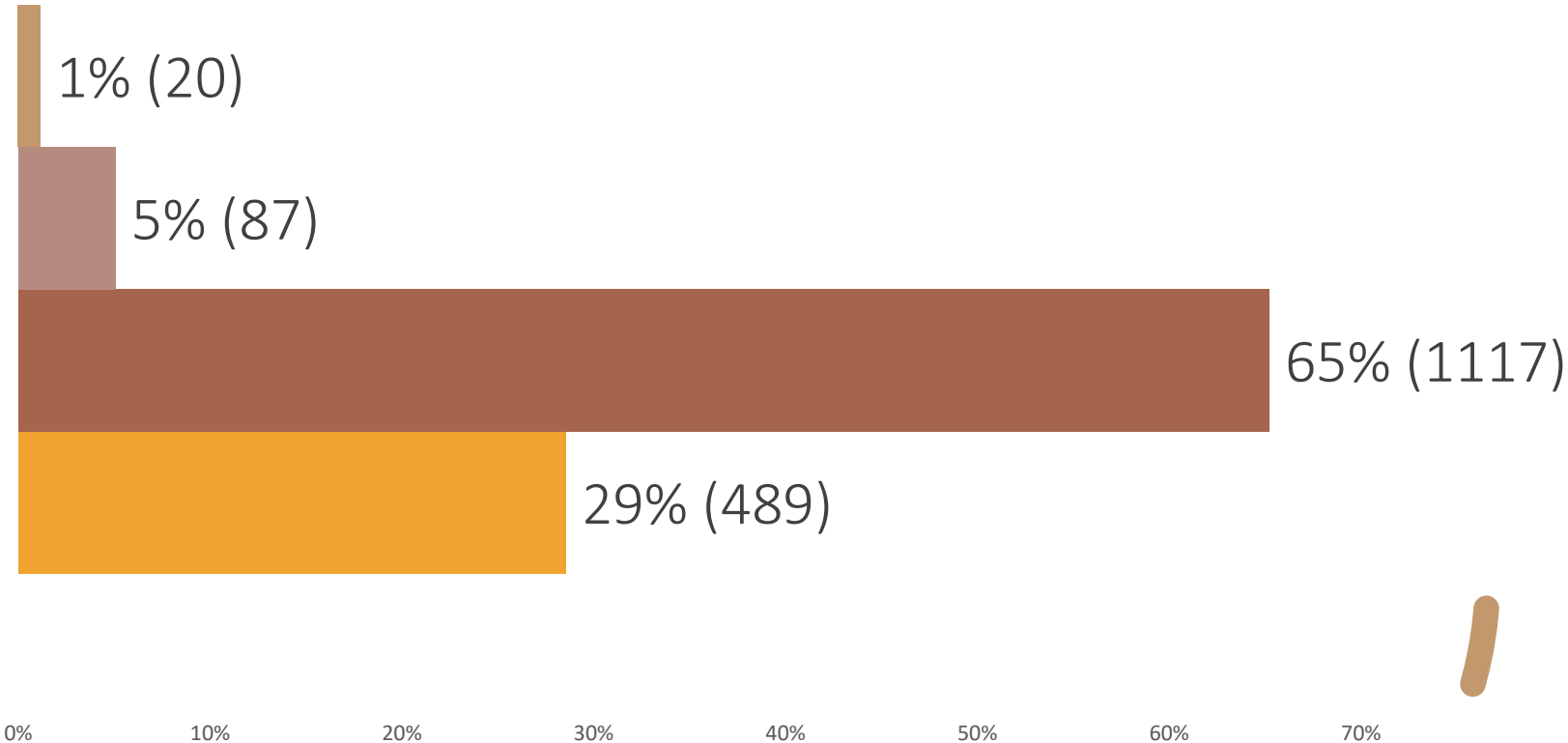

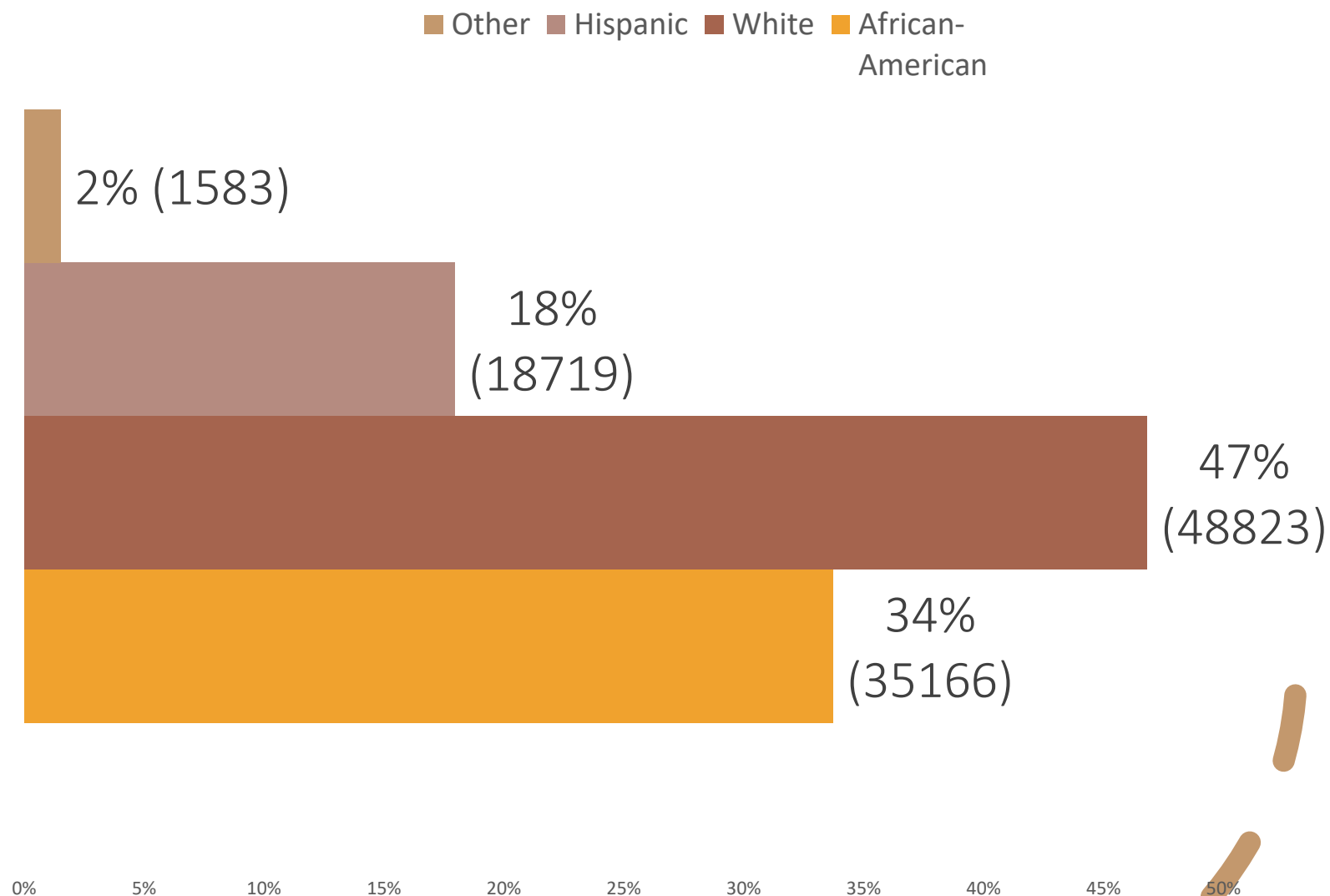

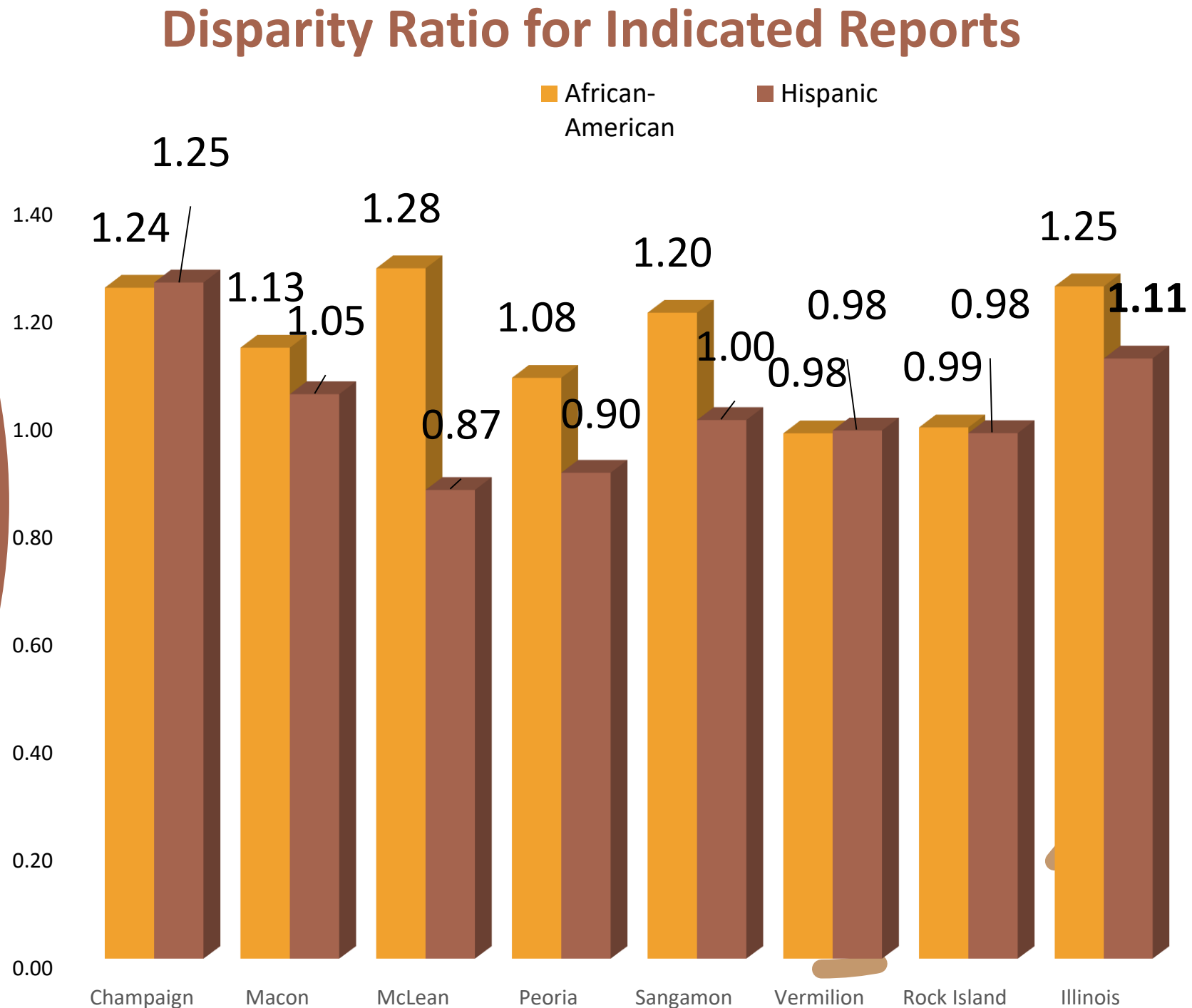

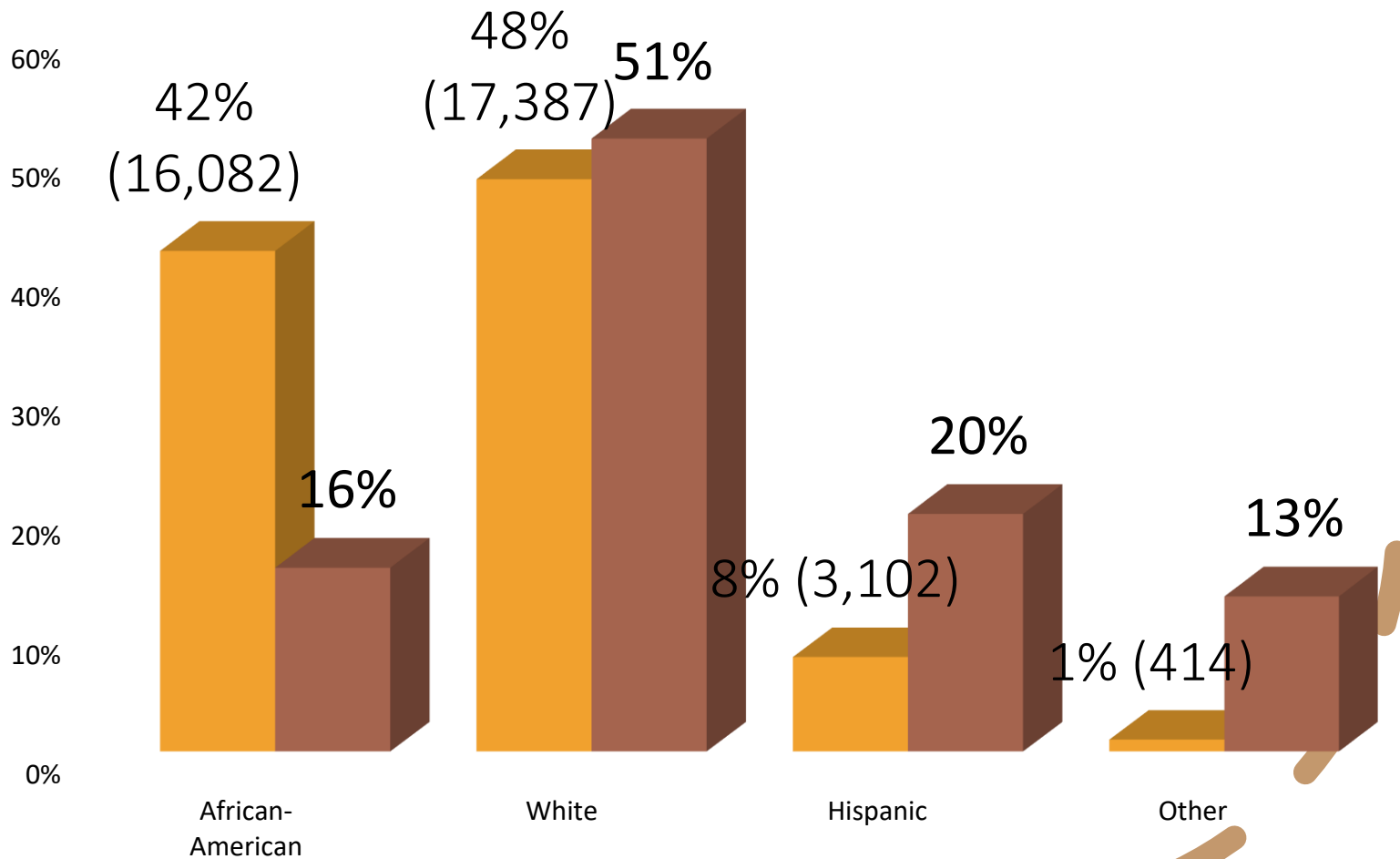

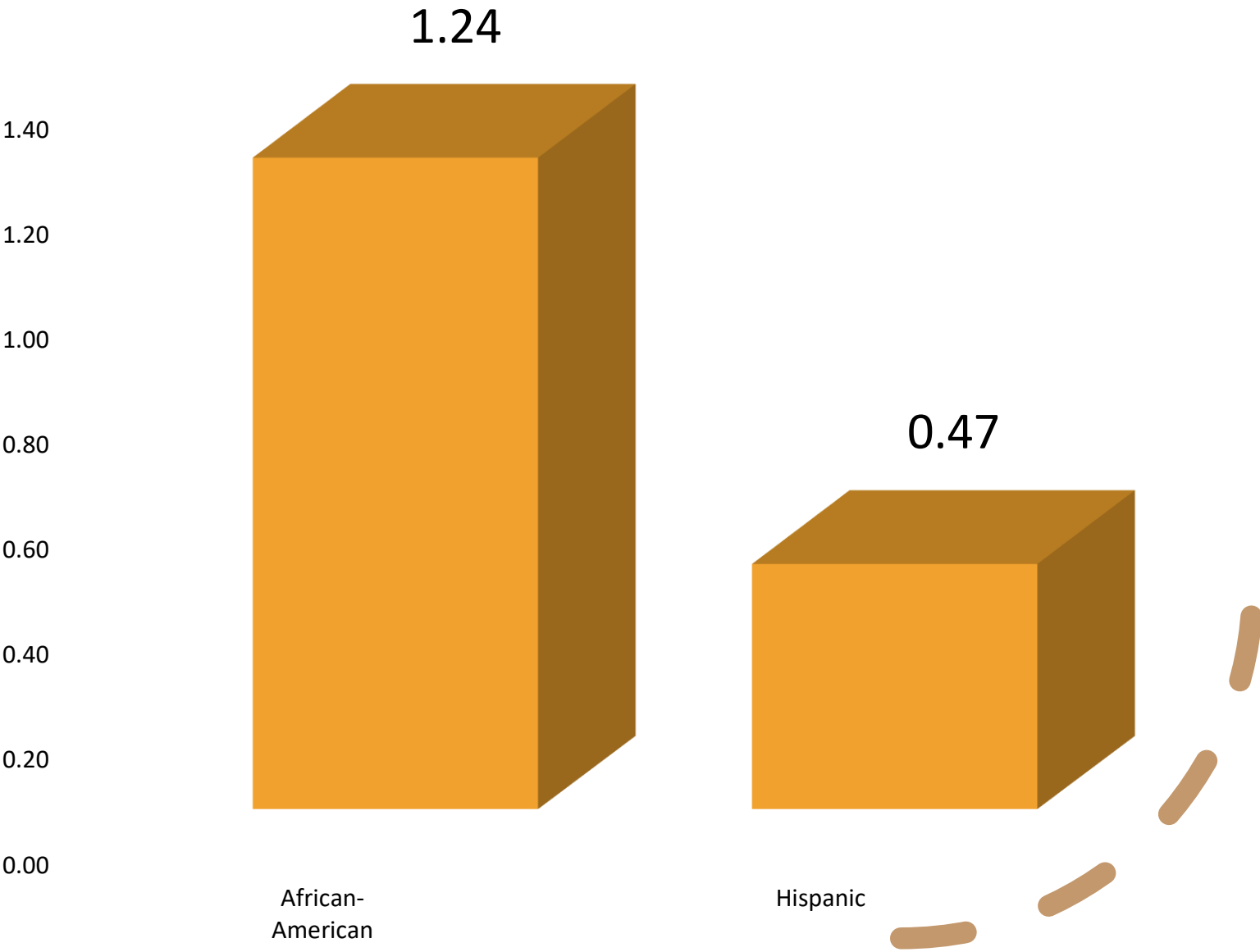

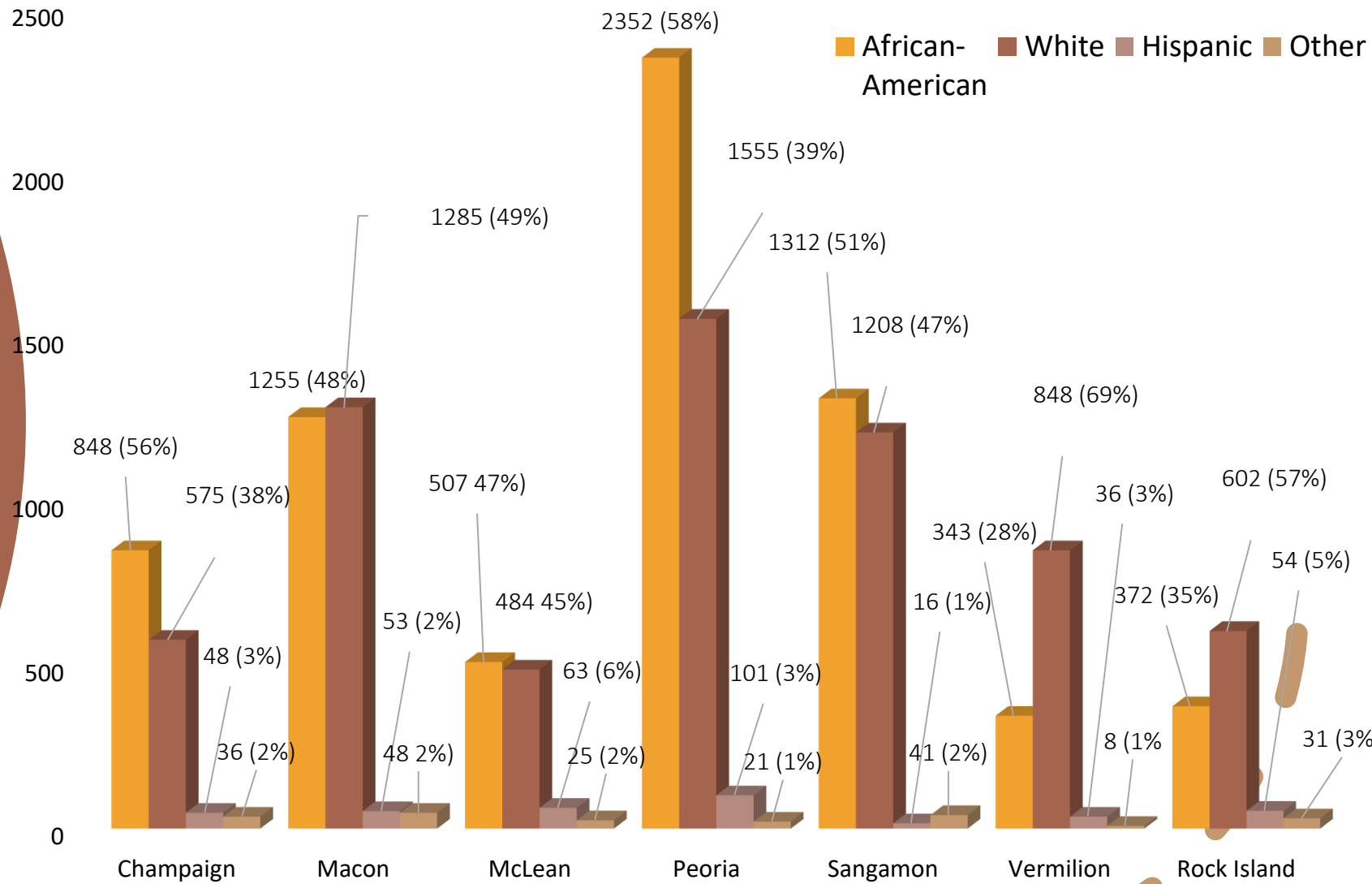

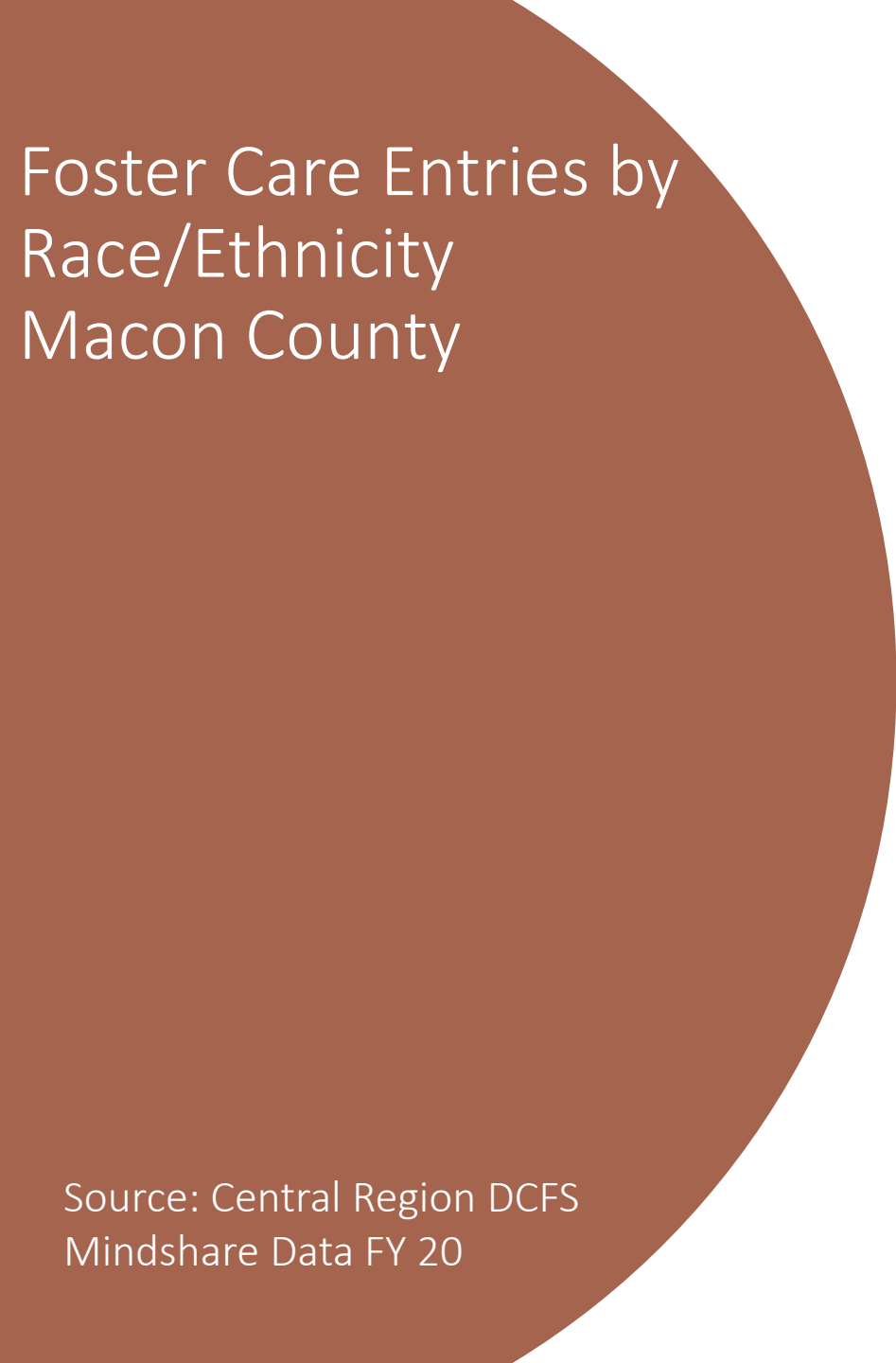


Foster Care Entries by Race/Ethnicity Champaign County

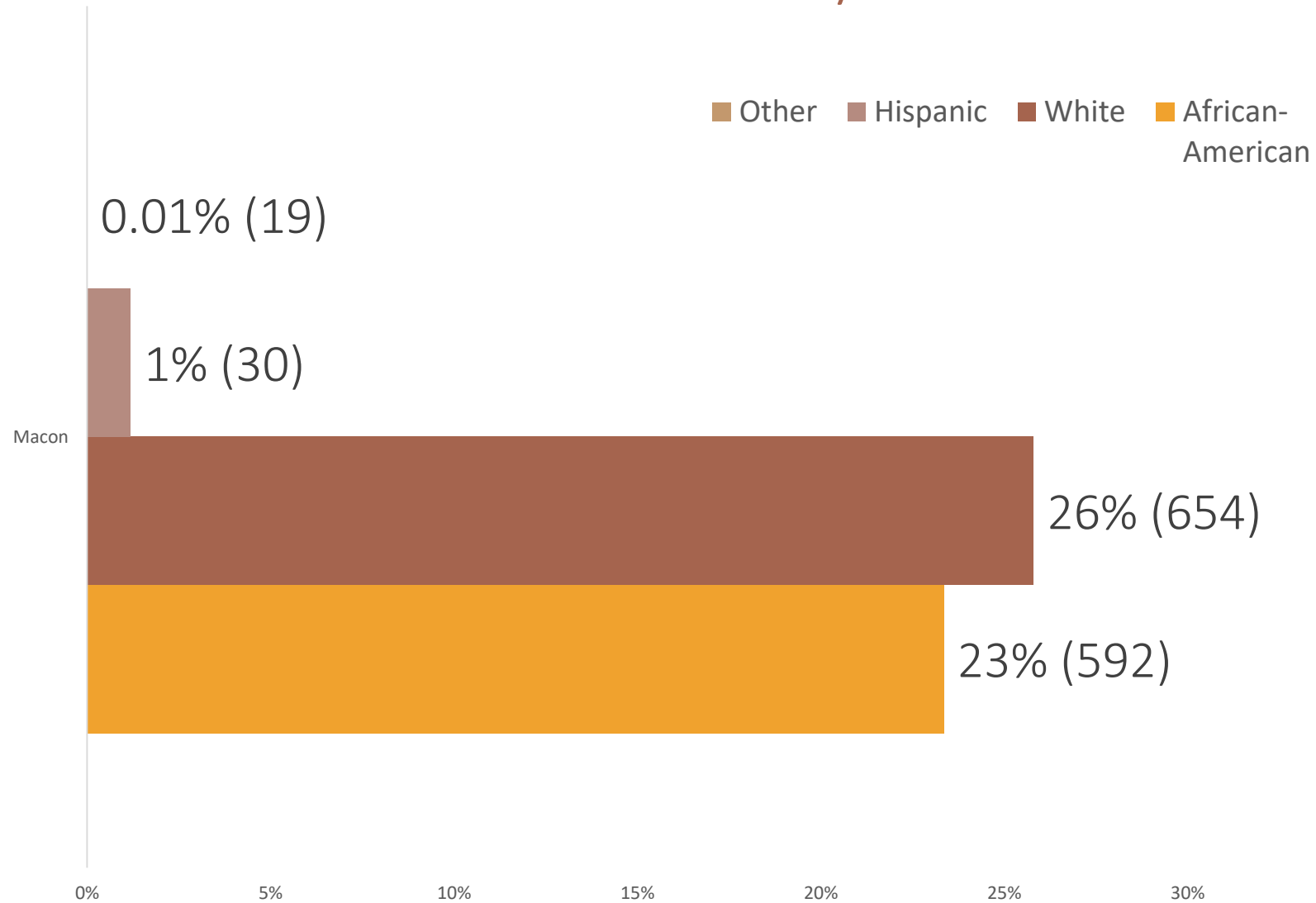

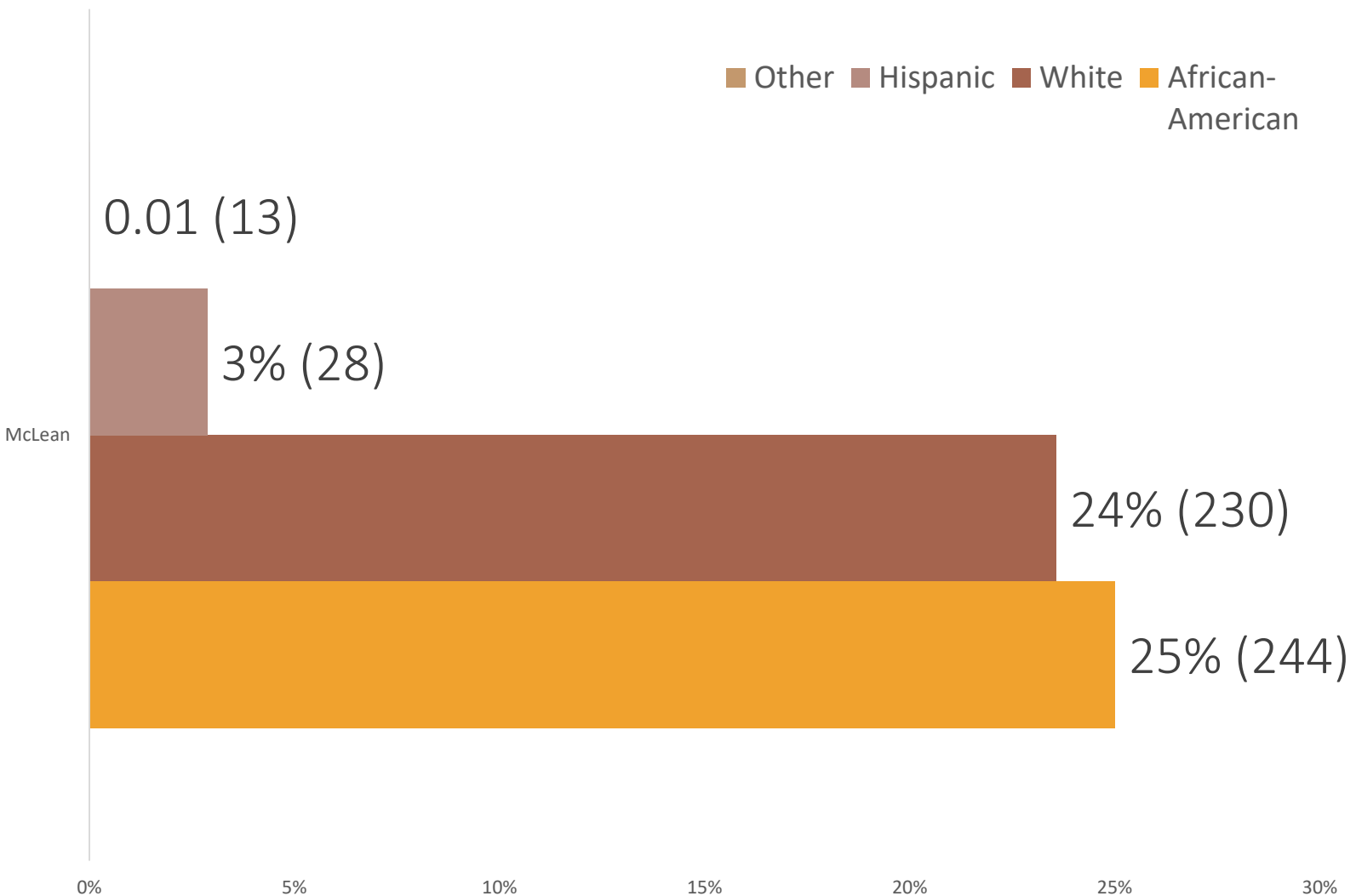
Foster Care Entries by Race/Ethnicity Macon County

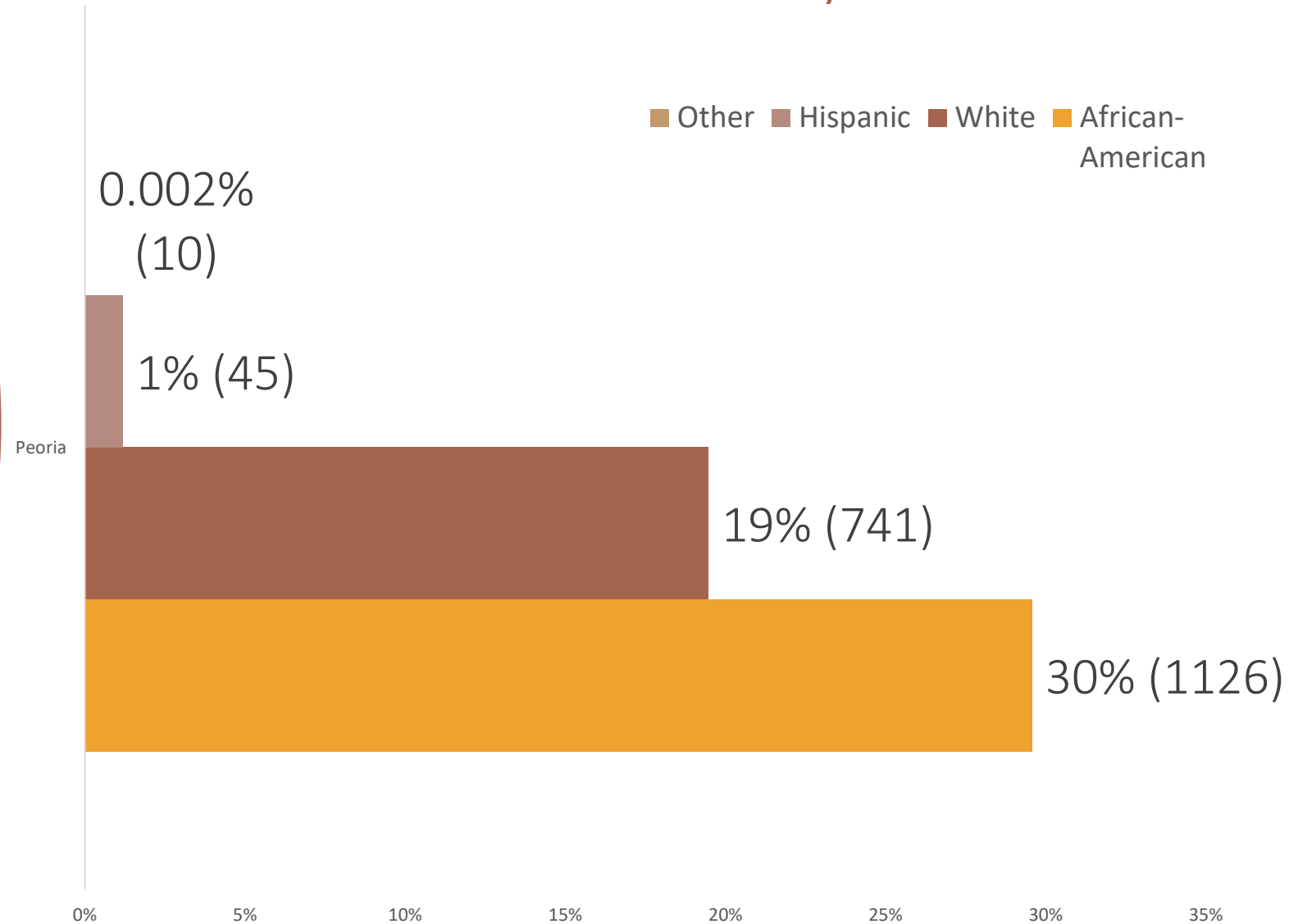

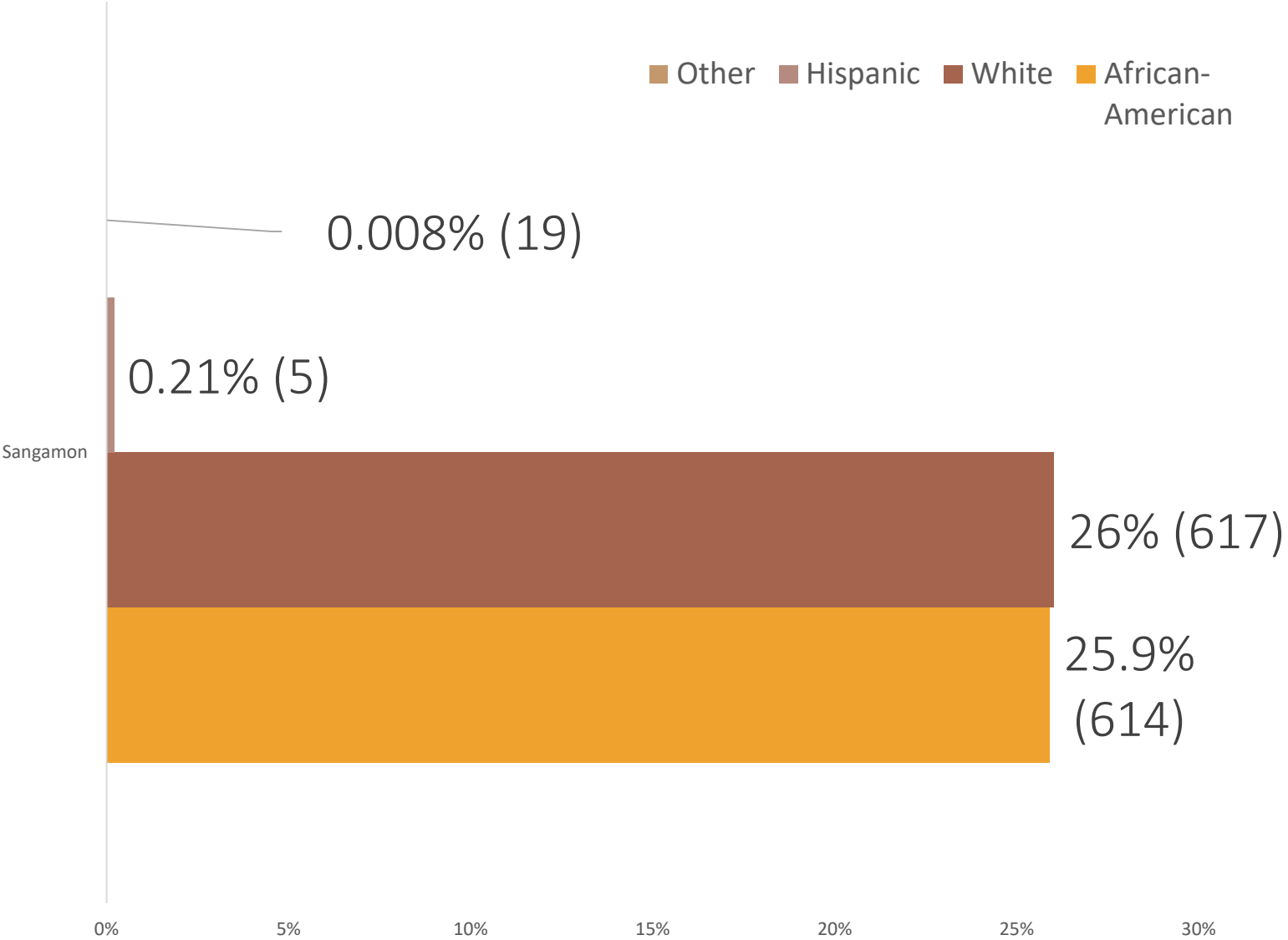

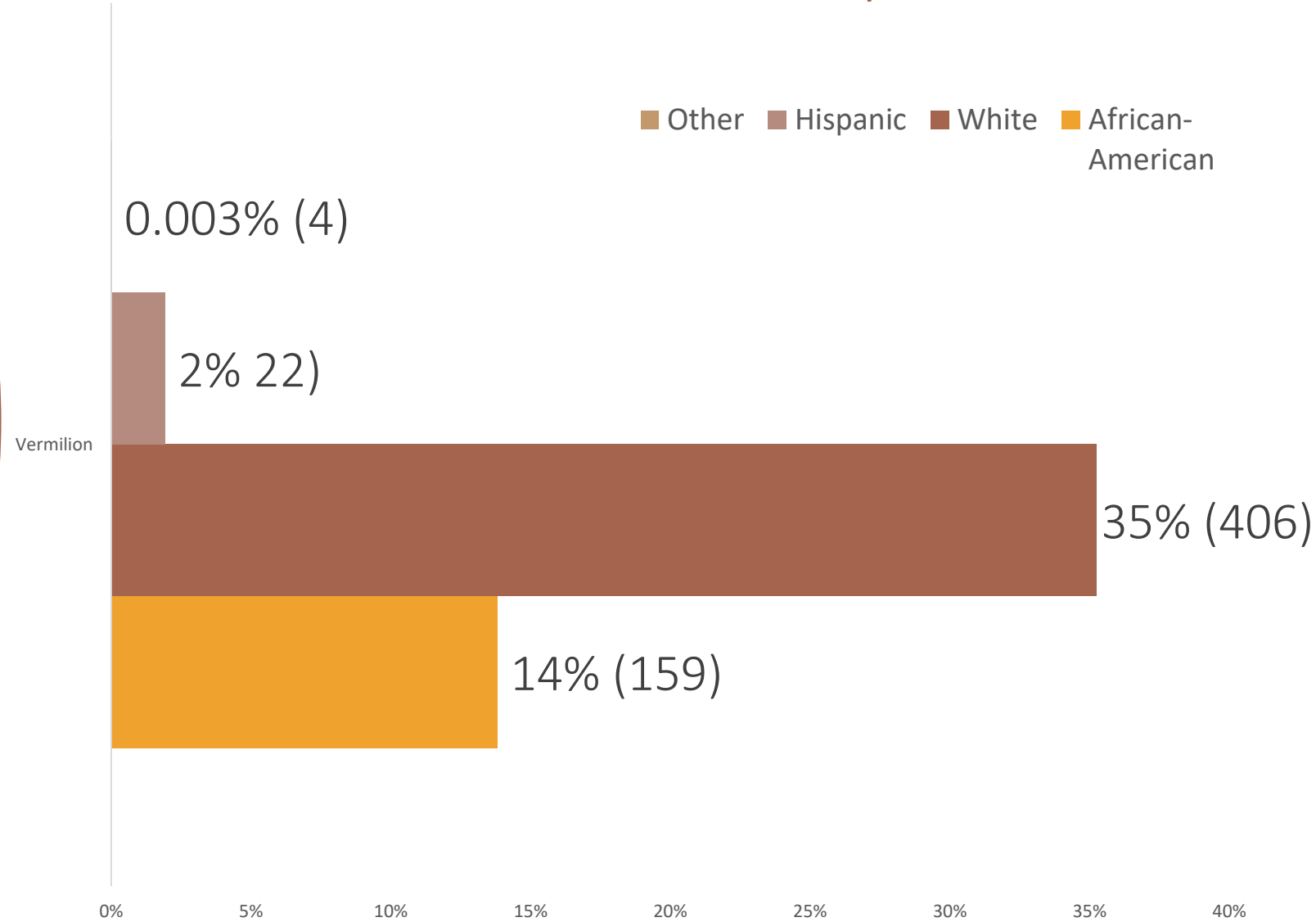

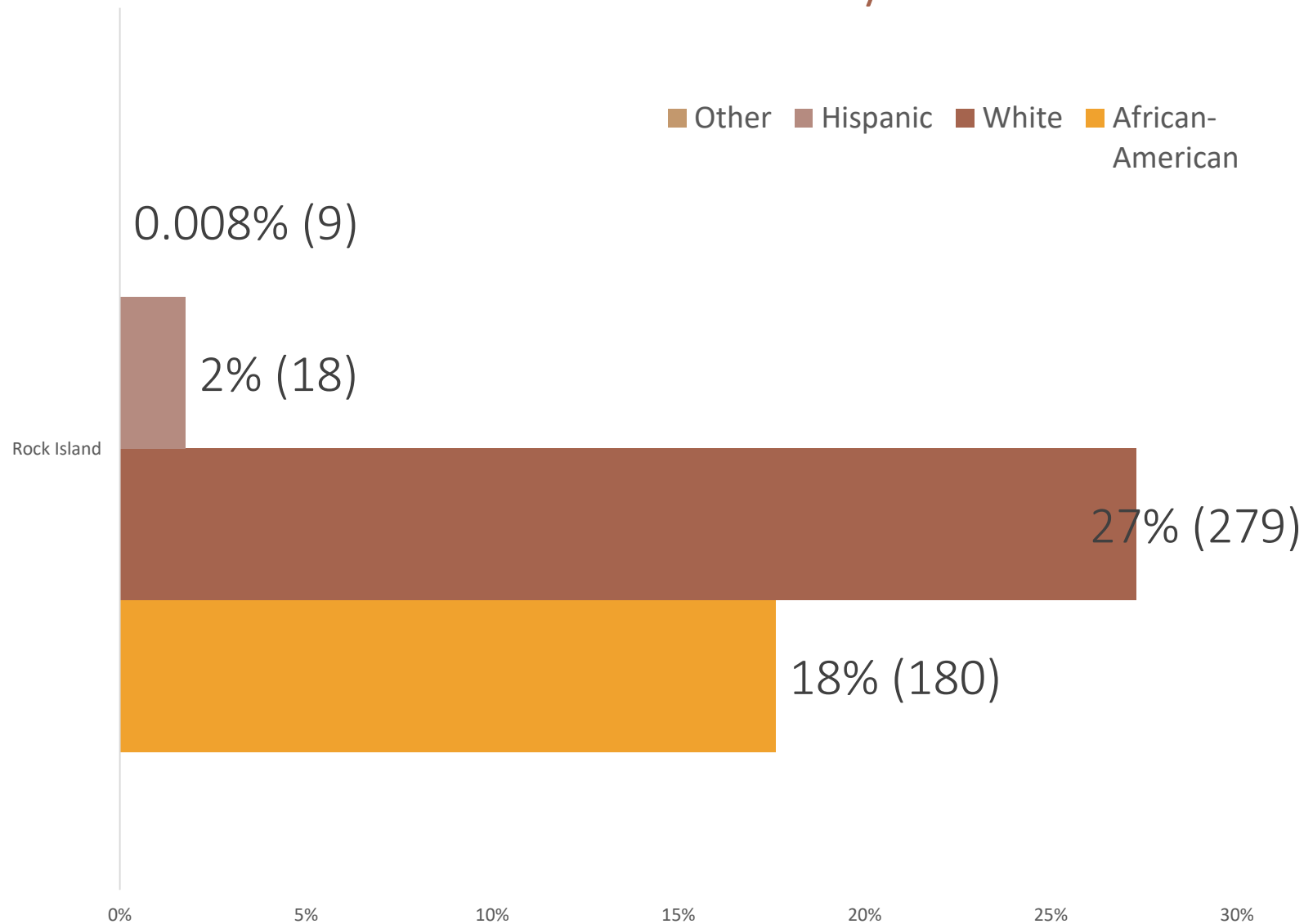

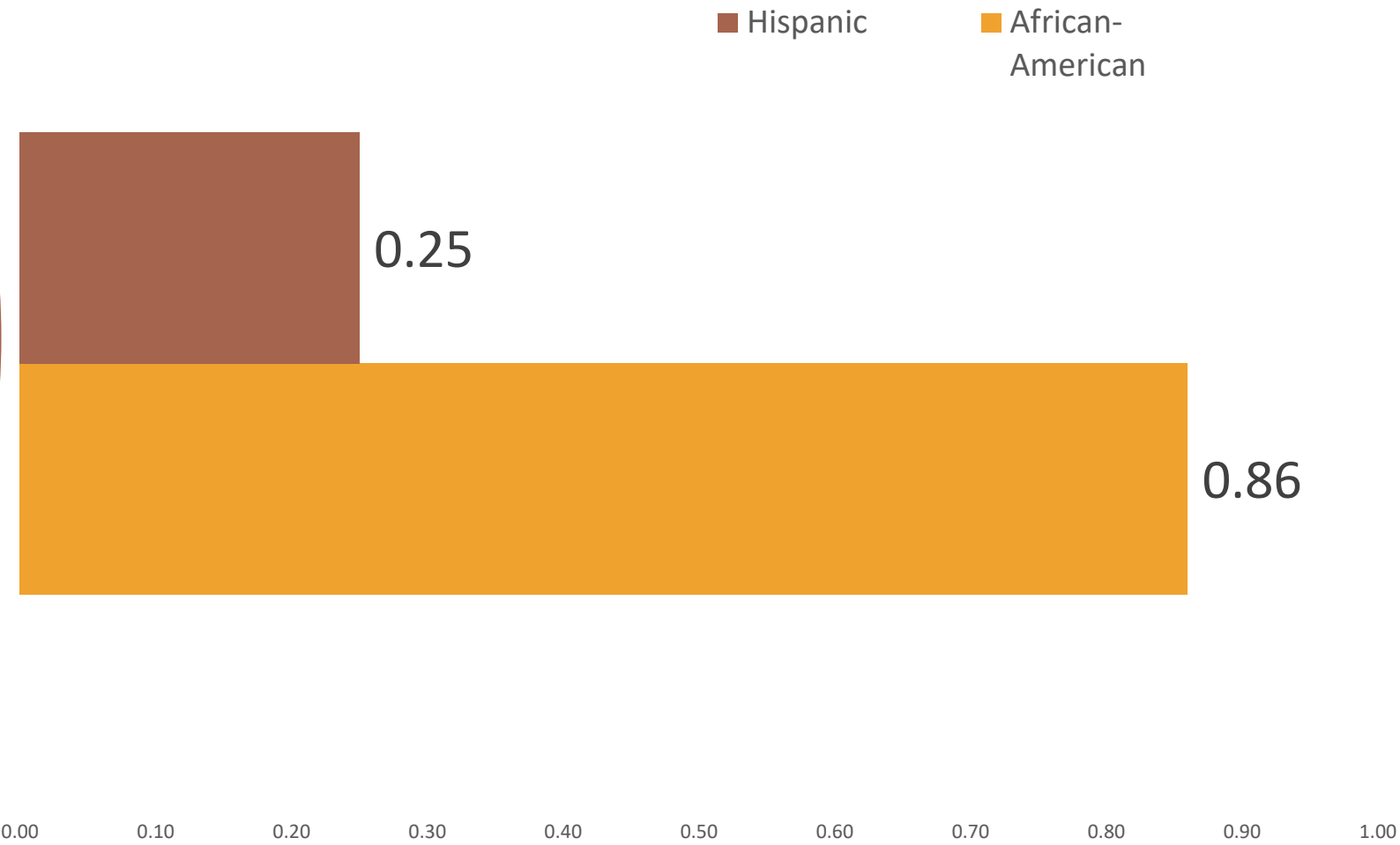

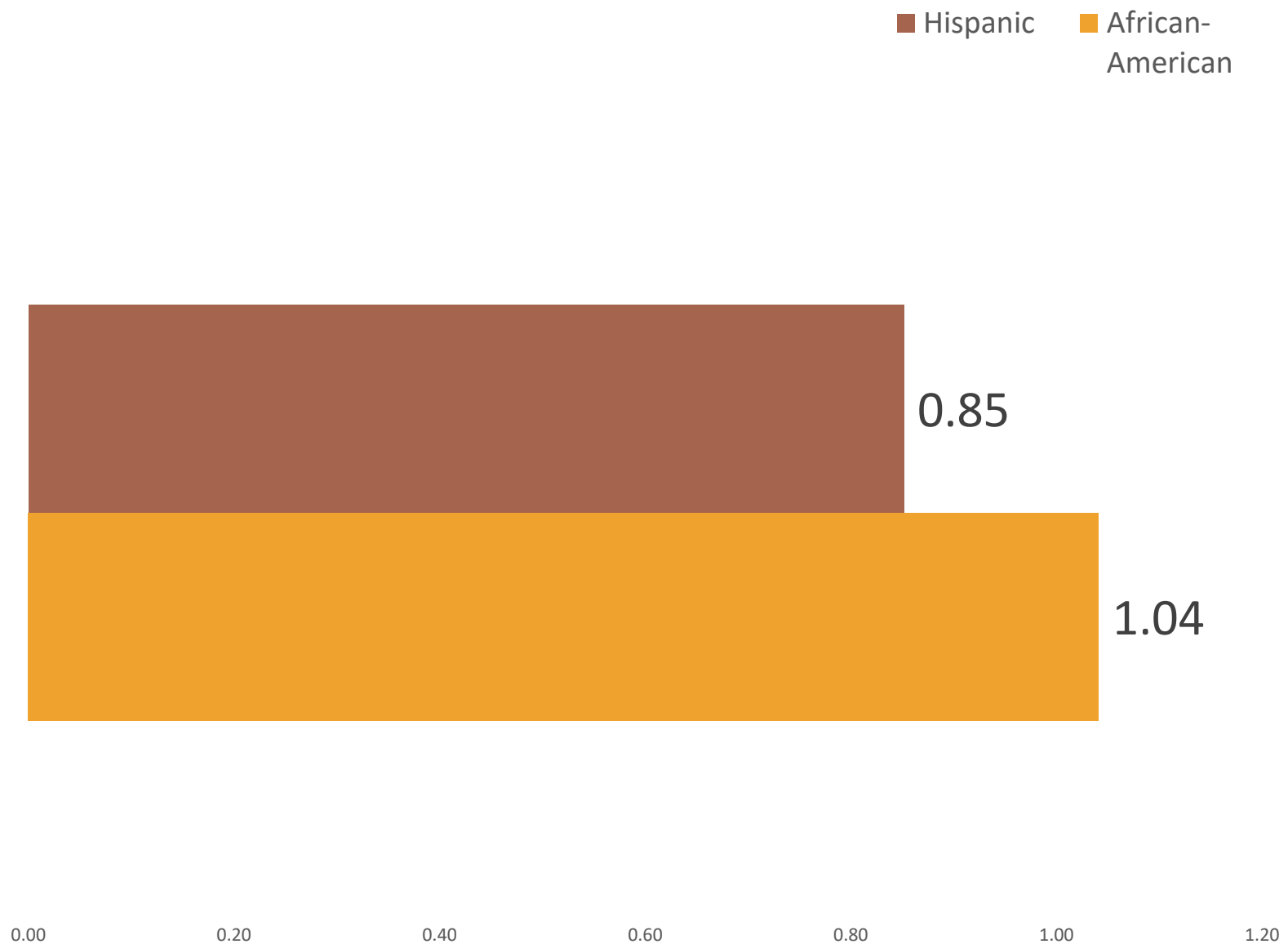

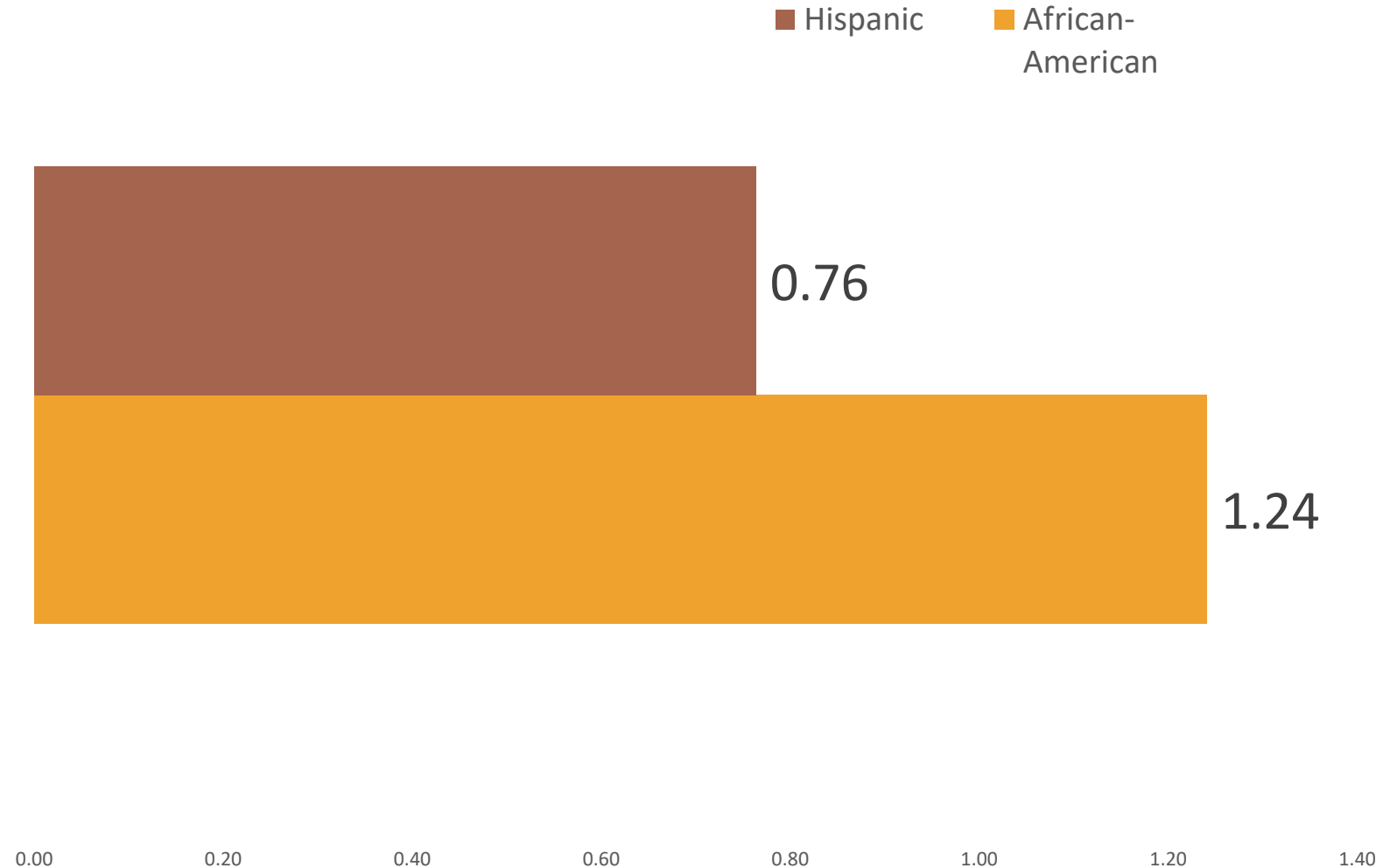

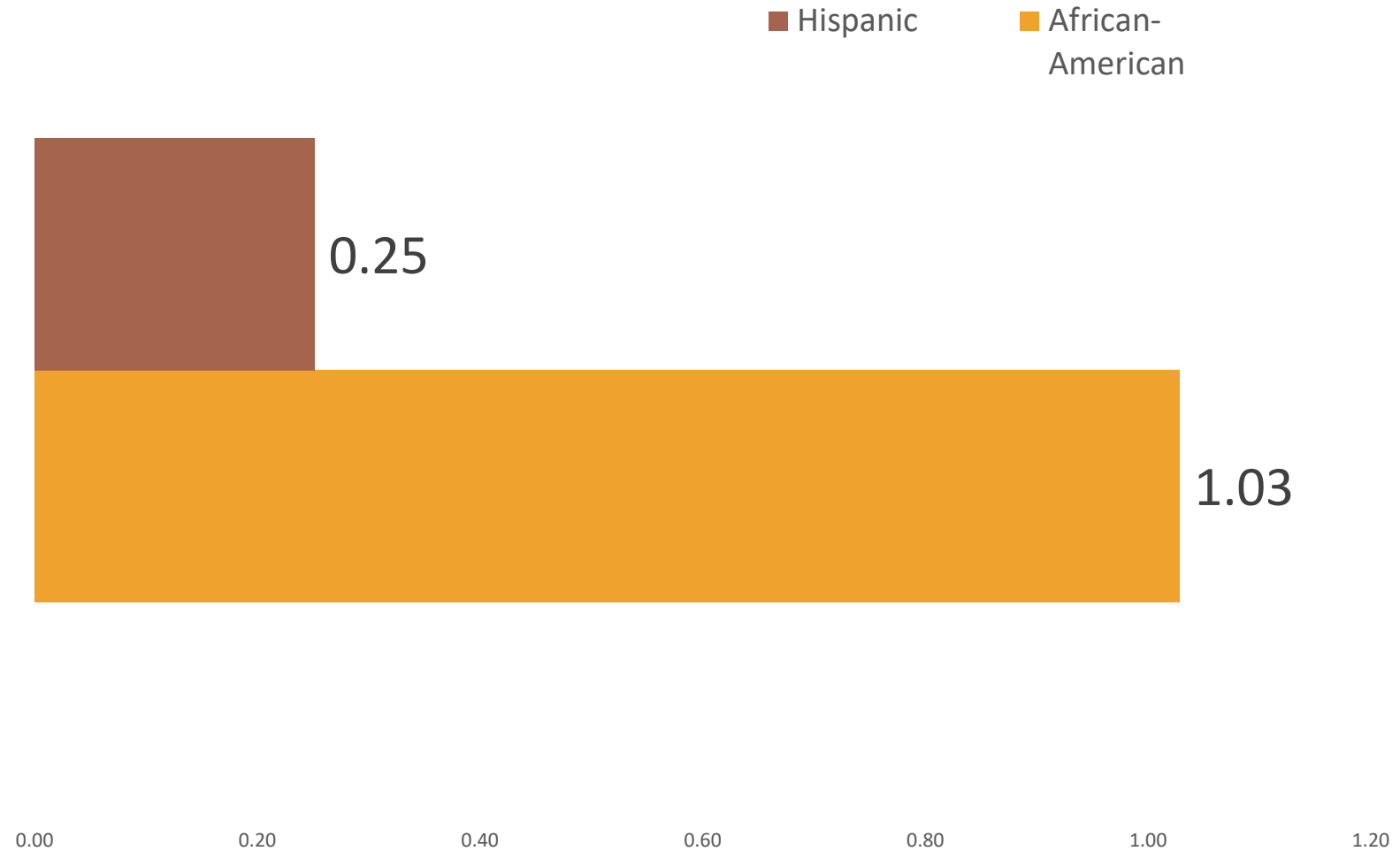

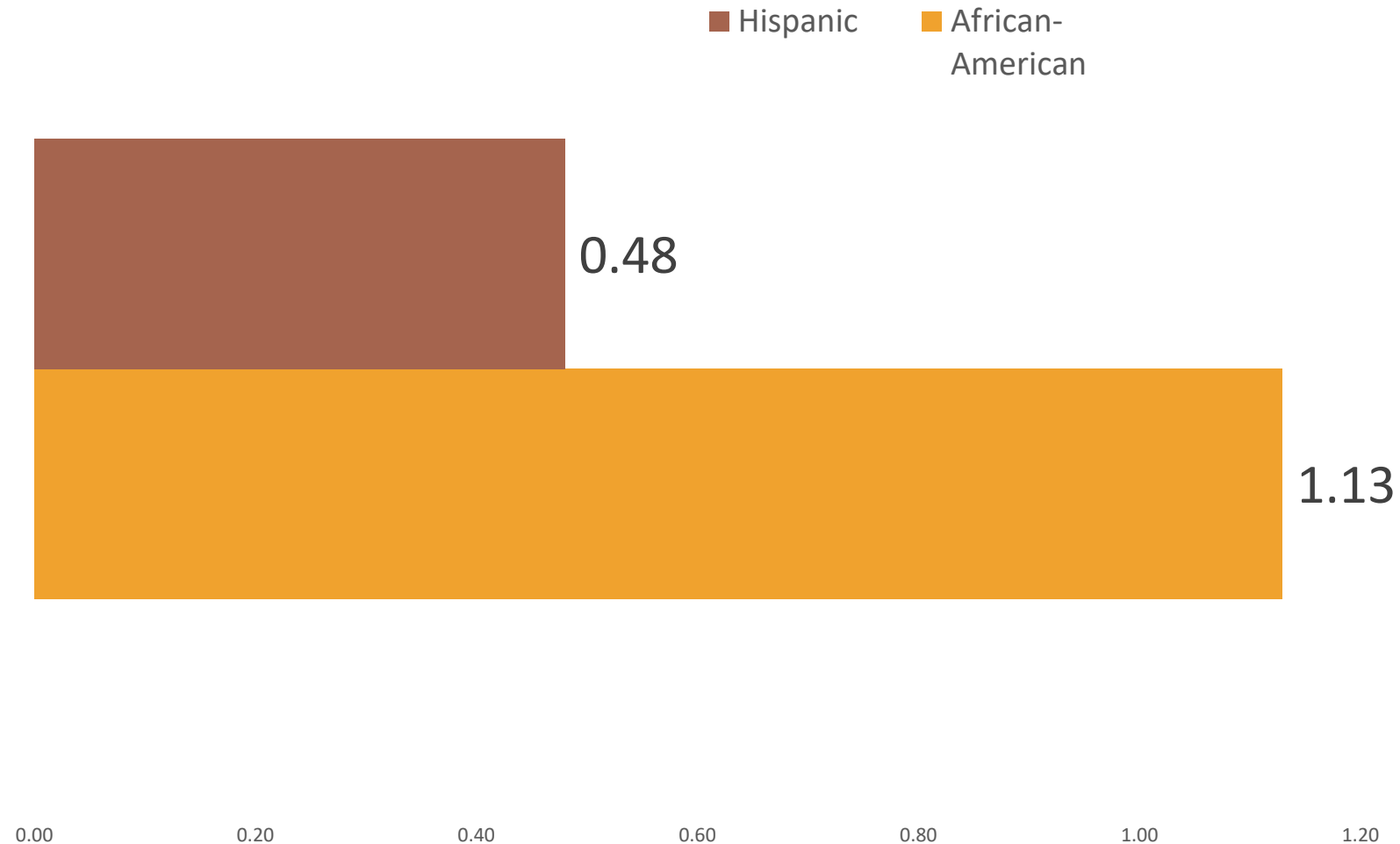

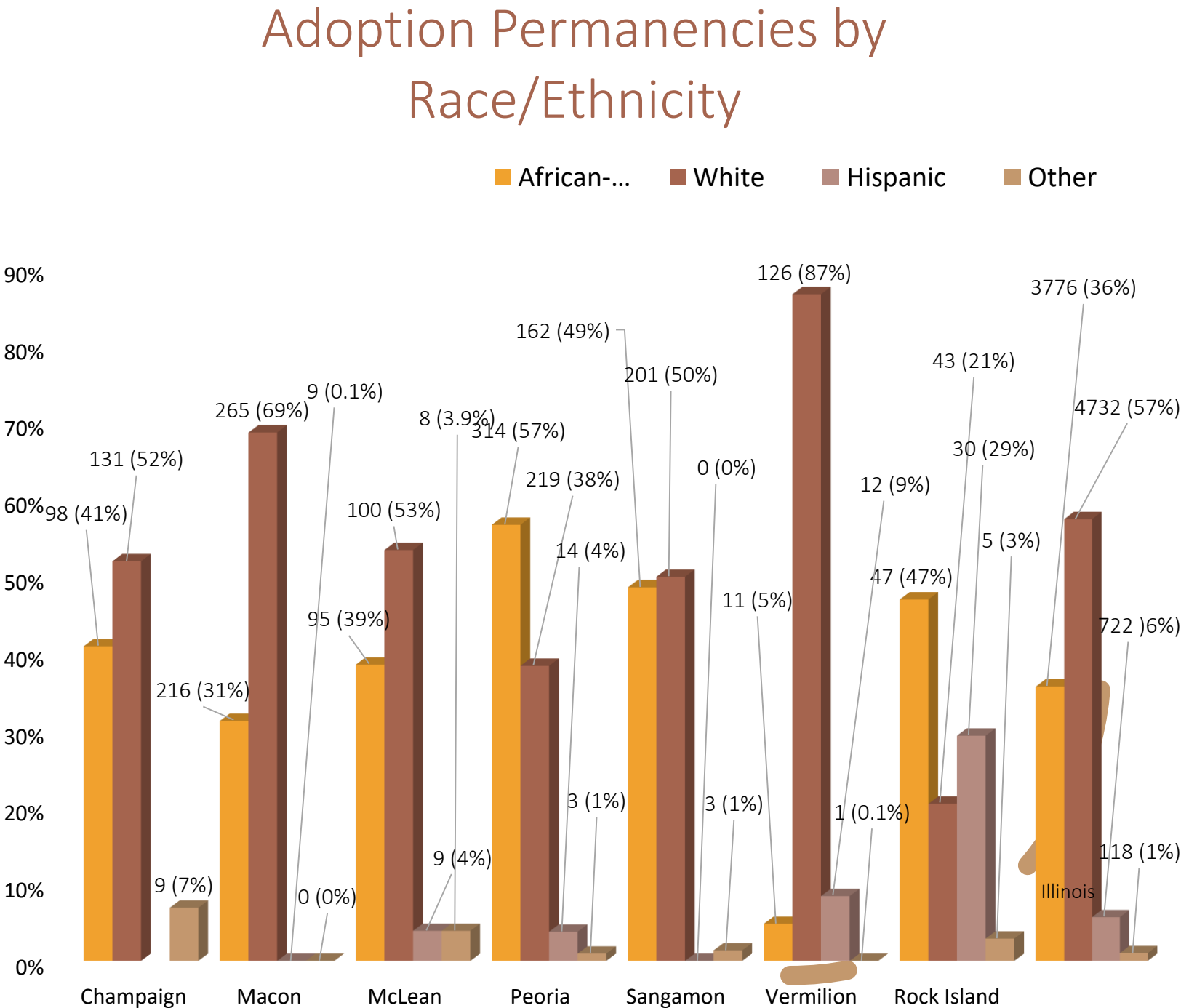

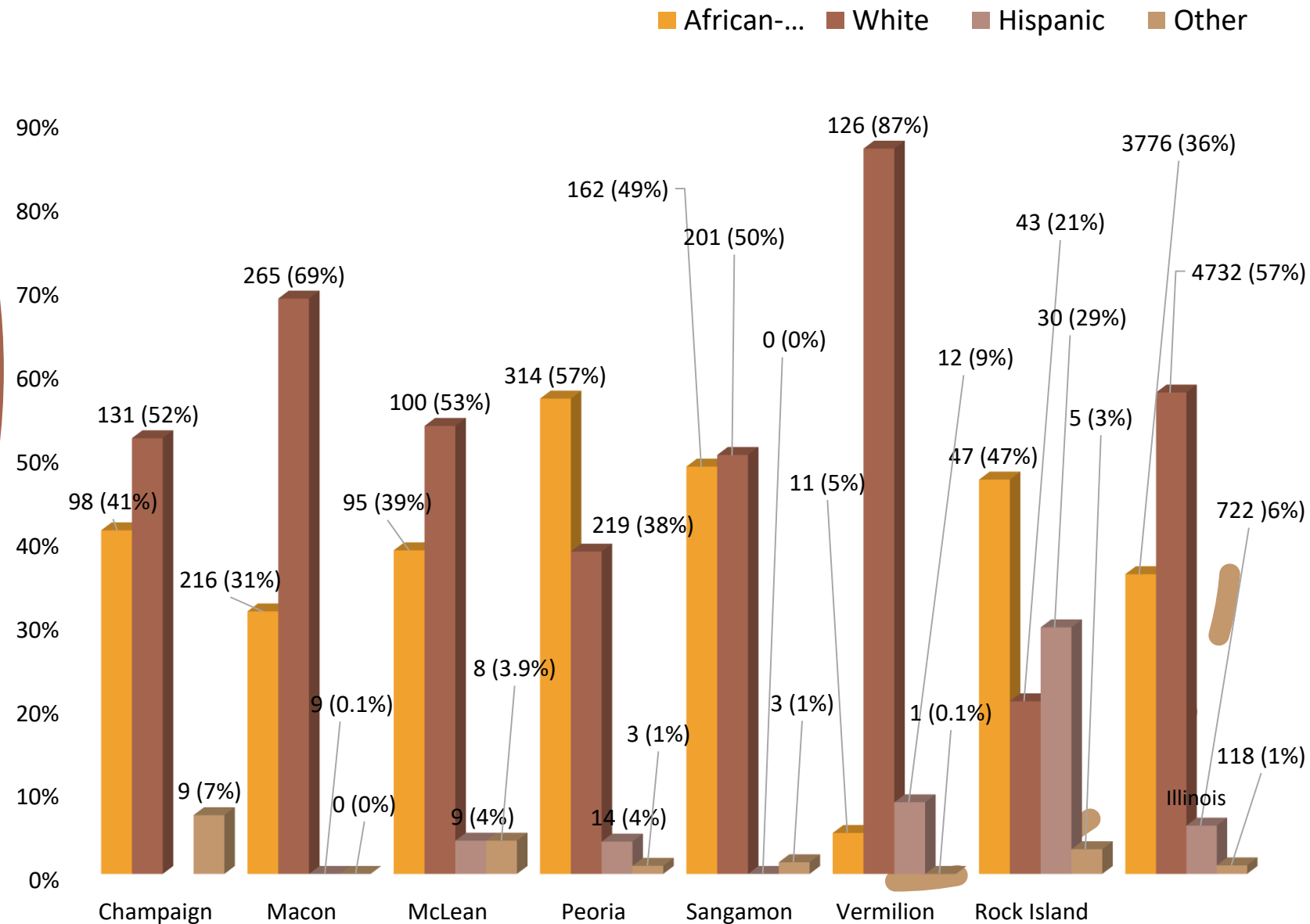


Adoption Permanencies by Race/Ethnicity

Adoption Permanencies by Race/Ethnicity

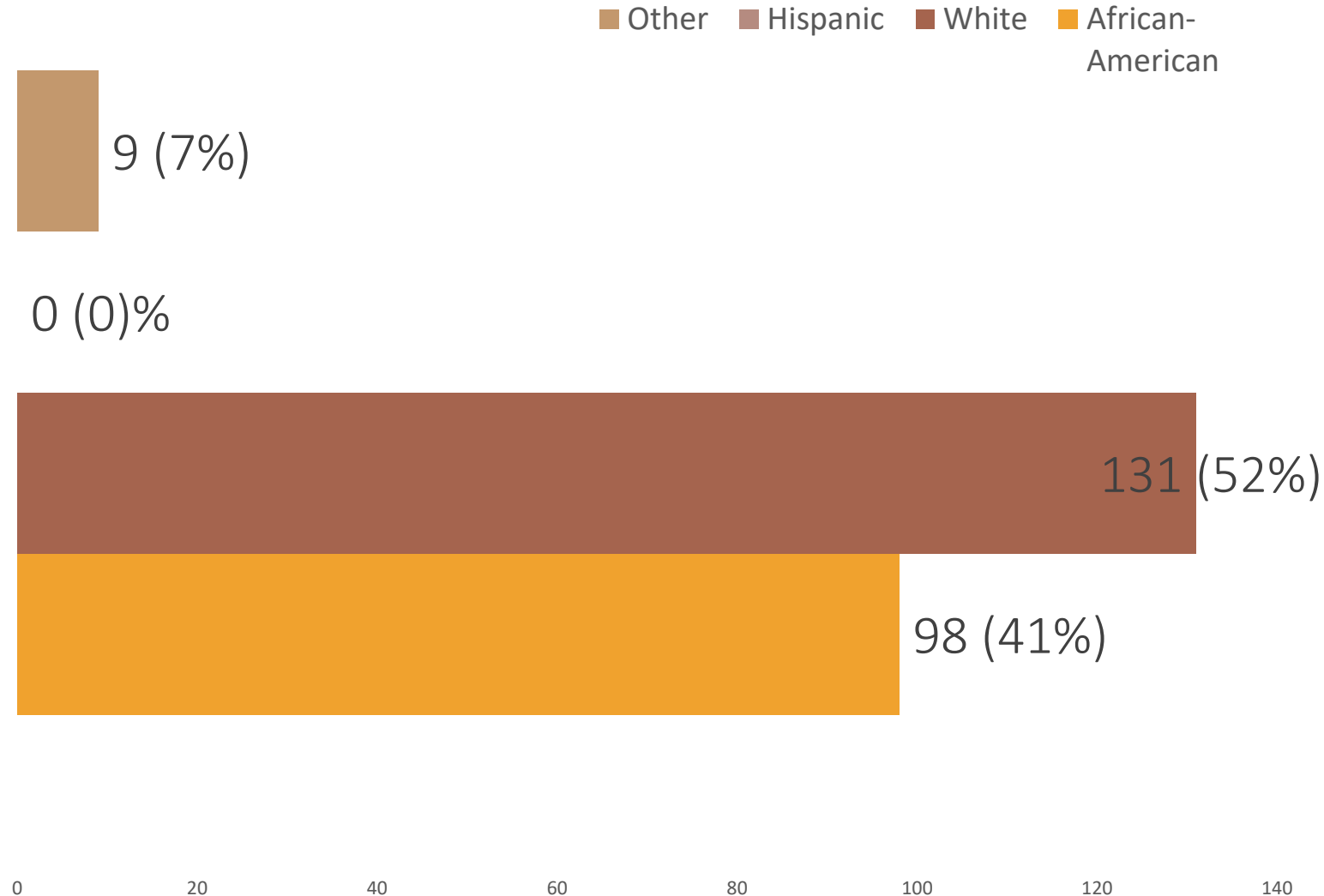


Adoption Permanencies by Race/Ethnicity Champaign County

Adoption Permanencies by Race/Ethnicity Champaign County

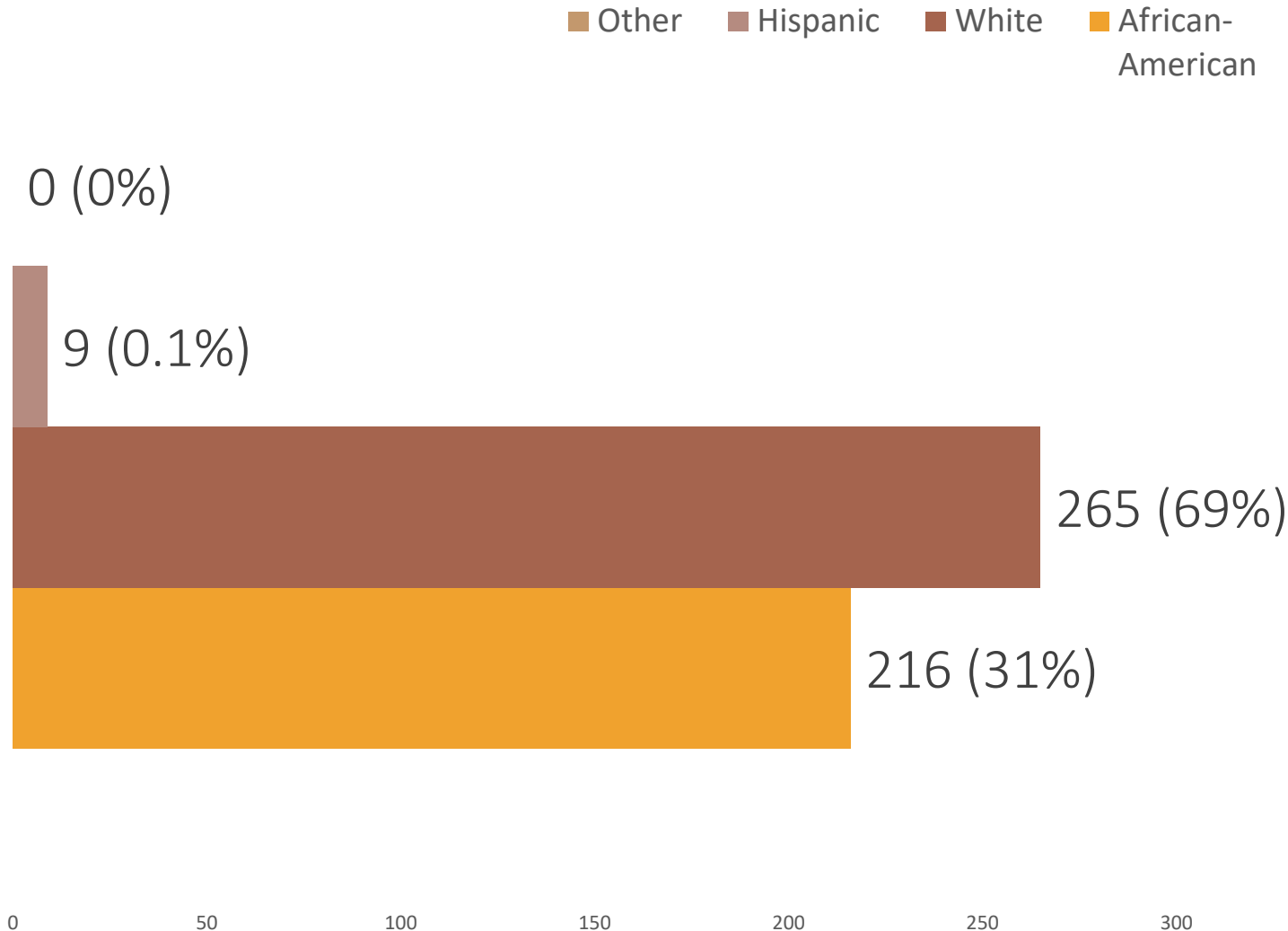


Adoption Permanencies by Race/Ethnicity Macon County

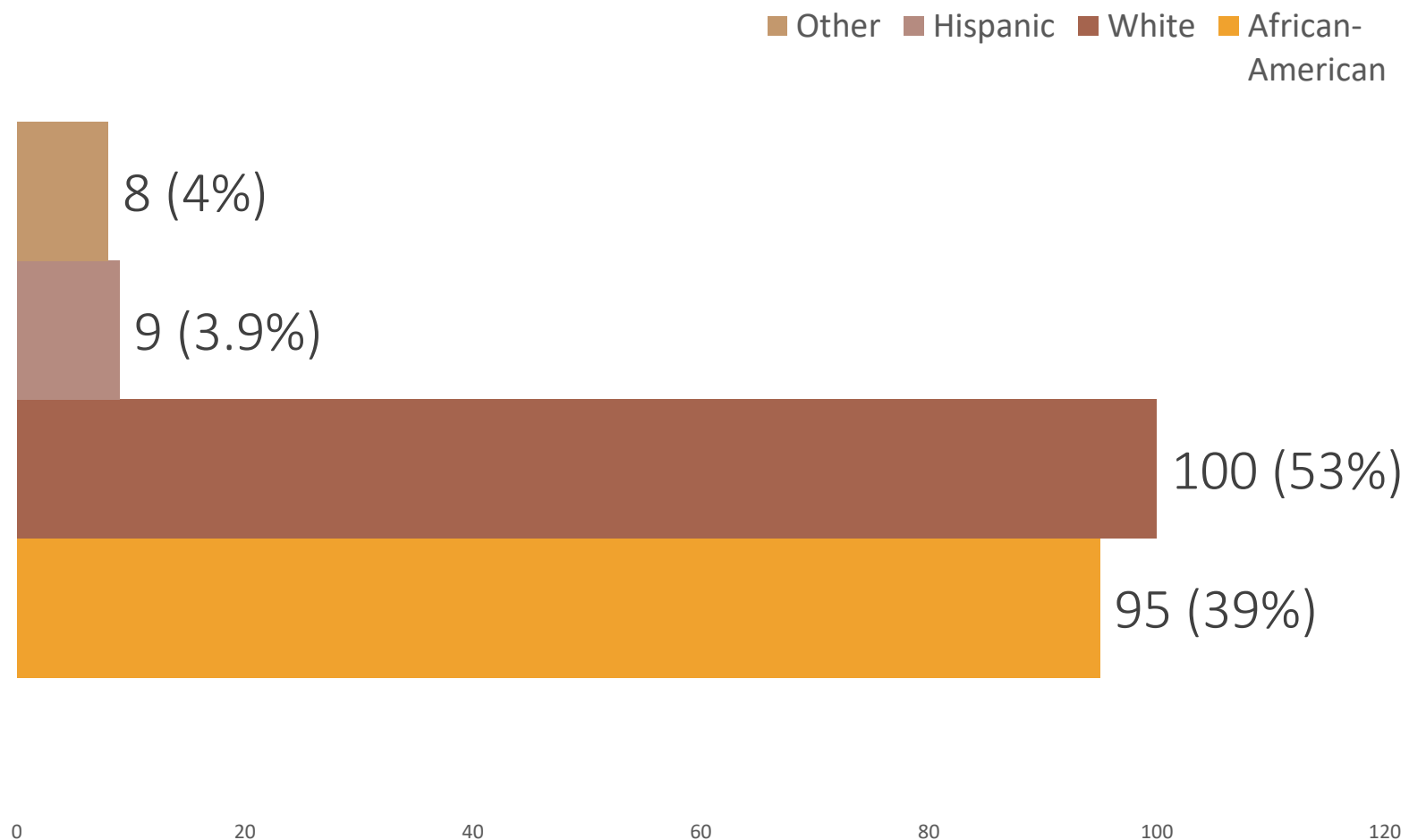


Adoption Permanencies by Race/Ethnicity McLean County

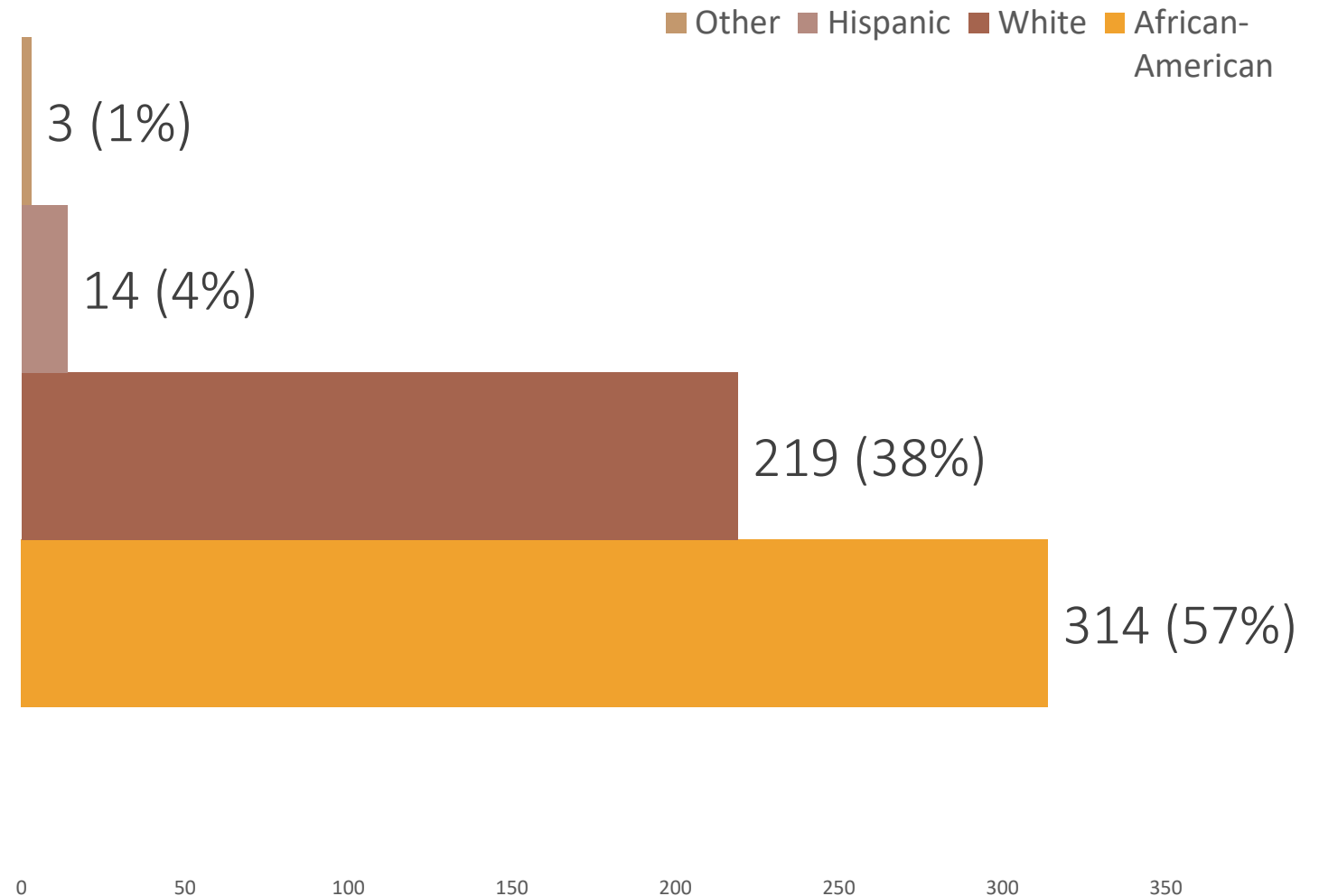


Adoption Permanencies by Race/Ethnicity Peoria County

Adoption Permanencies by Race/Ethnicity Peoria County

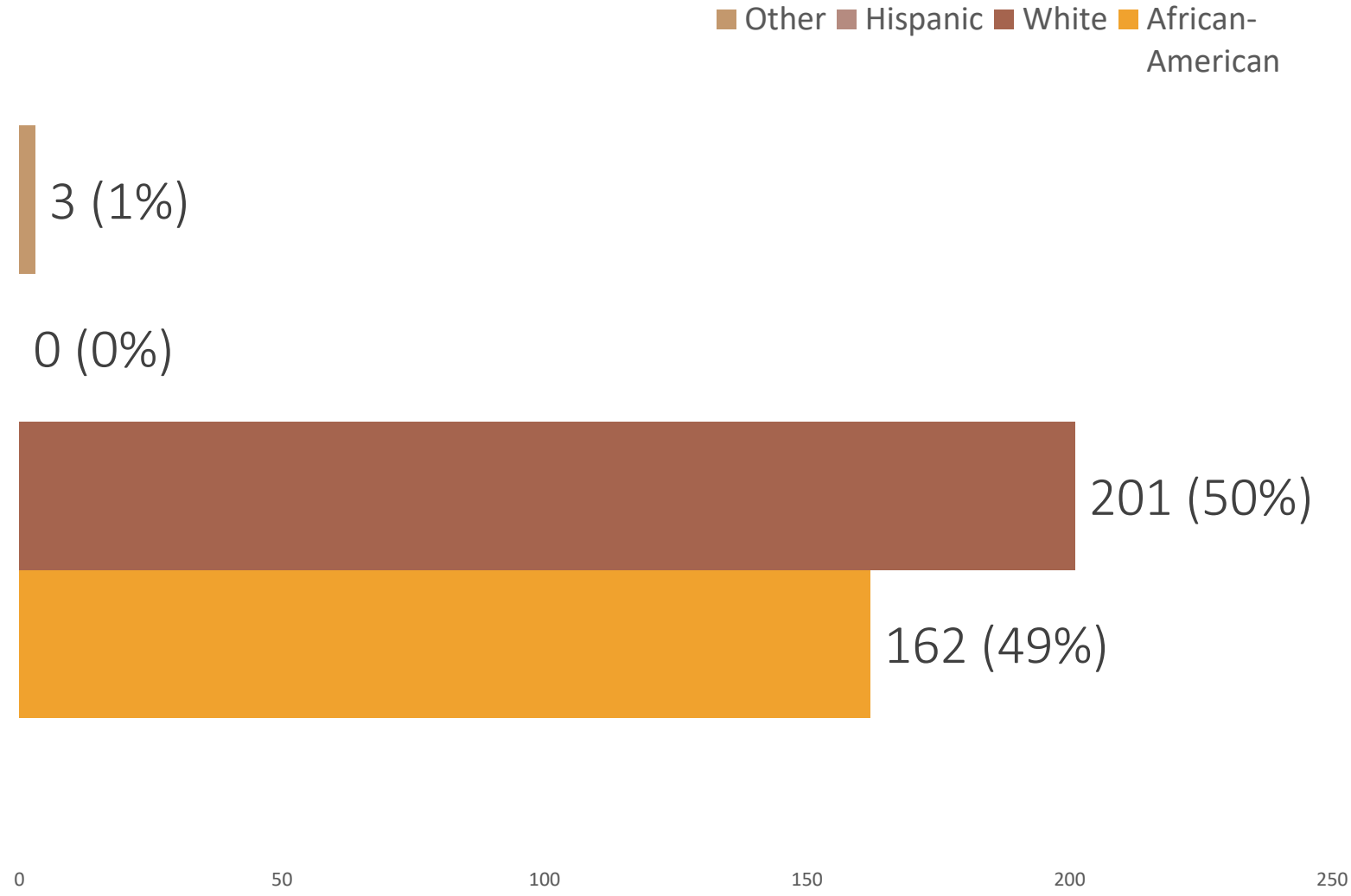


Adoption Permanencies by Race/Ethnicity Sangamon County

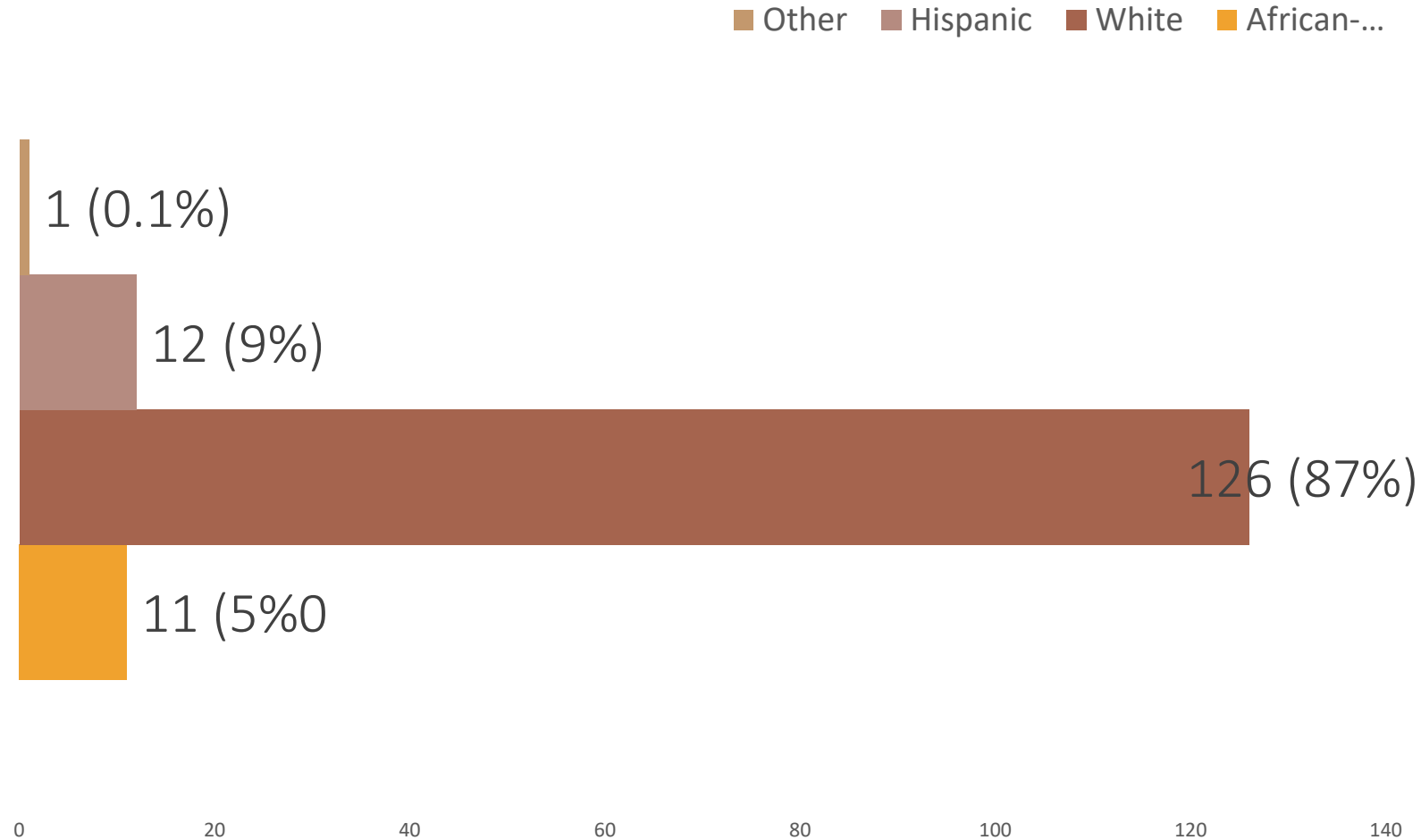


Adoption Permanencies by Race/Ethnicity Vermilion County

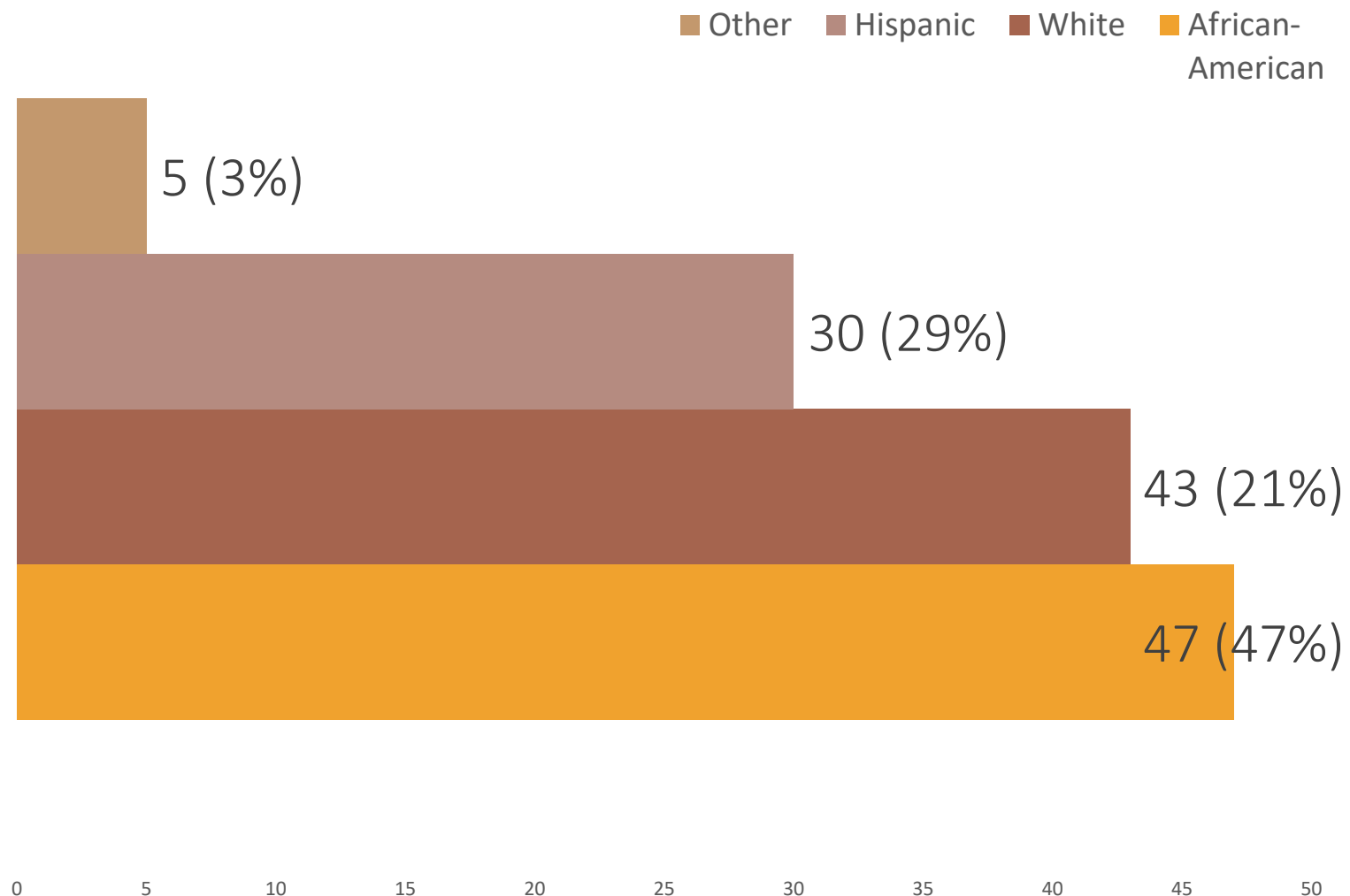


Adoption Permanencies by Race/Ethnicity Rock Island County

Adoption Permanencies by Race/Ethnicity Rock Island County

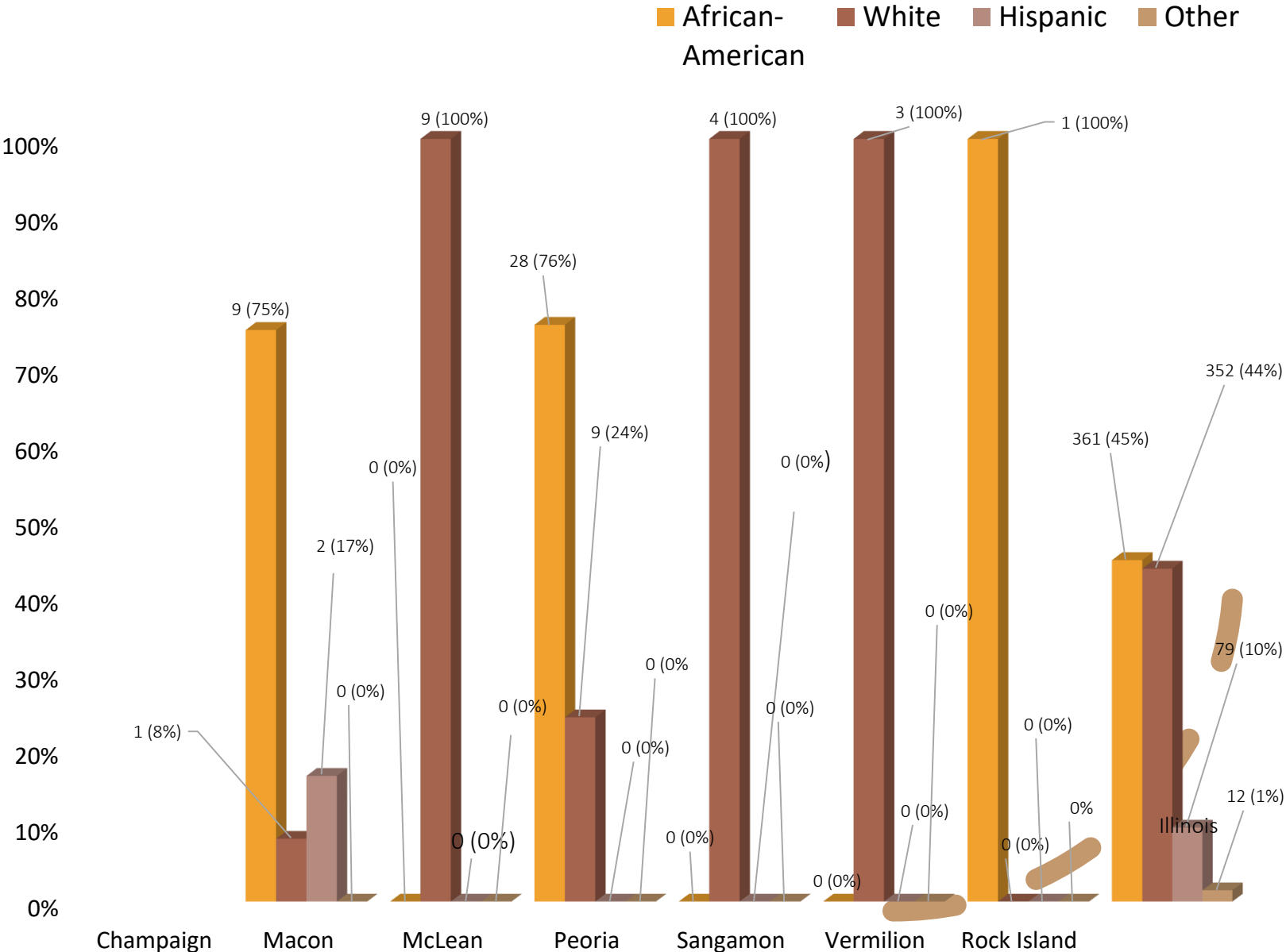


Guardianship Permanencies by Race/Ethnicity

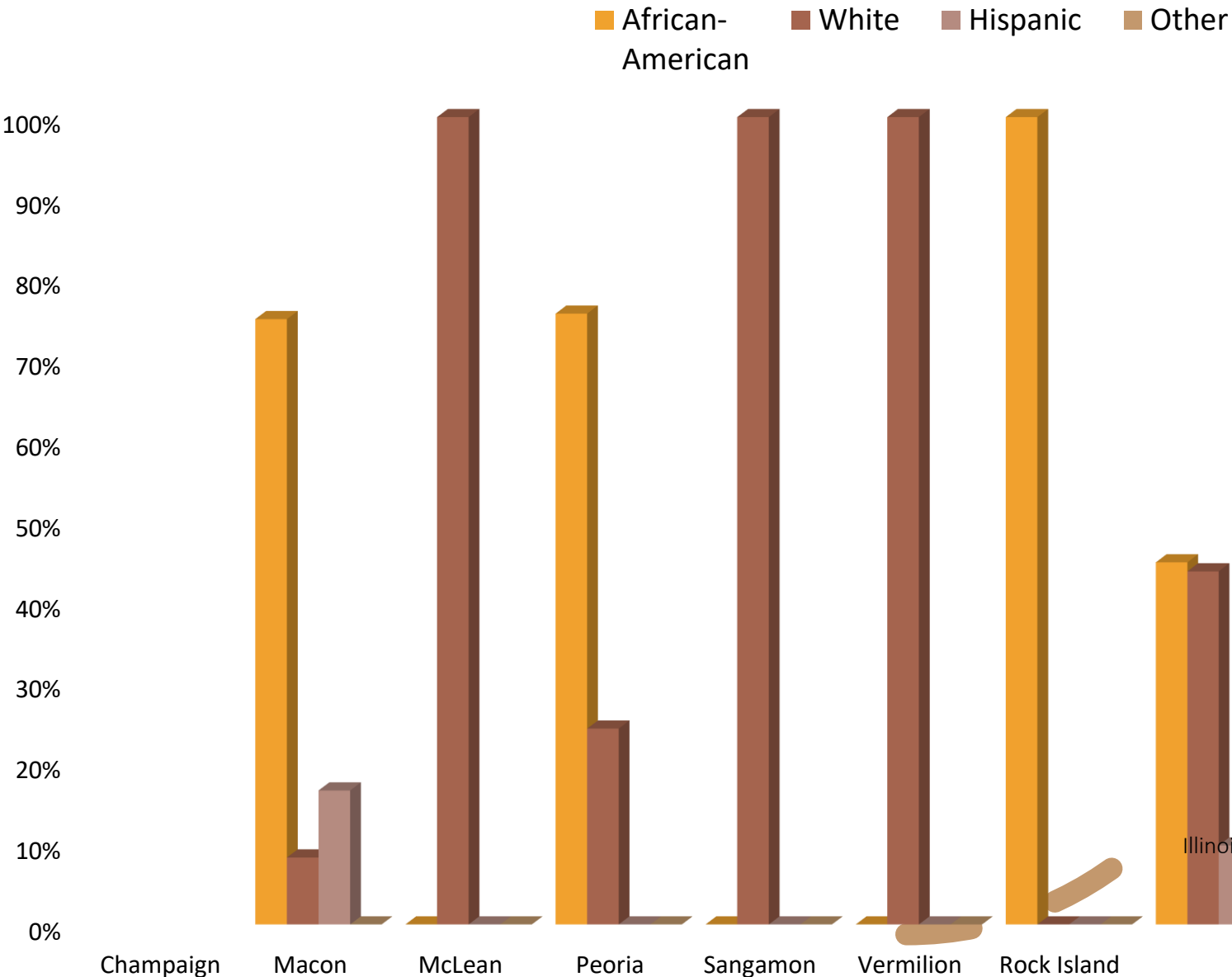


Guardianship Permanencies by Race/Ethnicity

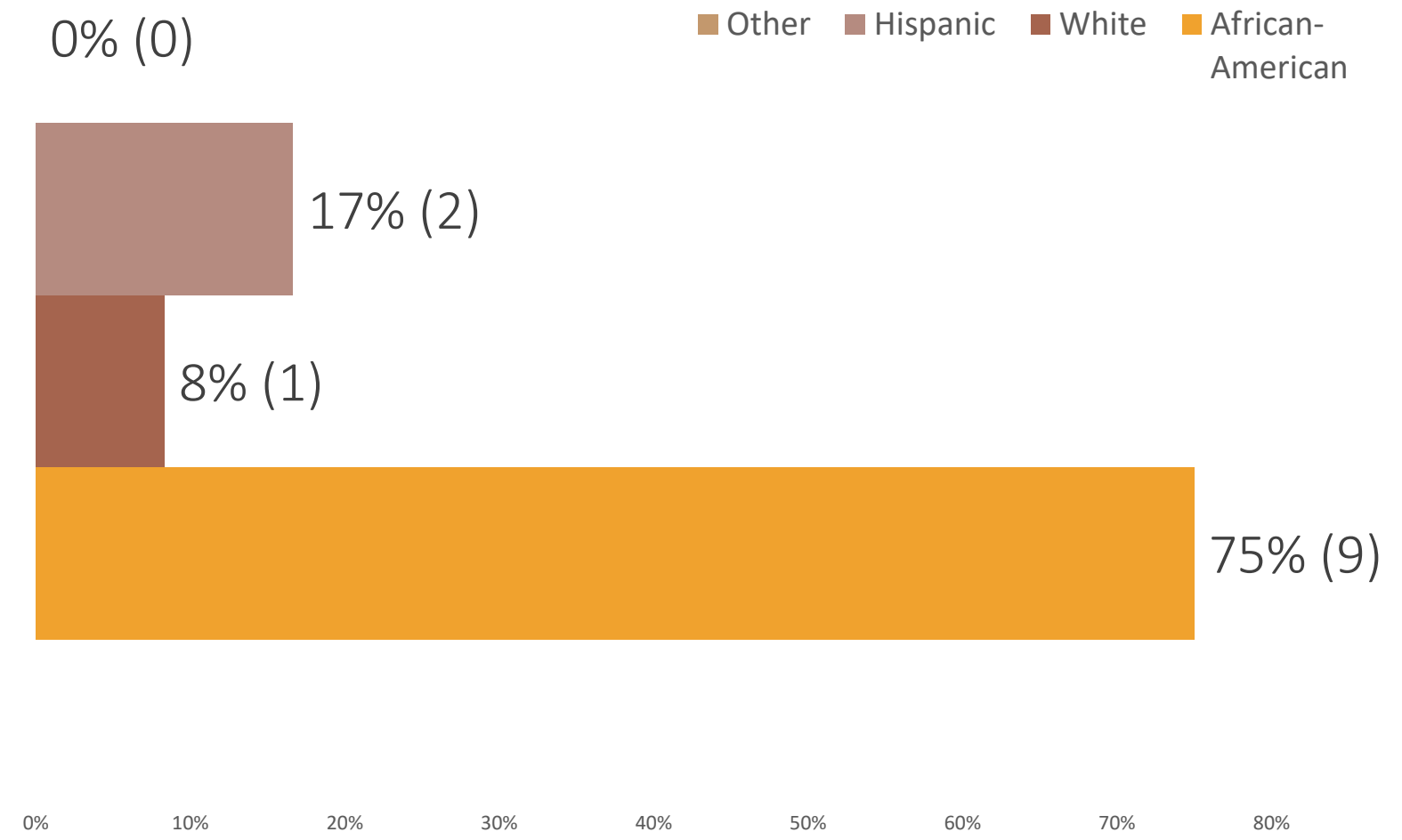


Guardianship Permanencies by Race/Ethnicity Macon County

Guardianship Permanencies by Race/Ethnicity Macon County

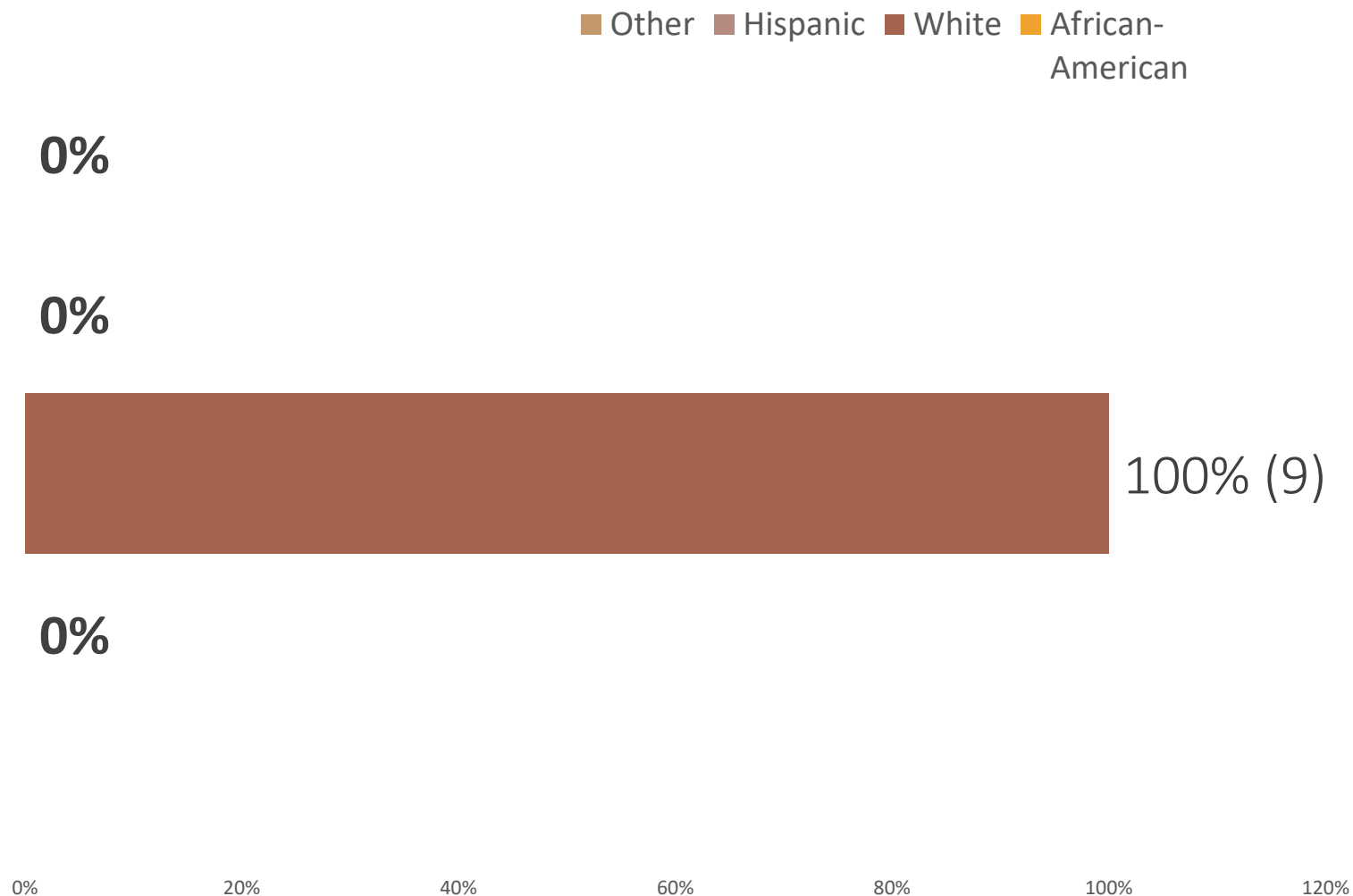


Guardianship Permanencies by Race/Ethnicity McLean County

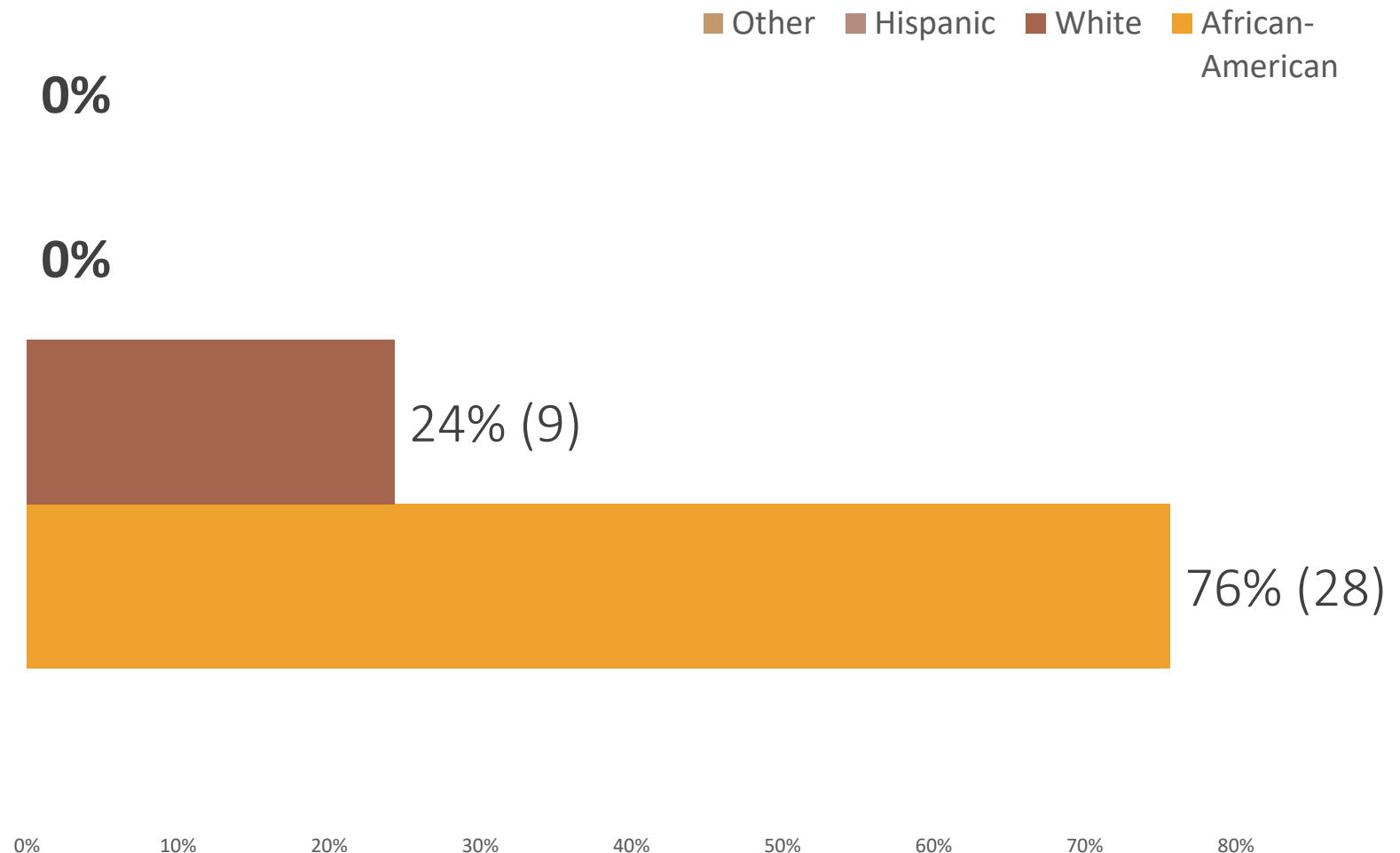


Guardianship Permanencies by Race/Ethnicity Peoria County

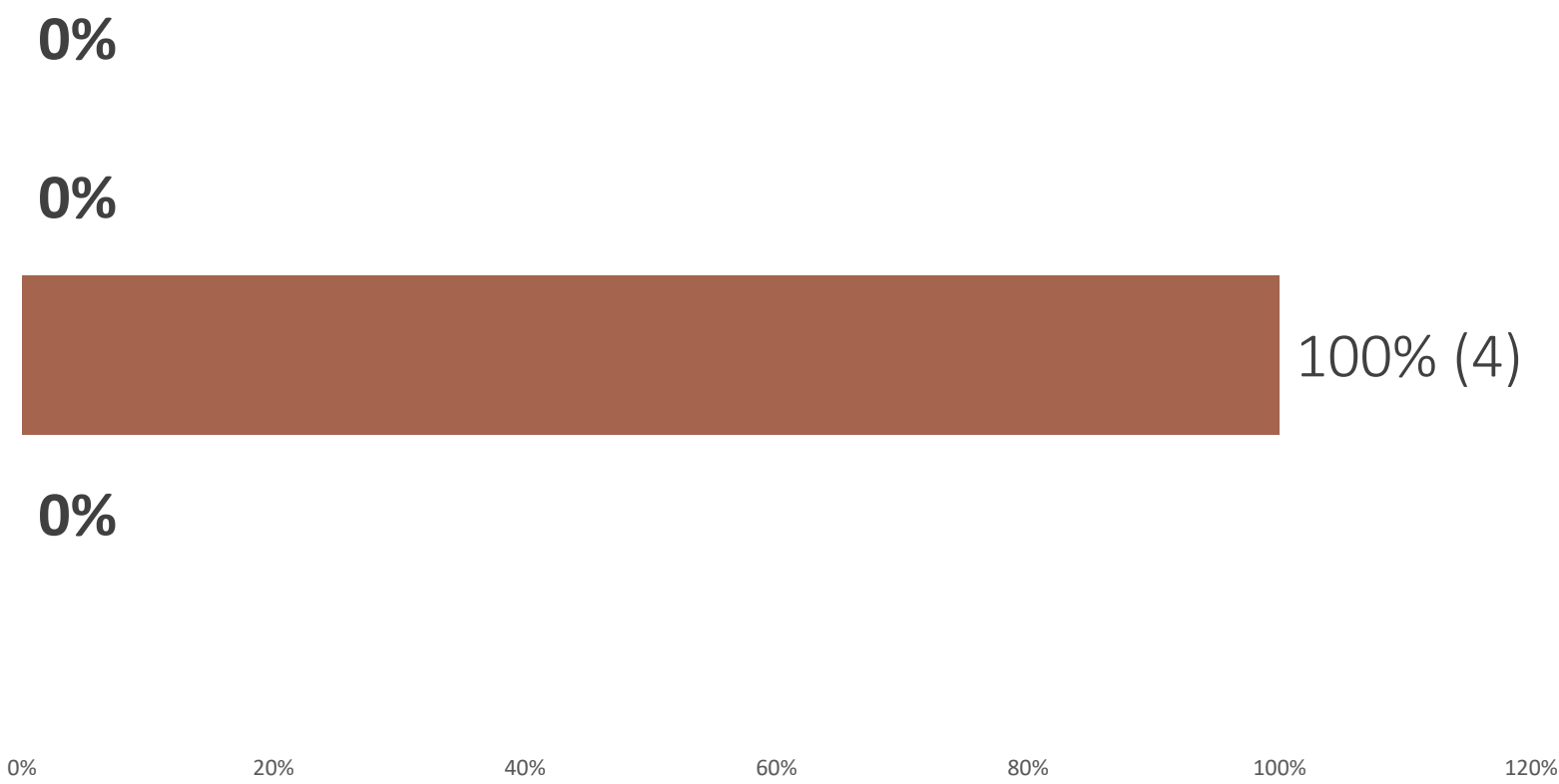

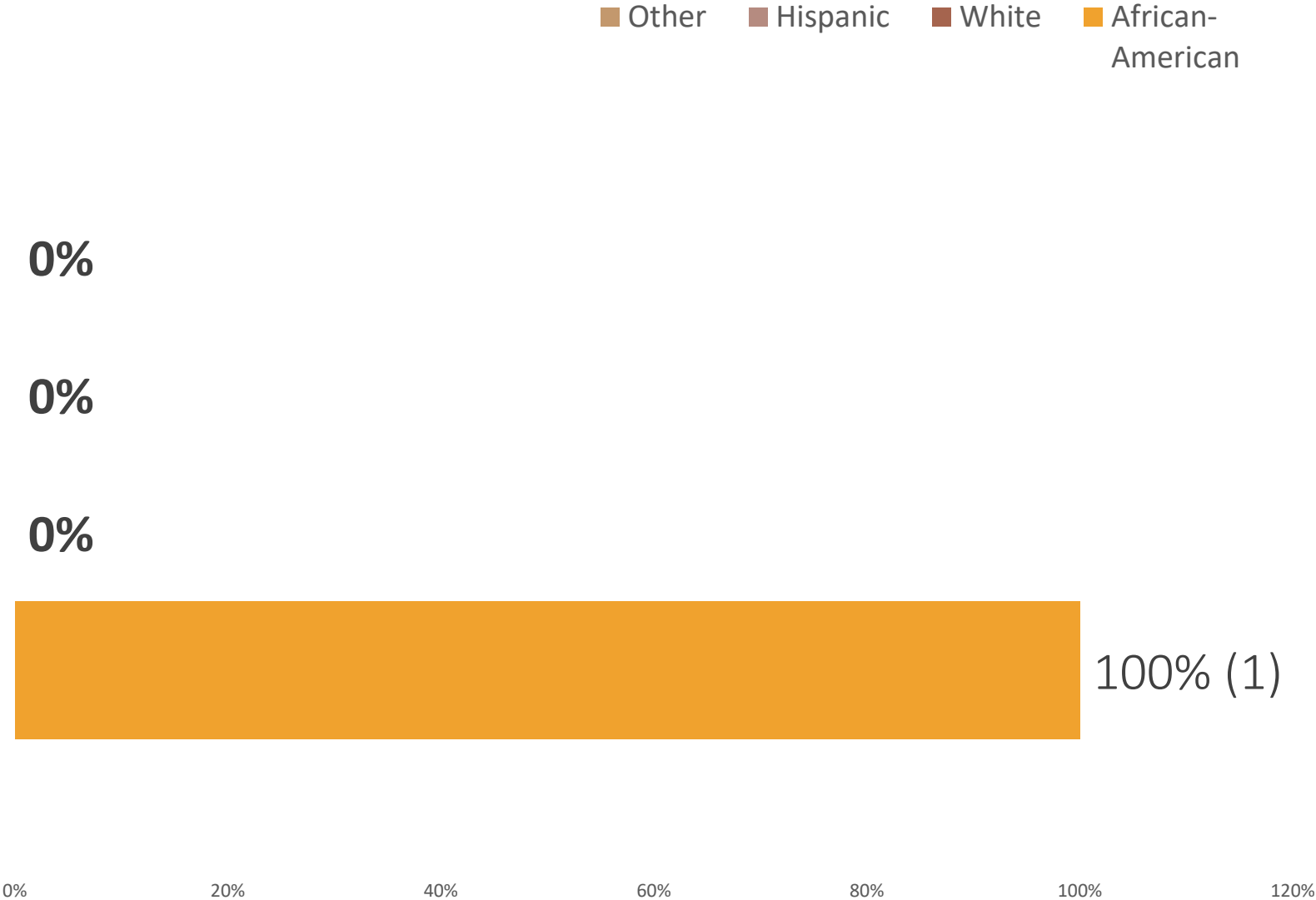

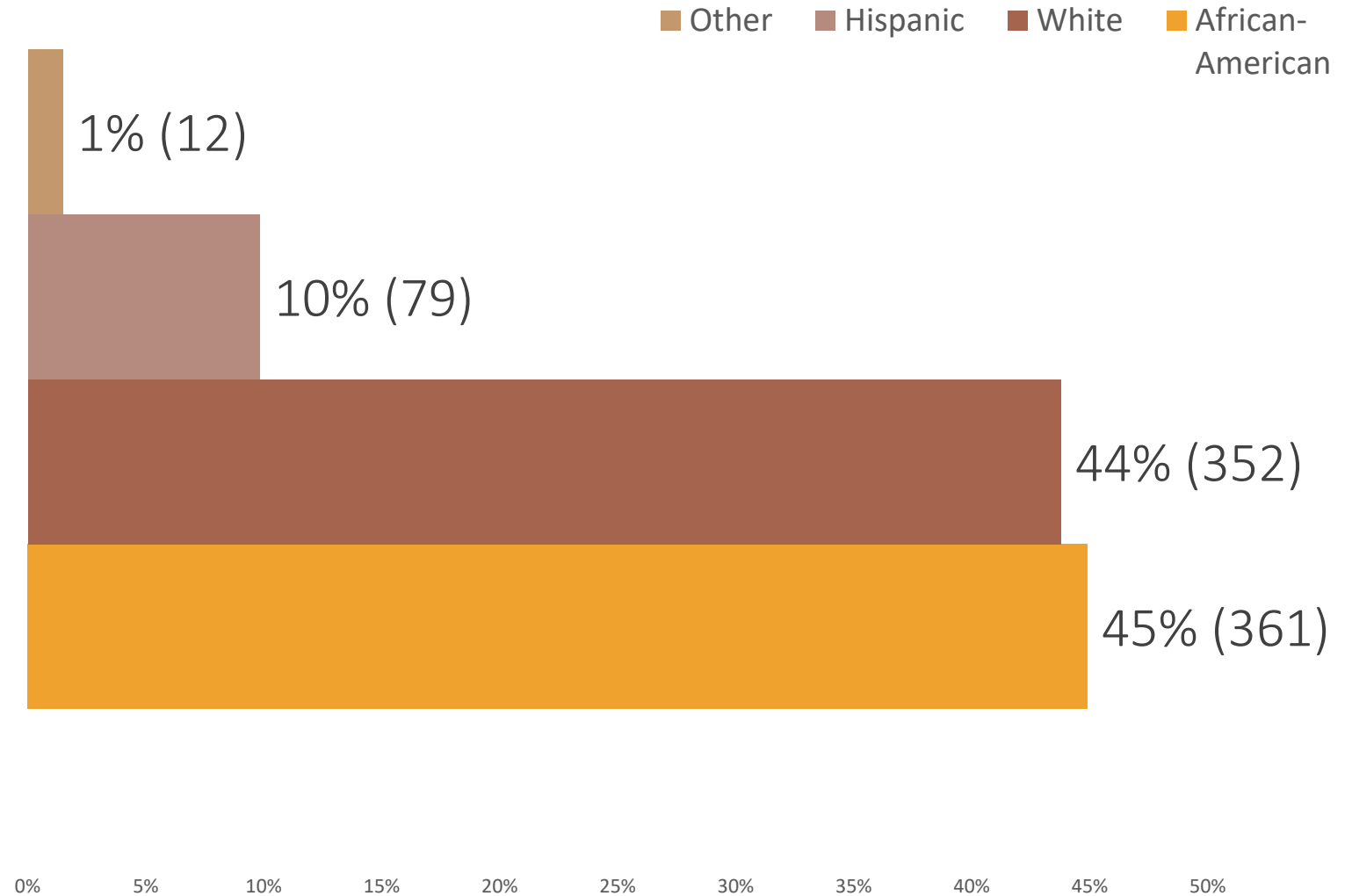


IL Statewide Permanencies by Race/Ethnicity

Permanencies by Race/Ethnicity Illinois State

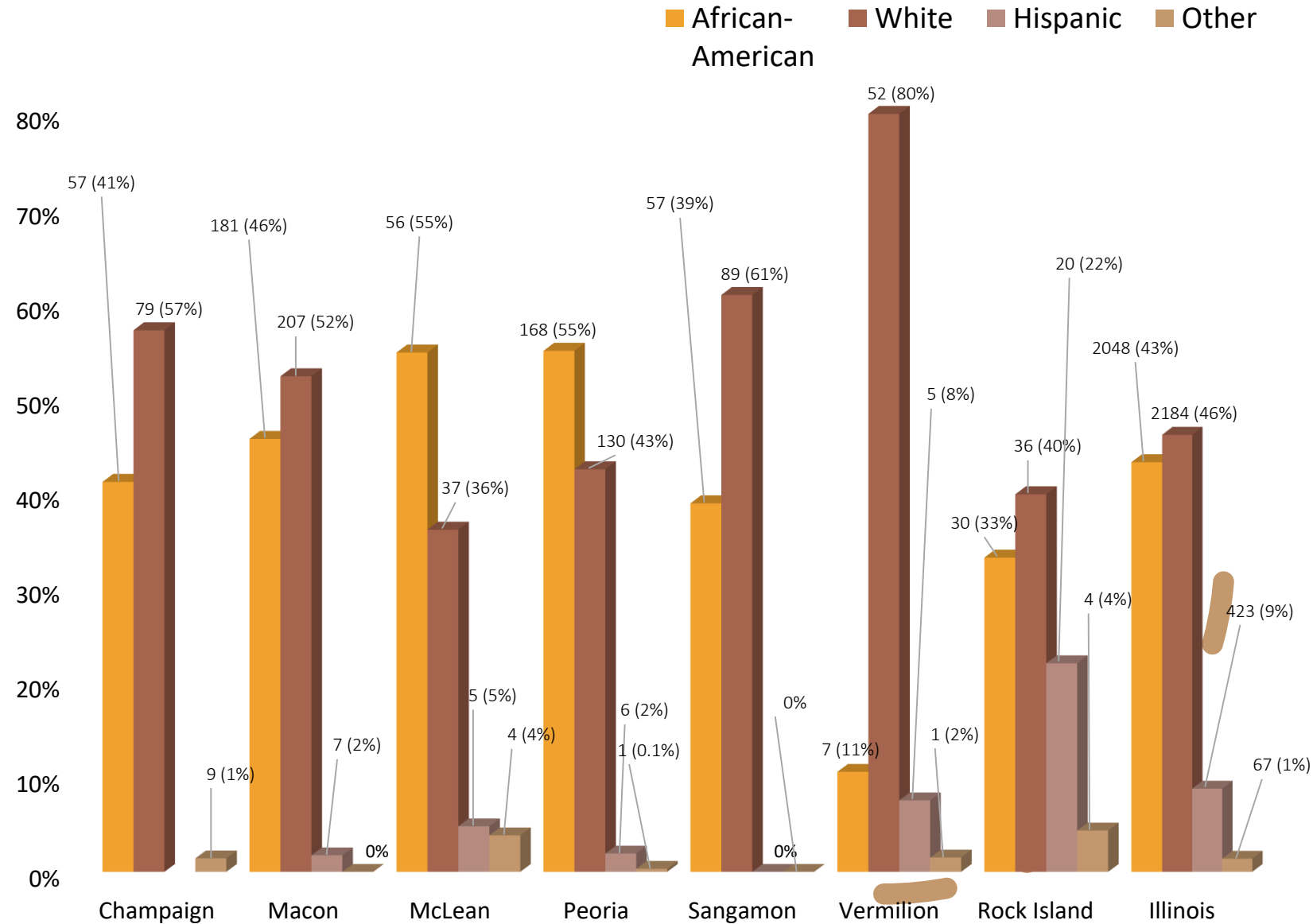


Reunification Permanencies by Race/Ethnicity

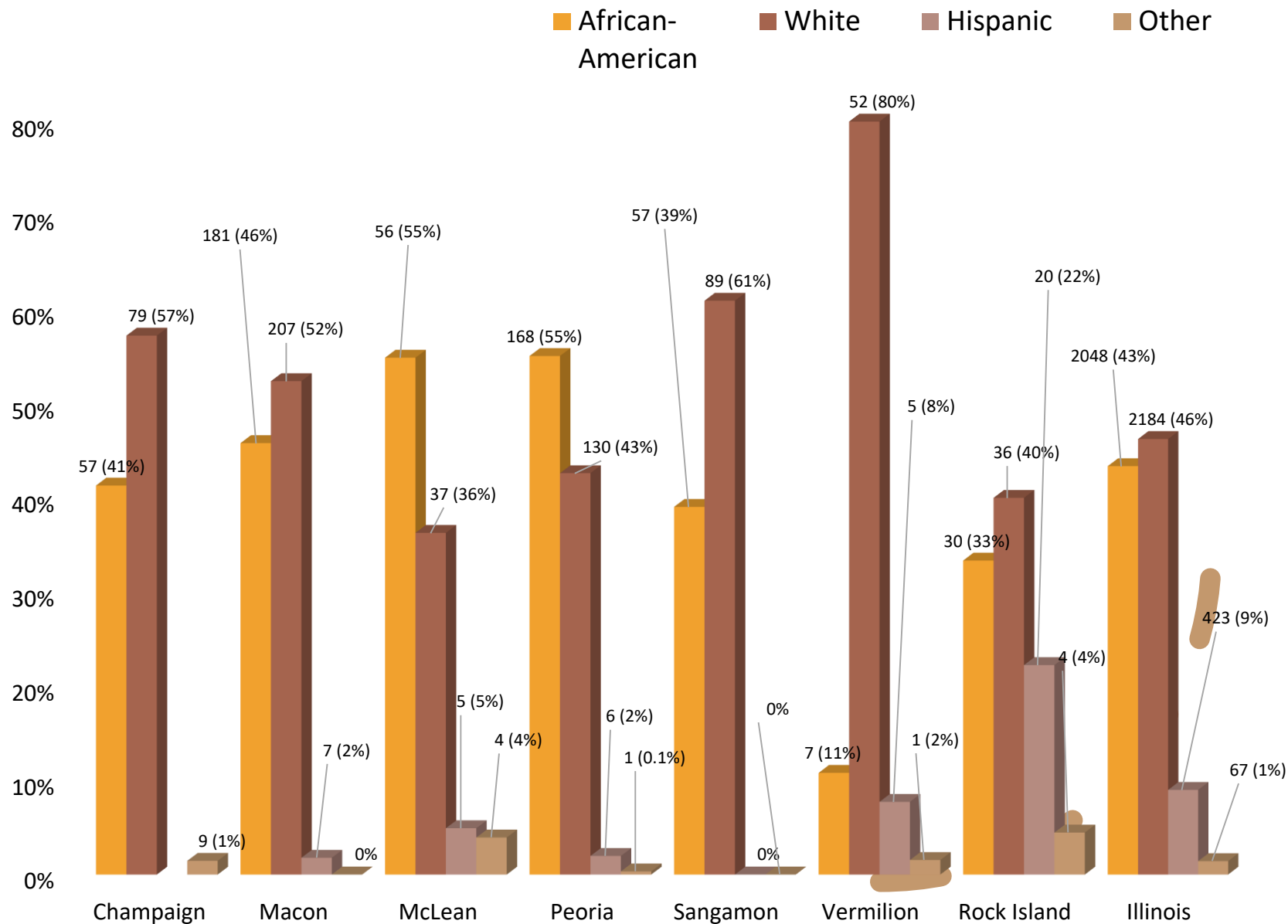


Reunification Permanencies by Race/Ethnicity

Reunification Permanencies by Race/Ethnicity

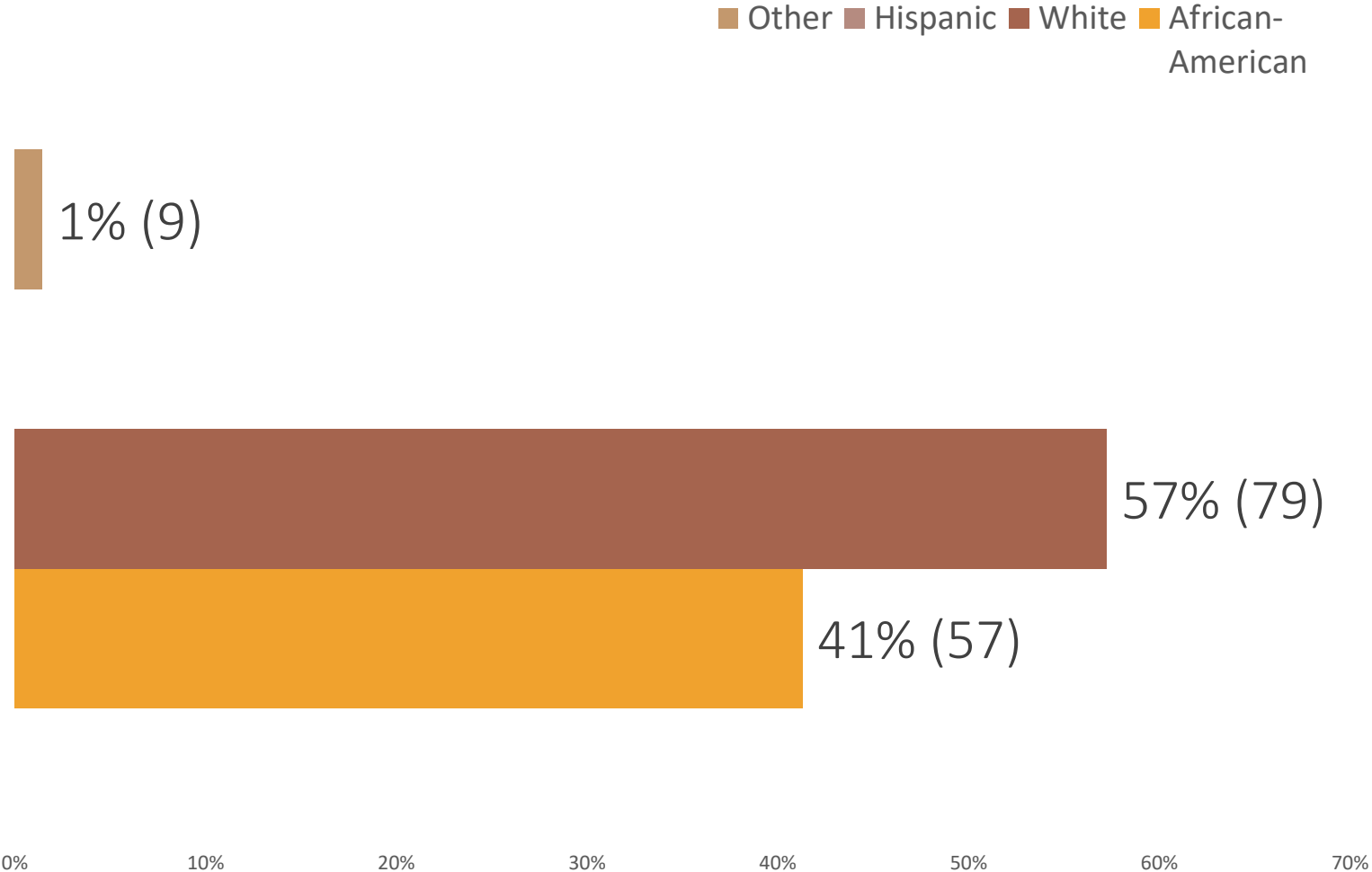


Reunification Permanencies by Race/Ethnicity Champaign County

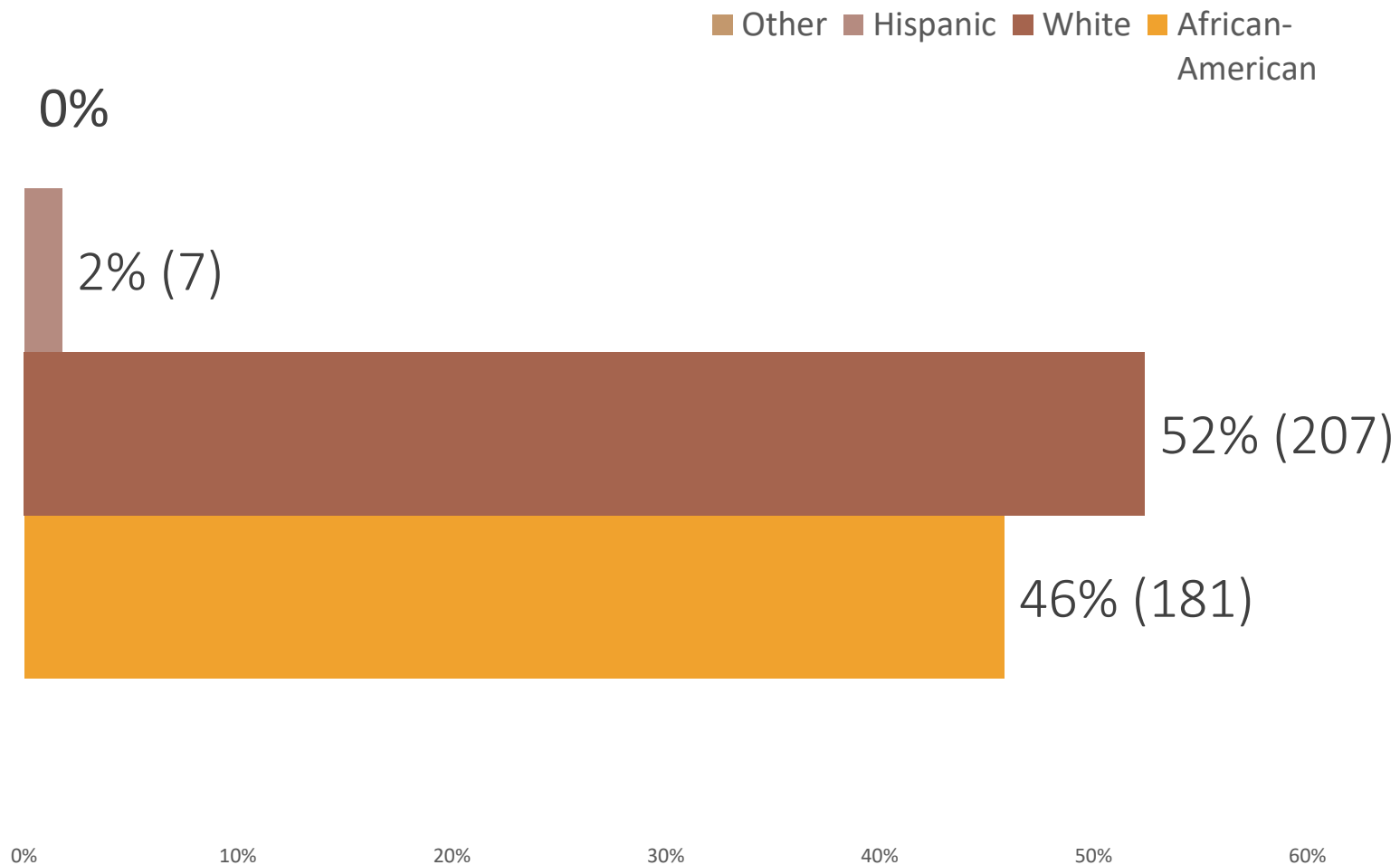


Reunification Permanencies by Race/Ethnicity Macon county

Reunification Permanencies by Race/Ethnicity Macon County

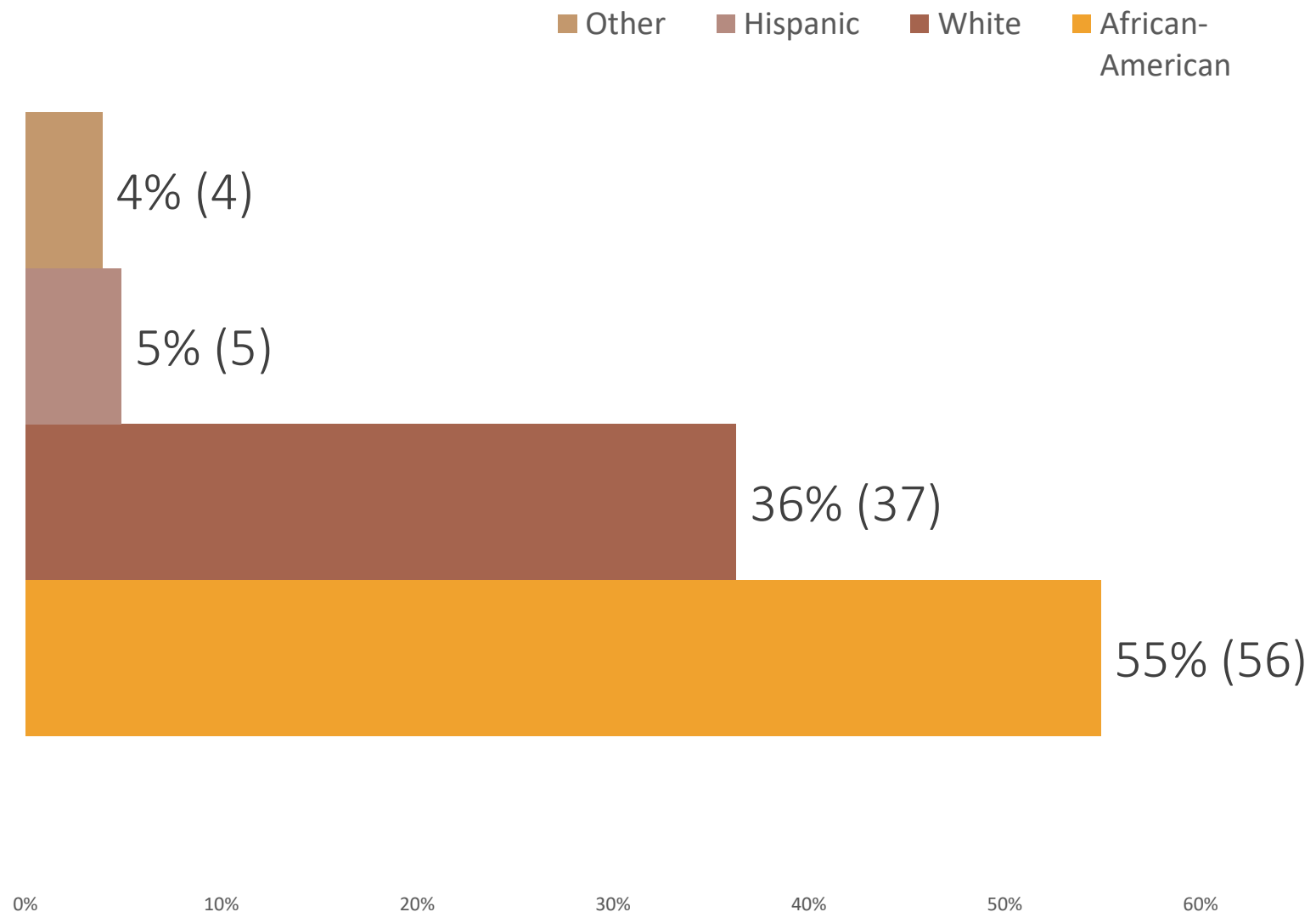


Reunification Permanencies by Race/Ethnicity McLean County

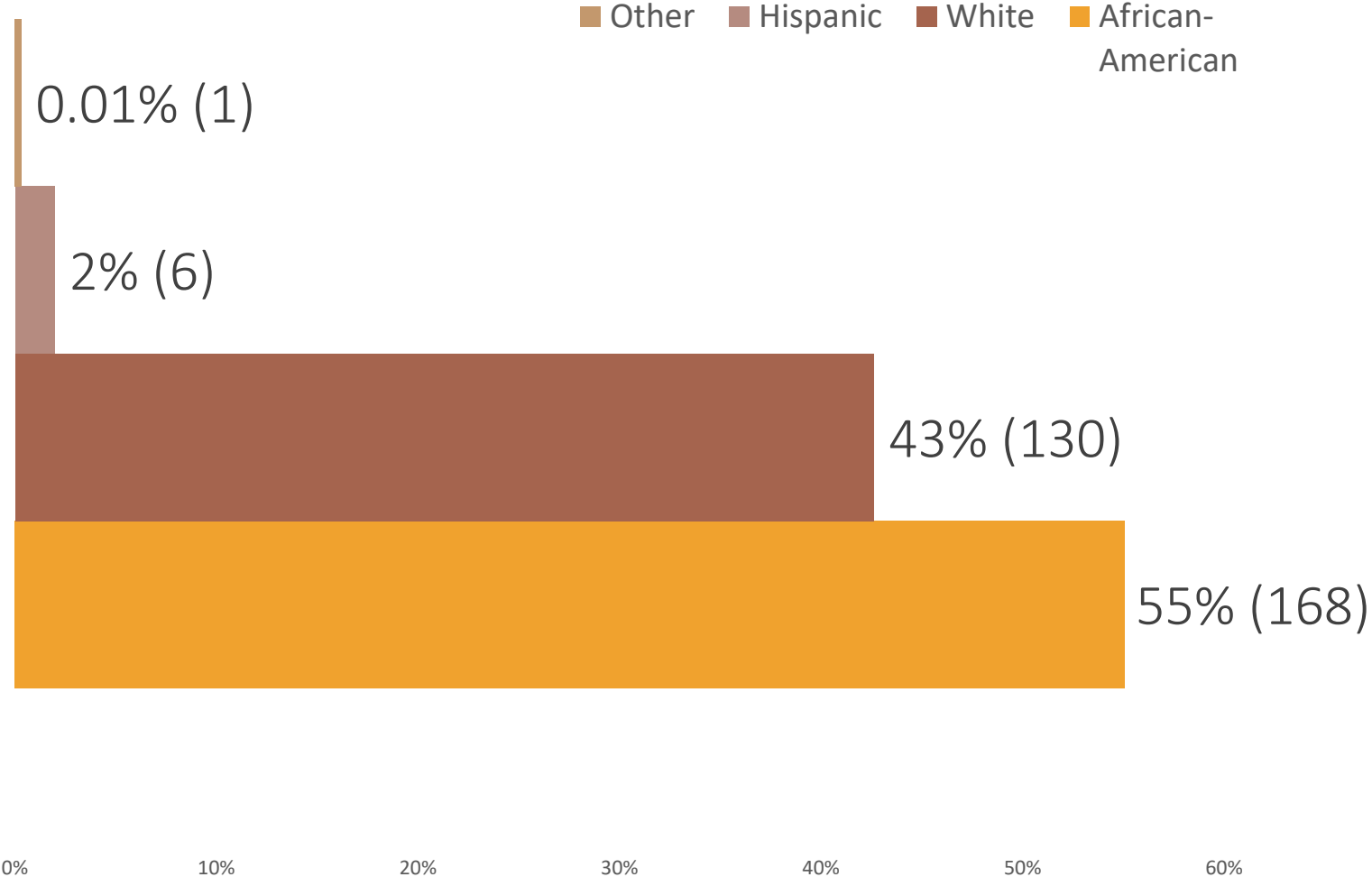


Reunification Permanencies by Race/Ethnicity Peoria county

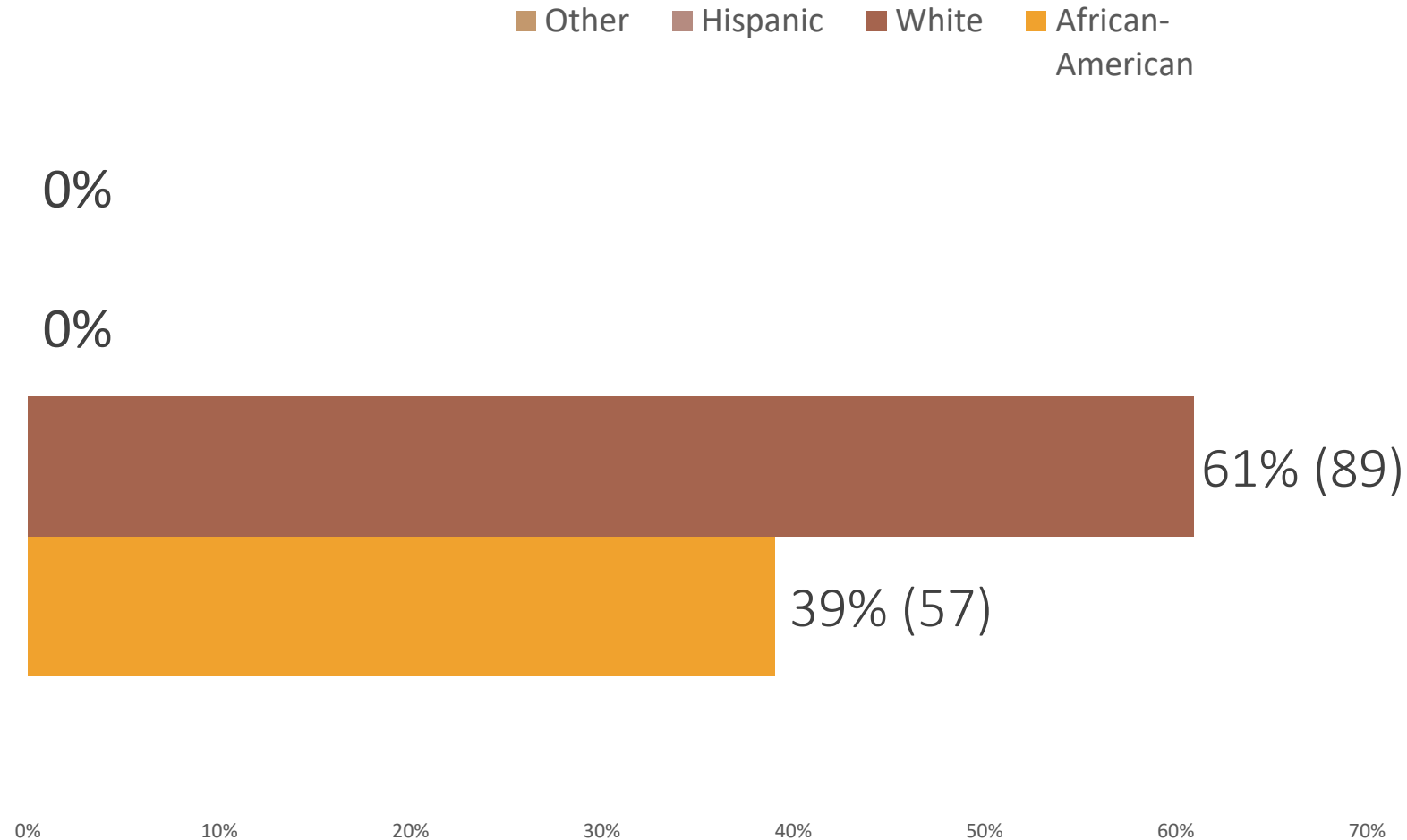


Reunification Permanencies by Race/Ethnicity Sangamon County

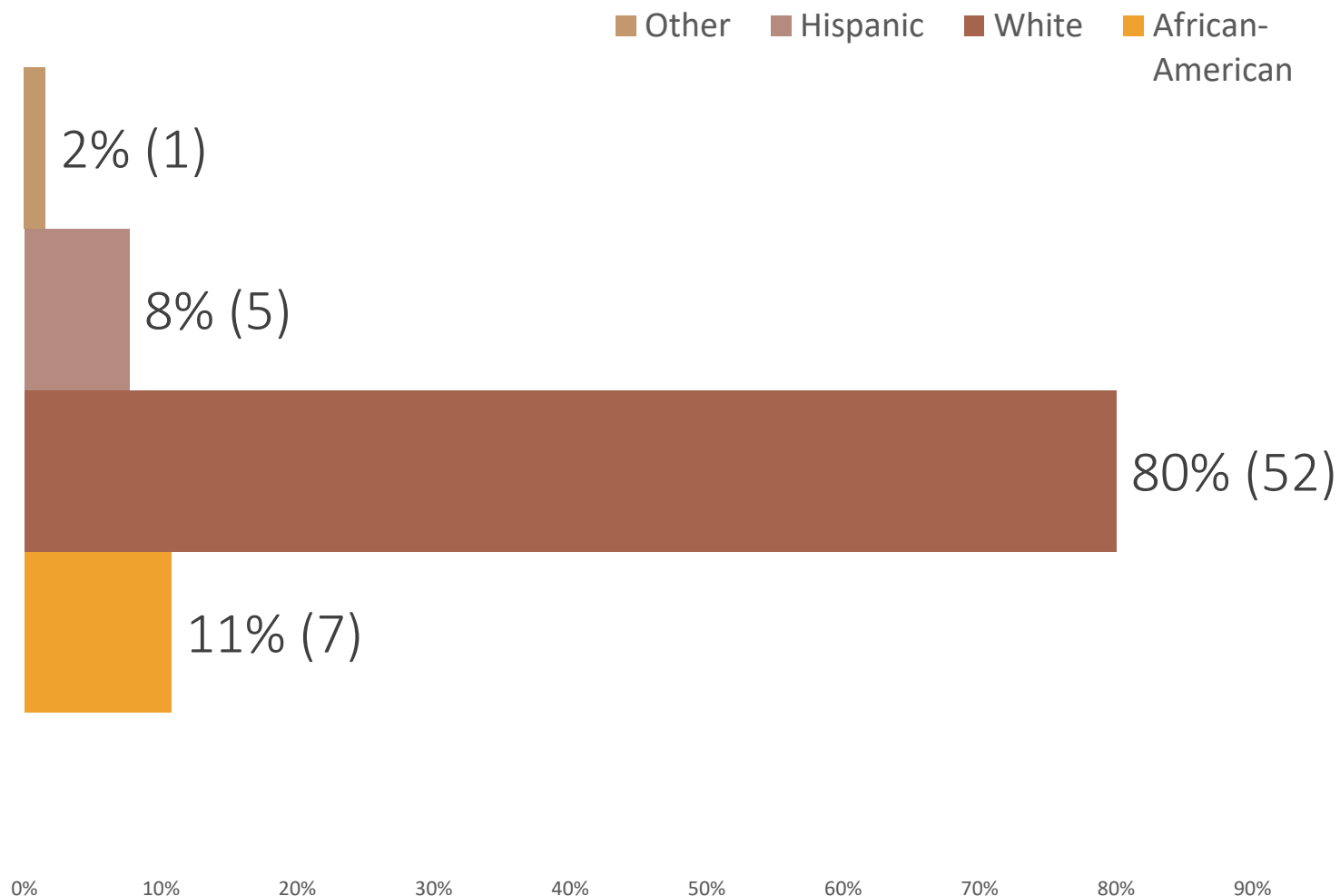


Reunification Permanencies by Race/Ethnicity Vermilion County

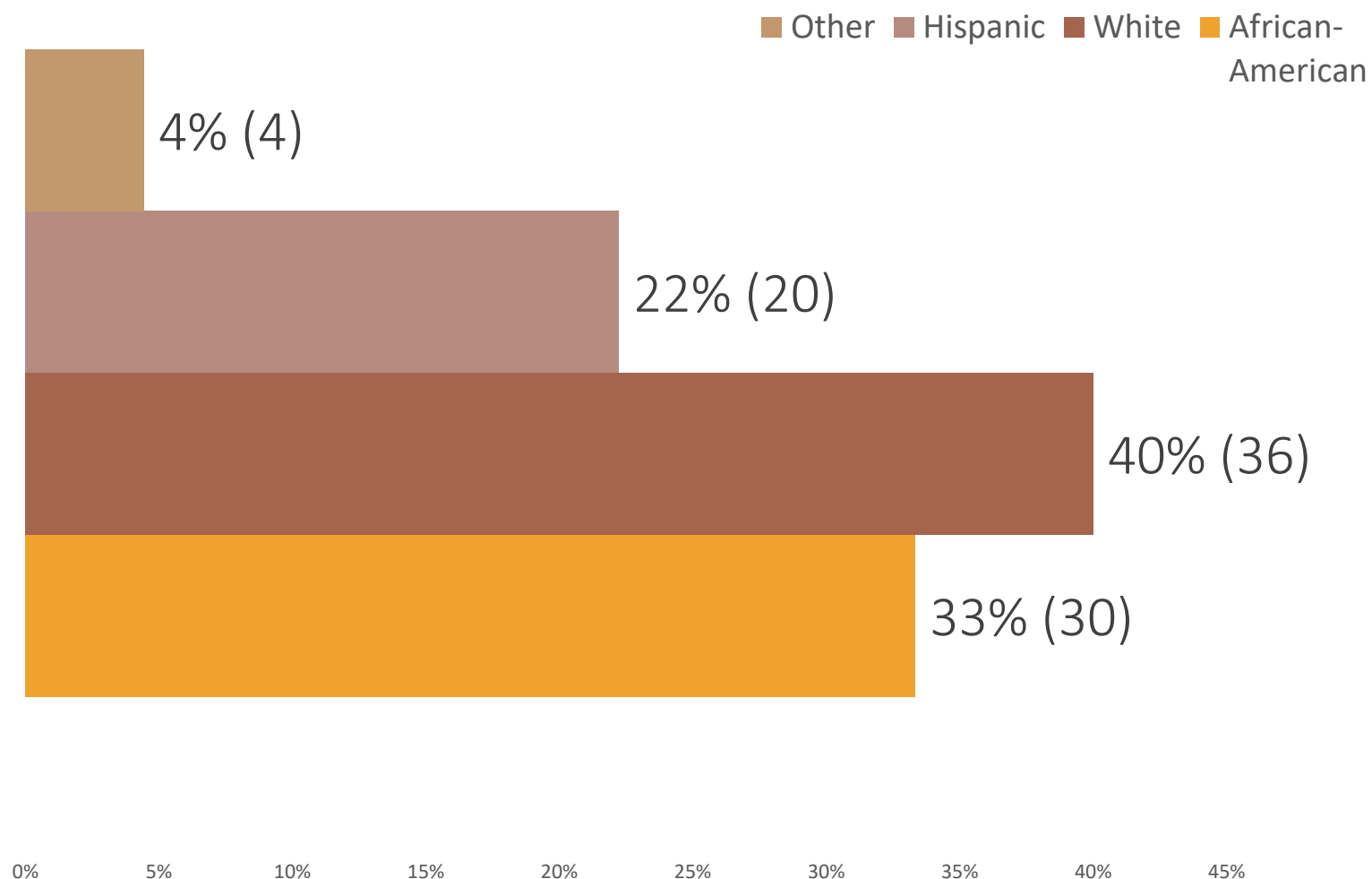


Reunification Permanencies by Race/Ethnicity Rock Island County

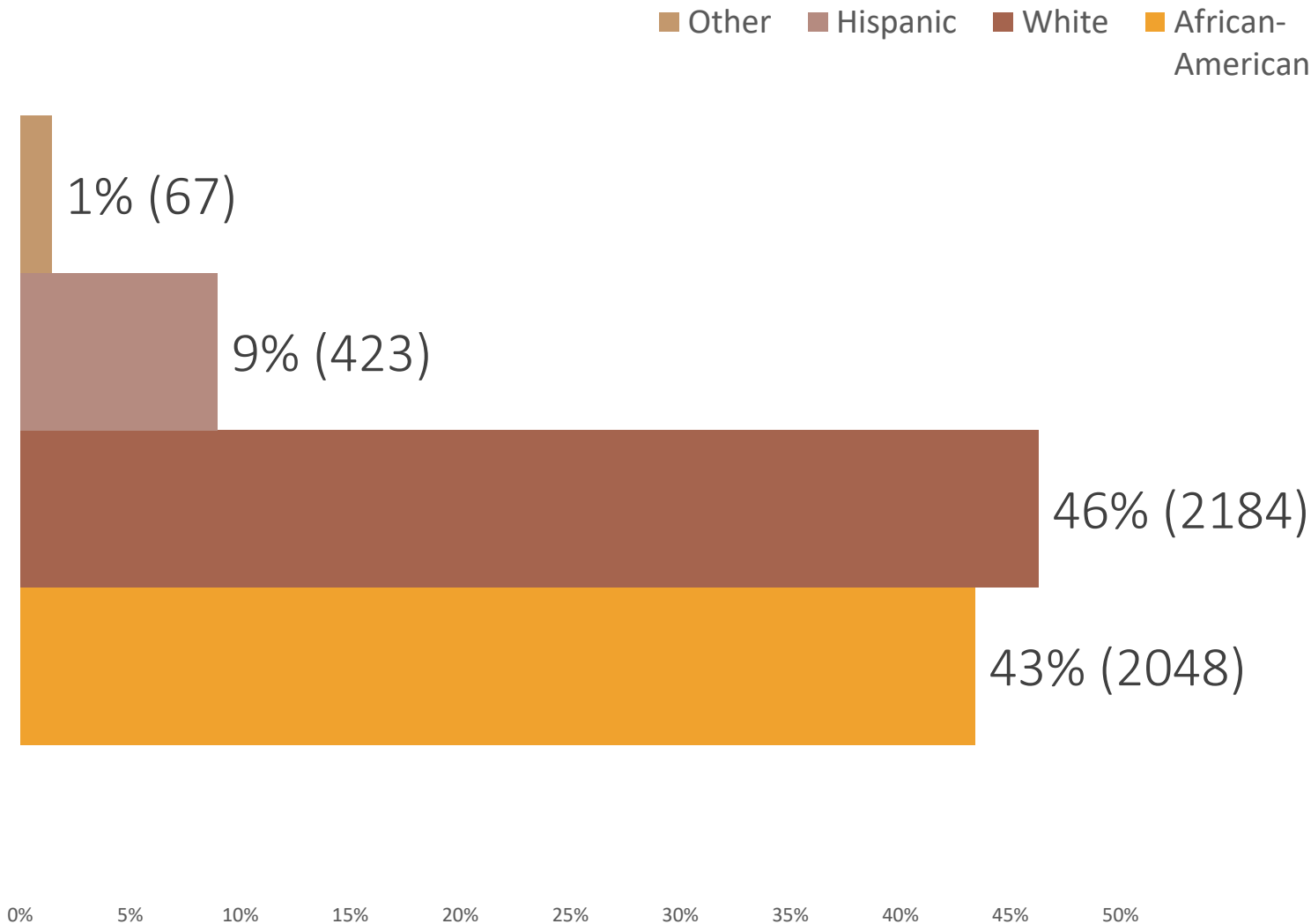


IL Statewide Reunification Permanencies by Race/Ethnicity

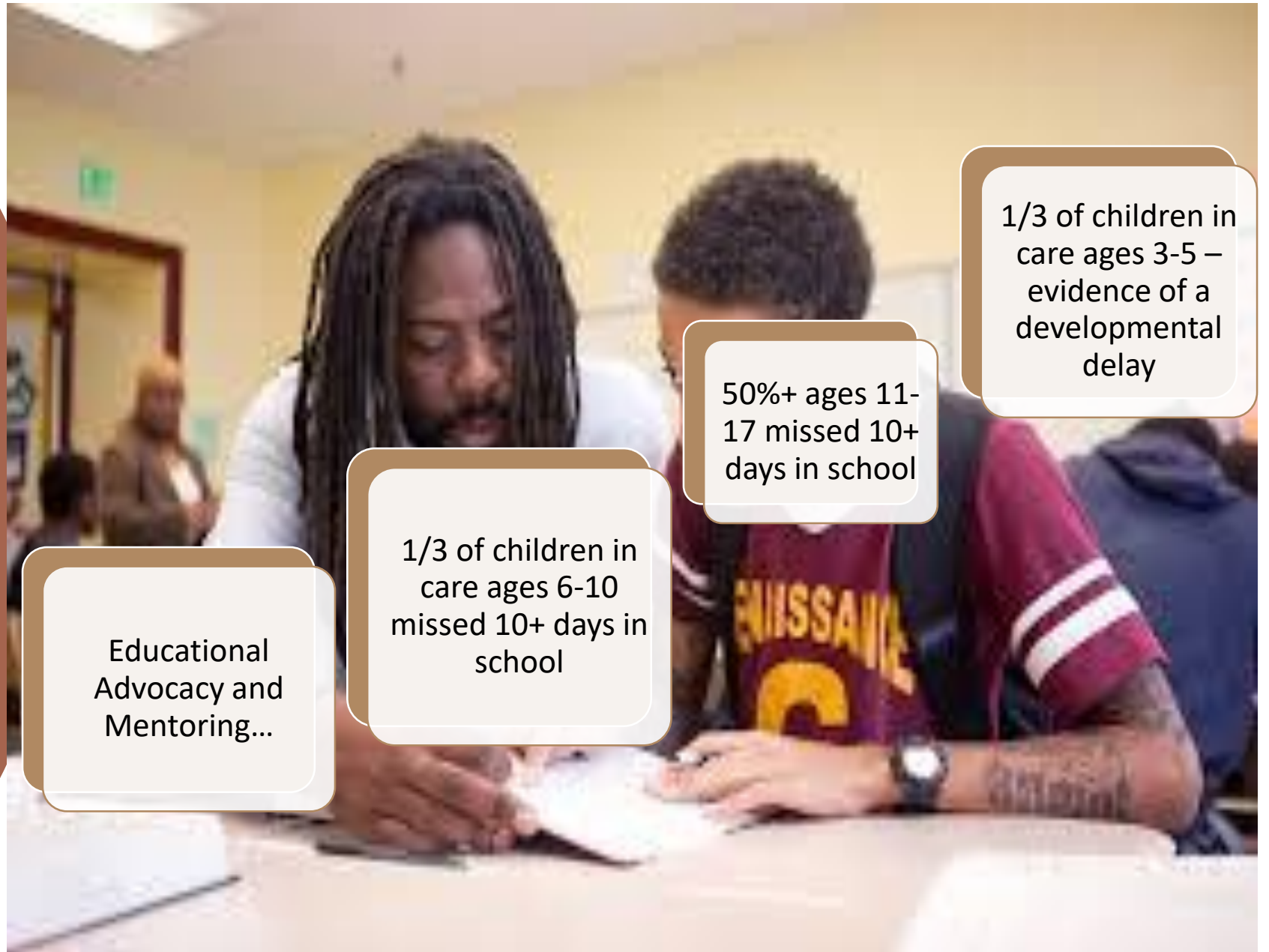
